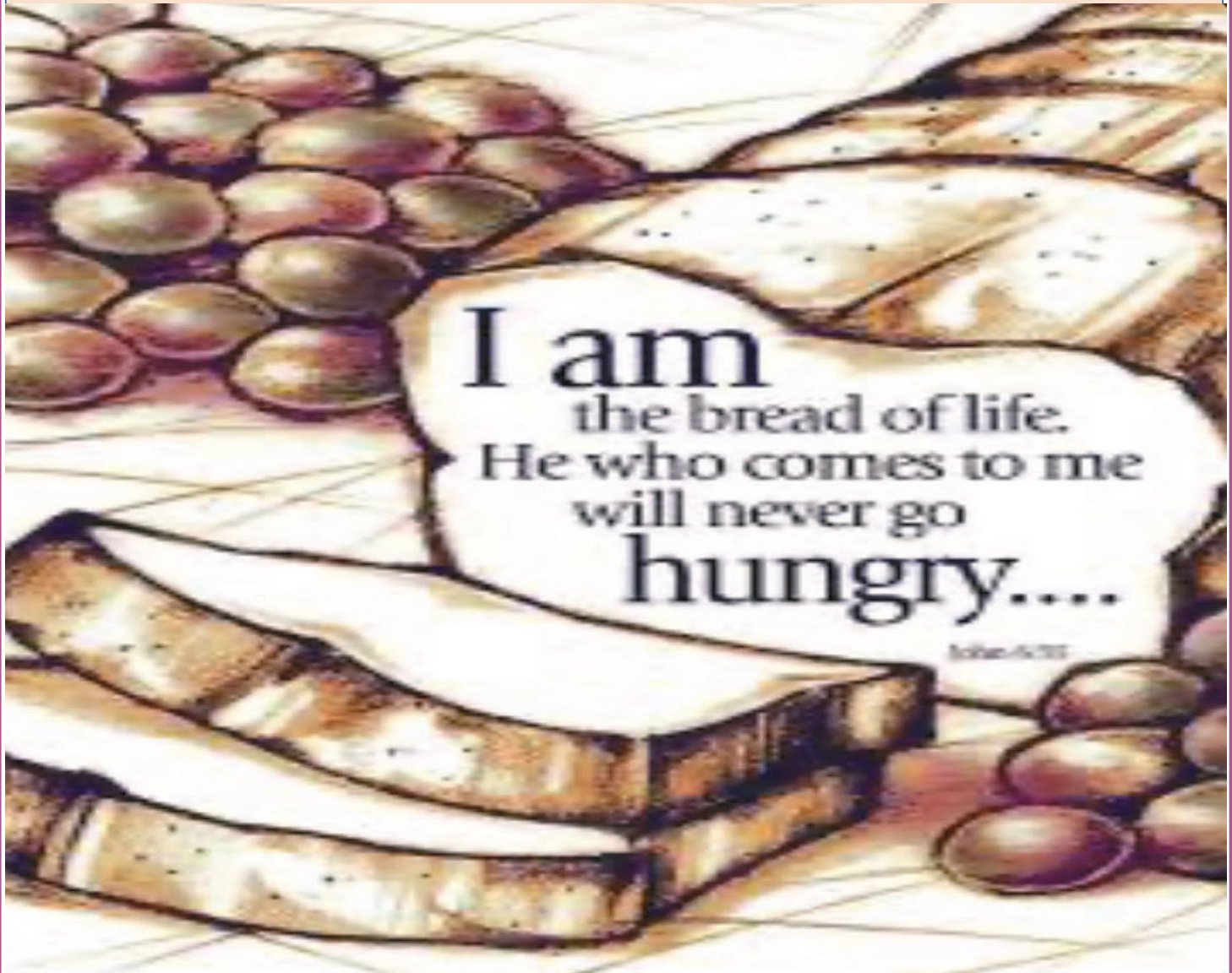

**The Transfiguration of The Lord:

The transfiguration was God’s way of teaching Peter that Jesus is glorified when we deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Him.

REFLECTION: EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

TIME In John’s Gospel, Jesus tells the crowd to seek food that endures to eternal life. He identifies Himself as the bread of life, offering spiritual nourishment that never fades. Those who come to Him will never hunger or thirst. Jesus’ words invite us to seek Him above all else. While physical food sustains our bodies, Jesus provides what our souls truly need. By coming to Jesus and believing in Him, we find true fulfillment and purpose. These reading challenge us to reflect on what we are seeking in life. Are we focused on temporary, earthly things or on the eternal, spiritual nourishment that Jesus offers? By turning to Jesus, we can find lasting peace and satisfaction. Spiritual nourishment sustains our souls and leads to eternal life. It is more important than any temporary, earthly satisfaction. We seek the food that leads to eternal life by following Jesus’ teachings. This means focusing on our spiritual growth and salvation. We renew our minds by focusing on Jesus’s teaching.

In today's Gospel, the crowd asks Jesus for a sign so that they can believe that he has come from God. This is a curious request, because Jesus has just fed more than 5000 people with just five barley loaves and two fish. How quickly they seem to have forgotten the wonderful thing that Jesus has done for them, Or, maybe they never recognized the miracle in the first place. Sometimes we don't recognize the special things that God has done for us. Sometimes, we simply forget and ask for further evidence of his love and care. We pray that God will remove our blindness so that we can receive with thanks and praise all the wonderful things that God accomplishes in our lives. Thank God for all that he has given to us especially the gift of eternal life and the Eucharist.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15 The Lord feeds the Israelites with manna.

Responsorial Psalm: 78:3-4, 23-24, 25, 54 A song of praise to God for his deeds to Israel.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24 Christians become a new creation in Christ.

Gospel Reading: John 6:24-35 Jesus teaches the crowds that he is the "bread of life."

This Sunday we continue to read from the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, but not continuously. Our Lectionary omits John's report of Jesus' walking on water. This event is reported much less dramatically in John's Gospel than in the Synoptic Gospels. After the feeding of the multitudes, the disciples leave in a boat and Jesus follows them. The disciples are said to be terrified by what they see. Jesus reassures them and rejoins them. In today's Gospel, we learn that the crowd has noticed the departure of Jesus and his disciples and so seeks them out in Capernaum. In the dialogue that follows between Jesus and the crowds, Jesus unfolds for us the gift of himself that he gives in the Eucharist. In today's Gospel, there are four exchanges between Jesus and the crowd. In the first, the crowd, having followed Jesus to Capernaum, asks a very matter of fact question: "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus replies by naming their motivation in pursuing him. They have been fed. Jesus acknowledges this, yet challenges them to see beyond the fulfillment of their material needs. The crowds have followed Jesus because they have been fed. They ought to be asking out Jesus because he can give them eternal life. As the second dialogue begins. It seems that the crowd might be on their way to accepting Jesus and his mission. They ask: "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus replies that they must have faith in the one sent from God. But in the third dialogue, the crowd reveals their inability to see Jesus' true identity. The conclusion of the dialogue reveals the crowd's blindness. Jesus answers plainly that he himself is the Bread of Life they seek. He is the one that will satisfy every hunger and thirst.

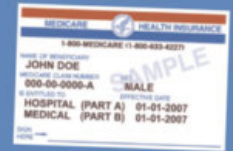
