



REFLECTION: TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN **ORDNARY TIME** This reflection explains Jesus' response to the Pharisees on divorce. Jesus points back to creation, showing that divorce violates God's original plan. He reveals that marriage is a sacrament meant to bring God's blessings and create a fruitful family. The readings light the importance of unity, family, and following God's will. They remind us of the value of marriage, the role in children, and Jesus' teachings on these topics. God creates woman as a partner for man, showing that marriage is meant to be a union of equals. This unity is blessed by God. The readings emphasize the family as the basic unit of society. Jesus' love for children highlights the importance of nurturing and caring for family members. Jesus teaches that marriage is a sacred bond. He reminds us that this bond should not be broken lightly. The themes guide us to appreciate marriage, value family, and follow Jesus' teachings. They remind us to live with unity,

FAMILY CONNECTION

Jesus' teaching about divorce and remarriage can be a challenging one for many people. The Church continues to uphold the strong and positive teaching of Jesus that God intends for a man and women to make a lifelong commitment to one another in the Sacrament of Marriage. Many of us, however, know people whose marriage has not been a lifelong commitment. The example of Jesus teaches us that we are called to act with compassion and love in our relationships with all, and especially when people are hurting because of difficulties in their relationships. Most importantly, we remember that when marriages thrive, it is a sign of God's grace at work. As you gather as a family, talk about what it means to make a promise or commitment to someone.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Genesis 2:18-24 God creates woman from Adam's rib.

Responsorial Psalm: 128:1-2,3,4-5,6 A prayer for God's blessing.

Second Reading: Hebrews 2:9-11 Christ was made perfect through suffering so that we might all be consecrated.

Gospel Reading: Mark 10:2-12 Jesus teaches against divorce.

Gospel Reading: Mark 10:2-12 Jesus teaches against divorce and welcomes the children.

Today we continue to read from the Gospel according to Mark. For the past three Sundays. We have been hearing Mark's reports of conversations between Jesus and his disciples. Recall that in Mark's Gospel, Jesus uses these private moments to teach his disciple in greater detail about the Kingdom of God. Beginning with today's Gospel, Jesus returns to Judea, Jewish territory, and resumes his public ministry. The first verse of chapter 10 of Mark's Gospel tells us that crowds gathered around Jesus, and he taught them, as was his custom. Immediately, the Pharisees approach Jesus to test him. The Pharisees question Jesus about the lawfulness of divorce. Under specific conditions, divorce was an accepted practice among the Jewish people during the time of Jesus. It was regulated by the Law of Moses, as found in Deut. 24:1-5. The law only permits that a husband may divorce his wife if he finds her to be indecent. This is the justification that the Pharisees reference when Jesus inquires about the commandment of Moses. Jesus quotes from the Book of Genesis and counters that God's original intention was that men and women would become one flesh in marriage. Jesus describes the teaching of Moses as a concession made to God's original intention because of human stubbornness. In private, Jesus' disciples question him further about this teaching on divorce. It is to his disciples that Jesus lays out the implications of his teaching by explaining that remarriage after divorce is adultery. Jesus' teaching was more restrictive than the teaching of the Pharisees, which permitted remarriage. Jesus further distinguished his teaching from the cultural norms by applying his words equally to men and women.
