

### **REFLECTION: THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN**

**ORDNARY TIME** These readings invite us to reflect on the end times and the hope we have in Christ. They highlight themes of final judgement, perseverance, and salvation. We are also remined of the importance of faith and hope in the face of trials. They encourage us to stay faithful, knowing that God's promises will be fulfilled in the end. We reflect on the armor of God to help us in spiritual battles. Jesus warns us of coming suffering in Mark 13:24-32. But we are not alone; God gives us the sacraments and angels for protection. Baptism, Reconciliation, and the Eucharist strengthen us. Guardian angels and St. Michael also help us resist evil. God equips us to stand firm against the devil's tactics. These spiritual armors help us to stay strong in our faith. Jesus talks about the end times, warning of false messiahs and persecution. He tells his disciples to stay alert and faithful promising that those who endure will be saved. Earthly things are temporary, stay vigilant and trust in God's ultimate victory.

## SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

**First Reading: Daniel 12:1-3** Daniel prophesies about the judgement of the last days.

**Responsorial Psalm: 16:5,8,9-10,11** God protects us and shows us the path of life.

Second Reading: Hebrews 10:11-14,18 Jesus' offering for sin has made all to be consecrated perfect forever. Gospel Reading: Mark 13:24-32 Jesus teaches about the

signs of the coming of the Son of Man.

This Sunday is the second to last Sunday of our liturgical year. As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. In the context of Mark's Gospel, Jesus' word about this are spoken to his disciples as he prepares them for his passion and death. Before we consider Jesus' words, it is important to note the political backdrop against which many think Mark's Gospel was written. Most scholars concur that Mark wrote his Gospel for Christians living in or near Rome about 30 to 40 years after the death of Jesus. This was a time of political turmoil in Rome. Some Christians experienced persecution by the Romans during the reign of the emperor Nero (about 64 A.D.). Jewish revolutionaries rebelled against the Romans, which led the Romans to destroy the Temple in Jerusalem in 70 A.D. In this time of political turmoil and persecution, many in Mark's community might have wondered if the end times predicted by Jesus were in fact quite near. Last Sunday we heard Jesus' observation about the contributions being made to the temple treasury and the example of sacrificial giving that he saw in the poor widow's offering. If we had been reading Mark's Gospel continuously, we would have heard Jesus predict the destruction of the Temple, his teaching about the costs of discipleship, and the woes that will accompany the end times. Finally, we would have heard Jesus instruct his disciples about the need for watchfulness so they will not be caught unprepared for this final day of judgment. In today's Gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near.
