ASCENSION OF THE LORD: Thursday May 9, Ascension of the Lord commemorates the fortieth day after the Resurrection when Jesus ascended body and soul into Heaven and took His seat at the right hand of His Father. Traditionally, the location of the Ascension is believed to be less than a mile east of the Old City of Jerusalem, and that spot is marked by the Chapel of the Ascension, which is said to contain miraculous imprint of the footprints of Christ before He ascended.

REFLECTION OF SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we see a remarkable event where Peter, a Jew, realizes that God does not favor one group of people over another. As Peter spoke to a gathering that included both Jews and Gentiles, the Holy Spirit came upon everyone present. This was a clear sign that God's Love and salvation were available to all, Not just a select few. The second reading, from the first letter of John, tells us straightforwardly: "God is Love." This profound truth is at the heart of Christian life. It means that loving others is not just a command from God, but a reflection of God Himself. When we love one another, we are participating in God's own life. In the Gospel of John, Jesus explains what it means to remain in His Love: we must keep His commandments, just as He has kept them. Jesus associates love with joy, saying that His desire is for His disciples' joy to be complete by commanding us to love one another. He is inviting us to live a life of true joy.

**FAMILY CONNECTION**

Each time we postpone a task to tend to the needs of another, we show ourselves to be on the path to following the example of love shown to us by Jesus. Sometimes the sacrifices we are called upon to make for others are small. But these small choices to love and to serve others prepare us for the larger choices and sacrifices that we may be called upon to make. If we are people who have practiced showing our love for others with generosity, we will also be people who are willing to lay down our lives for those we love. As you gather as a family, talk about the meaning of the word generosity. Ask each family member to describe an action that shows generosity. Conclude in prayer together by praying Saint Ignatius of Loyola's Prayer for Generosity.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26,34-35,44-48

The gift of the Holy Spirit comes to Cornelius and his household, and they are baptized.

Responsorial Psalm: 98:1,2-3,3-4 A song of praise for God's salvation.

Second Reading: 1 John 4:7-10 God is love.

Gospel Reading: John 15:9-17 Jesus commands his disciples to love one another.

Today's Gospel follows immediately after the Gospel proclaimed last week, in which Jesus taught that he was the vine and that his disciples were the branches, we learned that our union with Jesus will lead to fruitful service. Today's reading extends this teaching to describe the kind of service that Christians are called upon to offer to others. When John wrote this Gospel, his community was influenced by a set of religious beliefs called Gnosticism. It appears that one of John's intentions was to distinguish Christian belief from the beliefs held by the Gnostics. Evidence of this can be found in today's Gospel. One of the tenets of Gnostic teaching was the importance of knowledge, or gnosis, as the determining aspect of faith. In John's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm that he is known by the Father and that his disciples will know the Father by knowing Jesus. In this passage, however, Jesus reminds his disciples that this knowledge is to be expressed in love. Those who knew Jesus well; and Jesus says, that his disciples do know him, will love one another. Knowledge leads to love, which leads to the sign of a true disciple and, thus, a true Christian. A true disciple shows a particular kind of love, sacrificial love. This reading, is part of Jesus' Last Supper discourse. The context of John's Gospel, these words are spoken before Jesus' Crucifixion. We read his instruction to the disciples in light of his death and Resurrection. We know that Jesus himself gives us the greatest example of the Kind of love and service that he teaches to his disciples. He has, in fact, laid down his life for his friends, for his disciples, and for us. Through his death and Resurrection, we have received the grace to love others as Jesus has commanded.

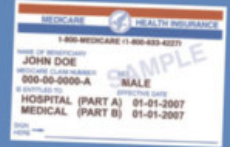

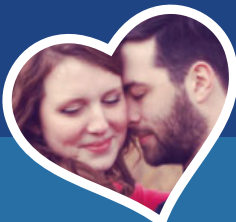
