REFLECTION: SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY

TRINITY The first reading invites us to reflect on the unique ways God has interacted with Israel. Moses speaks to the people, reminding them of the extraordinary acts God has done for them. They saw God speak from the fire and perform miracles to choose them above all other nations. This reading highlights God's unmatched power and His closeness to His people. The second reading tells us about the spirit of adoption we receive from God. Through the Holy Spirit, we are not just followers but children of God. This Spirit leads us and frees us from fear. We can call God "Father" with confidence and love. The Gospel takes us to a mountain in Galilee, where Jesus meets His disciples after His resurrection. Even though some doubted, they all worshiped Him. Here, Jesus gives them a great mission: to make disciples of all nations, baptize them, and teach them to follow His commands. Jesus' command is a foundation for our mission as Christians. We are to share the good news with everyone, no matter where they are from.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40 Moses teaches the people that Yahweh is the only God.

Responsorial Psalm: 33:4-5,6,9,18-19,20,22 A prayer for the Lord's mercy.

Second Reading: Romans 8:14-17 Through the Spirit, we have been adopted as children of God.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 28:16-20 Jesus sends his disciples to make disciples of all nations.

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to the central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the First Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity, one God in three Persons. Many of the most important events happen on a mountaintop, and Matthew used this motif often. Peter, James, and John saw Jesus transfigured on the mountaintop, and Jesus taught the crowds from the mountaintop in the Sermon on the Mount. In today's Gospel, the eleven disciples go to the mountaintop in Galilee, as Jesus has instructed them through Mary Magdalene and the other Mary. They see Jesus, and they worship and doubt at the same time. Jesus approaches them and commissions them to baptize and teach. It is a task for which Jesus had previously prepared his disciples. Yet earlier, the Twelve were sent only to the House of Israel; in this final commission, the eleven are told to go to all nations. The mission of Jesus is now to be taken to all people, and the task is to baptize and to teach. Jesus commissions his disciples to baptize in the name of the Trinity; this is one of the clearest attestations for Baptism in the name of the Holy Trinity found in Scripture. As we read this Gospel on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded that this central mystery of faith is meant to be lived. As baptized Christians, we share in the life of the Blessed Trinity and seek to invite others to share in God's Love. When we make the sign of the Cross, we name ourselves Christians; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
