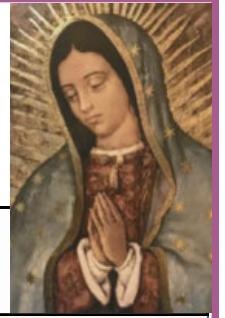

The Blessed Virgin , Mother of the Church: Feast Day Monday June 9th,
The Blessed Virgin Mary is recognized as the “Mother of the Church” in the Catholic Church. This title reflects her unique role in God’s plan of salvation, particularly in the birth and growth of the Church. The Church celebrates this role with a Memorial on the Monday after Pentecost. Pope Paul VI officially declared Mary “Mother of the Church” in 1964. Her title signifies that Mary is the mother of all believers.

REFLECTION: SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

SUNDAY: The Solemnity of Pentecost, the fiftieth day after Easter, celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other disciples, marking the birth of the Church. It’s a time to reflect on the Holy Spirit’s empowering presence in our lives, the gifts received through Baptism and Confirmation, and the call to be active members of the Church, living out the love and mission of Jesus. The Holy Spirit empowers us to carry out the mission entrusted to us by Jesus, just as he was sent by the Father. Pentecost reminds us that the Church is meant for all peoples, uniting them in faith despite language and cultural differences. The Holy Spirit is the source of courage, strength, and the ability to proclaim the Gospel, even in the face of fear. We are called to live lives that reflect the love and holiness of God. Pentecost marks the birth of the Church, a community united by the Holy Spirit and called to spread the Gospel. We are members of this body with unique gifts and talents, working to fulfill Jesus’ mission.

Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic Church, we learn how to forgive and we learn to accept forgiveness. It is the gift of the Holy Spirit that enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation. As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting all to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting upon the concern and how your family might address it. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11 The Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles gathered in Jerusalem.

Responsorial Psalm: 104:1,24,29-31,34 God's Spirit renews the earth.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13 We are all one in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Reading: John 20:19-23 Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The Gospel, recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts to each other. It is enough to know that, after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, and advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world. On the second Sunday of Easter we heard the passage that follows, which describes Jesus' appearance to Thomas. In that context, we are led to reflect on belief and unbelief. In the context of the feast of Pentecost, this reading reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." As he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus sends his disciples to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins. The Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. This reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are washed clean from sin and become a new creation of Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God in forgiving sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people.

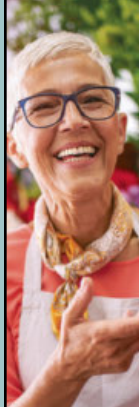
