

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin: Feast Day Monday July 14th, Saint Kateri informally known as Lily of the Mohawks. The Roman Catholic Church has honored her for her devotion to Christ and her commitment to charity and chasity. She is the first Native American Catholic Saint. She was born in 1656, and at four years old she contracted smallpox, which left her face severely scarred. She teaches us about personal holiness and how we may also strive to be Saints.


#### REFLECTION: FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN

**ORDINARY TIME:** These reading focus on living out God's Word in everyday life. The readings encourage faith in action, love for others, and seeing Christ as the center of all creation. God's commandments are clear and close to us. The first reading reminds us that following God's will is not beyond our reach. The second reading highlights Jesus as the foundation of creation and our faith. Everything exists through Him and is united in Him. The Gospel calls us to love others, especially those in need. The story of the Good Samaritan challenges us to show kindness and mercy. Faith is not just about knowing God's Word. The readings show that faith comes alive when we live it through our actions and what compassion looks like. True love for God means caring for people, even strangers or those we find hard to love. The first reading teaches that God's Word is already in our hearts. We are reminded to live our faith through love and action. God's Word is near to us, and Jesus calls us to serve others.

#### **FAMILY CONNECTION**

Families rely on selfless love. Parents show love for their children not just when it's convenient, but whenever their children's needs must be met. Imagine if the members of a family were concerned only with their own needs. How quickly things would fall apart! In the story of the Good Samaritan, we learn about someone who went out of his way to care for the needs of another. He recognized the victim as his brother and accepted responsibility for him. As a family, talk about the responsibilities of each member of the family. Share how you, as parents, care for the needs of everyone in the family even when it's inconvenient. Make a commitment as a family to follow the example of the Good Samaritan. Ask your children to share times when they helped the family.

#### SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14 Moses reminds the people that God's commandments are not remote but are already in their hearts.

**Responsorial Psalm: 69:14,17,30-31,36-37** Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.

**Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20** Jesus is the head of the body, the Church.

**Gospel Reading: Luke 10:25-37** The parable of the Good Samaritan.

As Jesus continues his journey to Jerusalem, he is confronted by a scholar who wants to test him. Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment. Here, in Luke's Gospel, the lawyer asks what we must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus answers the question by quoting on loving God with all your heart, and on loving your neighbor. This verse is one of the most important prayers in Judaism. Love of God and love of neighbor are what is required for eternal life. Jesus' response is simple, "Do this and you will live." Having been shown up by Jesus, the lawyer tries another question: Who is my neighbor whom I must love like myself? In the society of Jesus' time, with its distinctions between Jews and Gentiles, men and women, clean and unclean, this was a trick question. Jesus responds with one of the most beautiful of all the parables, the Good Samaritan. The road from Jerusalem to Jericho is narrow and rocky. It is an easy place for bandits to wait for travelers. The traveler in this parable is identified only as "a certain man." After the attack, the man is left for dead, naked and bleeding on the side of the road. A priest comes along, but rather than helping, he crosses to the other side of the road. Another religious person comes along, and his reaction is the same as the priest's. Both of them choose to not even find out if the man is alive. A third person, a Samaritan, comes along and not only goes over to the injured man but cleans his wounds, puts him on his own animal, takes him to an Inn to recover, and promises to pay all his expenses. The hated enemy; the Samaritan, is the compassionate neighbor in this parable. A neighbor is a person who treats everyone with compassion.
