

Saint Raymond of Penafort, Priest: Feast Day Tuesday January 7th, Saint Raymond of Penafort, was a Dominican priest who worked to aid Christian captives during the era of the Crusades and also helped organize the Church's legal code. He is known as the Father of Cannon Law. He is honored as a saint in the Catholic Church and is the patron saint of lawyers, especially cannon lawyers. He used his talents to both compile legislation for easy access and to write legal treatises on penance.

REFLECTION: SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD The word "Epiphany" means "manifestation."

Therefore, as we honor this moment in time when the Christ Child was made manifest to the world, we need to look into our own hearts. There, we discover Christ's ongoing manifestation to us so that we can worship Him Who has also chosen to be born within our hearts. We must diligently seek out that manifestation of God within us and respond to it in the same ways that the Magi responded. First of all; the Magi were determined. When they saw a sign from the heavens that pointed to a new King, they stopped everything and departed in haste to find Him. When God speaks to you and manifests Himself to you in some way, nothing could be more important than to be attentive to His voice and follow His manifestation with haste. The Magi brought the Christ Child gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. God was honored and glorifies through His creation by the giving of these gifts. Offer Jesus your spiritual gifts of gold, frankingense and myrrh.

FAMILY CONNECTION

The tradition of giving gifts at Christmas is thought by some to be rooted in the gift giving of the Magi. In many cultures, gifts are not exchanged at Christmas, but rather on the feast of the Epiphany. Whenever you exchange your Christmas gifts, take some time to reflect on this tradition of gift giving at Christmas. Think of the best gift you have received. What was it? What made it special? Was it the gift itself, the thought that went into it, or the person who gave it to you? In today's Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12, the gifts of the Magi; gold, frankincense, and myrrh, have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. They are special because in giving them, the Magi acknowledge who Jesus was to be: our Savior. We pray that we will acknowledge Jesus as Savior in all that we do and say.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6 Jerusalem shall be a light to all nations.

Responsorial Psalm: 72:1-2,7-8,10-11,12-13 Every nation on earth shall worship the Lord.

Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6 Gentiles are coheirs in the promise of Christ.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 2:1-12 The Magi seek out Jesus and do him homage.

The visit of the Magi occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt. Matthew's Gospel tells a version of Jesus' birth that is different than the one in Luke. Of the actual birth of Jesus, Matthew tells us little more than, "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod." The story of the census is found only in Luke's Gospel, but we hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew's Gospel. We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel does not say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. In Matthew's Gospel, they represent the Gentiles' search for a savior. The Magi represents the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus. We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. The meaning represents Jesus' kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple. Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death. The word Epiphany means manifestation or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana. On the feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the fact that Jesus is revealed not just to the Jewish people, but to the world. Like the Magi, we search for Jesus. When he is revealed to us, we respond by offering gifts that which is most valuable to us and to Jesus.
