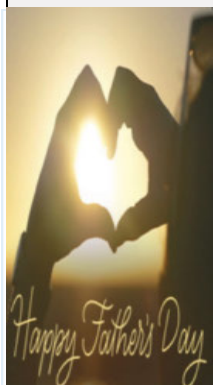

REFLECTION: THE MOST HOLY TRINITY: The Holy Trinity is a central Christian doctrine stating that God exists as one being in three distinct persons: the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit. These three are considered co-equal, co-eternal, and share the same divine nature. One God, Three Persons: The Trinity is not a belief in three separate gods, but rather a concept that God, through one being, exists in three distinct and co-equal persons. The Father: Represents God the creator, the eternal source of all things. The Son (Jesus Christ): Is God the incarnate, who lived among humans as Jesus Christ, died for the salvation of humanity, and is now the resurrected savior, according to Christian belief. The Holy Spirit: Is the divine power and presence of God, often depicted as a dove, who inspires, guides, and empowers believers. The Trinity is a key aspect of Christian theology, helping to understand the nature of God and how humans should relate to Him. It also emphasizes God's love, relationship, and communion with humanity.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31 Wisdom was born before the earth was made.

Responsorial Psalm: 8:4-9 O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5 We boast of our afflictions.

Gospel Reading: John 16:12-15 Whatever the Father has is mine. The Spirit of truth will guide us.

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday of Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity; one God is three persons. The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future. Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all. In Christian theology, the belief in the Holy Trinity assures believers that they are spared from the eternal punishment for their sins and that they may enjoy the rewards of everlasting life. The doctrine of the Trinity teaches us that God is a relationship of perfect love between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity welcomes us as sons and daughters into this family communion of love.

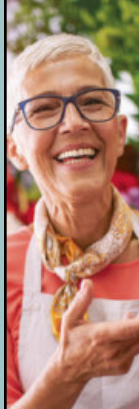
