



**REFLECTION: THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER:** The 3rd Sunday of Easter reminds us of the joy and responsibility that come with following Jesus. These themes help us reflect on the call to live out our faith with love and dedication. The apostles insisted on obeying God rather than men, even when faced with persecution. This teaches us the importance of putting God's will first in our lives. The apostles rejoiced in their suffering for Jesus. This shows us that suffering for our faith is a reason for joy and not despair. Jesus guided the disciples to a miraculous catch of fish. This illustrates that following Jesus' guidance leads to abundance and success in our spiritually journey. These themes help us grow in our faith more deeply. They encourage us to live with joy, love, and dedication to Jesus. The Gospel shows Jesus serving breakfast to His disciples and calling Peter to "Feed My Sheep." This helps us understand our call to care for one another. Christian service involves sacrifice, but Jesus strengthens us. He is the Good Shepherd that we follow by His example.

#### FAMILY CONNECTION

Today's Gospel describes what we can easily imagine as a picnic on the beach. Just as Jesus' miracle at the wedding feast at Cana blesses the love between man and woman celebrated in the sacrament of marriage, Jesus' attentiveness to food and mealtimes raises the possibility that our meal gatherings can be sacred times. In families, the domestic church, our meals together are everyday opportunities to gather and recall Jesus' presence with us. In the Eucharist, we bring the gifts that God has given us, which have been prepared especially for our Mass, and at our family meals we share gifts that God has given to us and that we have worked together to prepare. This includes the food on the table and also the people who gather around the table. We ask God to bless these gifts and to be present in all of our interactions.

## SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

**First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32, 40b-41** The apostles are brought before the Sanhedrin and ordered to stop speaking in Jesus' name.

**Responsorial Psalm: 30:2,4,5-6,11-12,13** A song of praise to God who rescues us.

**Second Reading: Revelation 5:11-14** John describes his vision of the praises that will be sung to the Lamb by every creature on heaven and earth.

**Gospel Reading: John 21:1-19** Jesus appears to the disciples for a third time after his Resurrection and shares a meal with them.

Most scholars believe today's Gospel passage to have been an addition to John's original text. Because their are significant differences between this report and the other appearances described in John's Gospel, it is quite likely that this story is from a different source. There are details in the story that recall Jesus' call to Simon Peter and the other fishermen as well as the miraculous catch of fish. The reading is a rich and textured story that speaks of Jesus' presence in the Eucharist and our commission to serve others as Jesus did. Simon Peter is still presented in the role of leader, when he announces that he is going fishing, the other disciples follow. They spend the night fishing but are unsuccessful. Jesus calls to them from the shore, but just as when Jesus first appeared to Mary of Magdala, the disciples do not recognize him immediately. Still, they follow the stranger's instructions and bring in a large haul of fish. It is at this point that one of the disciples realizes that Jesus is appearing to them. Upon hearing this news, Simon Peter leads the way again, jumping from the boat and swimming to shore. The other disciples follow in the boat, dragging the fish. The disciples have brought to shore a tremendous catch of fish that Jeus had directed them to find. But once on the shore, they see that Jesus has already prepared fish and bread on a charcoal fire. Jesus directs the disciples to bring their catch of fish as well. Jesus is host at the meal that follows, feeding the disciples the bread and fish. In the Eucharist, we too are fed by Jesus in the bread and wine.
