REFLECTION: THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: The First Scrutiny on the Third Sunday of Lent is a time of reflection on the journey to Easter and the beginning of commitments to the Sacraments. The primary symbol of this day is water, which represents life and baptism. Water as a symbol of life, and the story of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well shows that God wished to give us life. The encounter with Jesus at the well is a reminder that Jesus accepts people for who they are and offers them healing, forgiveness and new life. The Third Sunday of Lent marks a midpoint in the Lenten season and a reminder that the journey to Easter is one of hope and joy. The first Scrutiny marks the beginning of the commitments a person makes as they look forward to the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. As we continue to accompany and pray for our elect, we approach and embrace the Scrutinies. The Scrutinies are rites for self searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The three R's for lent are reflection, repentance and reconciliation.

Jesus knows the woman's sin and forgives her. The woman comes to know Jesus as the Messiah. The woman invites others to meet Jesus. Pray a prayer of blessing for each member of your family that God will help each one live the promises of his or her Baptism.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7 God tells Moses to bring forth water from the rock.

Responsorial Psalm: 95:1-2,6-9 Sing joyfully in the presence of the Lord.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-2,5-8 Christ died for us while we were still sinners.

Gospel Reading: John 4:5-42 Jesus reveals himself to the Samaritan woman at the well.

On this Sunday and the next two Sundays, we break from reading the Gospel of Matthew to read from John's Gospel. The Gospel of John is the only Gospel not assigned to a particular liturgical year. Instead, readings from John's Gospel are interspersed throughout our three year liturgical cycle. In today's Gospel, the dialogue between Jesus and a woman from Samaria is among the most lengthy and most theological found in Scripture. The most startling aspect of the conversation is that it happens at all. Jesus, an observant Jew of that time, was expected to avoid conversation with women in public. The animosity between the Jews and the Samaritans should have prevented the conversation as well. The woman herself alludes to the break from tradition: "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" Yet, Jesus not only converses with the woman, he also asks to share her drinking vessel, an action that makes him unclean according to Jewish law. The initial conversation between Jesus and the woman is better understood if we consider the importance of water, especially in the climate of Israel. At first, the woman understands Jesus' promise of "living water" in a literal sense: "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water." With no running water, the daily trip to the well by the woman of the community was a paramount importance. The woman of the town would have traveled to the well in the early morning, but this woman came to the well at noon, the hottest time of the day. The timing of her visit is a clear sign that she is an out cast within the Samaritan community. We learn in her conversation with Jesus that she is an outcast because of her "many husbands."
