

REFLECTION: THE TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

TIME The readings for the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time show God's response to human failure and His promise of hope. They highlight themes of disobedience, faith, and the true family of Jesus. Adam and Eve disobey God and face consequences. This reading shows the reality of sin and its impact. God promises victory over sin through the offspring of the woman. This points to Jesus, who will defeat sin. Believers are encouraged to stay strong in their faith despite hardships. They look forward to eternal glory with hope. Jesus teaches that true family is based on doing God's will. Spiritual kinship is more important than blood relations. Jesus faces opposition from His family and religious leaders. He remains focused on His mission and God's will. Jesus emphasizes that those who follow God are His true family. Obedience to God's commands makes one part of Jesus' family. The themes remind us of the reality of sin and hope of redemption. They call us to strong faith, spiritual kinship and obedience to God.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15 Adam and Eve eat the fruit of the forbidden tree.

Responsorial Psalm: 130:1-2,3-4,5-6,7-8 (7bc) Out of the depth I cry to you, O Lord.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1 We believe and so we speak.

Gospel Reading: Mark 3:20-35 Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me.

In the section of the Gospel just before these verses, Jesus calls his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family. A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. The scribes think he is possessed by the devil. Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong man, Beelzebub, and overcomes him. He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this. It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit. Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood. Our family members love and care for us. We feel close to them, and look for ways to care for one another. We might argue sometimes, but we are connected to our family members in a very special way. We are also blessed to have another family, our Church family. As Christians, we are all members of the family of God. In today's Gospel it is important to acknowledge what Jesus says about family. Jesus teaches us that when we believe in him and follow God's law, we are members of his family. God is our Father, and we are brothers and sisters in Christ. Jesus, thank you for our families and our Church family. Help us to be loving and kind to all people.
