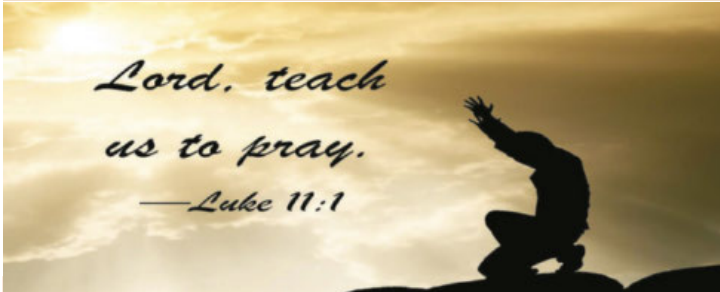

REFLECTION: SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN

ORDINARY TIME: The 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time
focuses on prayer, trust, and God's care for us. The readings,
show how people turn to God with faith and hope, asking for
help and guidance. The Lord's Prayer also challenges us to
align our values with God's Kingdom and to forgive others as
we are forgiven. We should pray the Lord's Prayer slowly,
meditating on its meaning and letting it guide us into a closer
relationship with God. Jesus calls us to address God as Father,
a close and loving term. We acknowledge God's holiness and
ask for his will to be done. Jesus reminds us that we can bring
our needs to God, asking for our daily bread, mercy, and
strength in hard times. This prayer shows us that God cares
about every part of our lives. It encourages us to trust that we
can speak openly to God, just as we would to a parent or close
friend. Through prayer, we learn to depend on God and to stay
close to him in every situation. These readings show us that
prayer builds our trust in God and strengthens our faith.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32 Abraham pleads with God to save the innocent people of Sodom and Gomorrah.

Responsorial Psalm: 138:1-3,6-8 Lord, on the day I cried for help, you answered me.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14 You were buried with Christ in Baptism and also raised with him.

Gospel Reading: Luke 11:1-13 Jesus teaches the disciples about prayer.

Luke gives more attention to Jesus' teachings on prayer than any other Gospel writer. He also mentions Jesus at prayer more than the others. In today's reading, Luke presents the core of Jesus' teaching on prayer. It consists of Jesus teaching a prayer to his disciples, a parable on the persistent neighbor, and assurances that God hears our prayers. The disciples notice Jesus praying "in a certain place." They ask him to teach them to pray just as John the Baptist taught his disciples. Jesus teaches them a simple version of the most famous Christian prayer, the Our Father, or the Lord's Prayer. Matthew's version shows signs of being shaped by public prayer. Luke's version is probably closer to the original form that Jesus taught. Stripped of much of the language we are used to Luke's version seems simple and direct. We pray that God's name will be recognized as holy and that his rule over all will be established. This is followed by petitions for our needs for bread, for forgiveness, and for deliverance. Luke uses the more theological language of "sins" rather than "debts," which is used in Matthew's version. Having taught his disciples a simple prayer, Jesus goes on to reassure them that God answers prayers. First he tells a parable about a persistent neighbor who asks a friend for bread at midnight. The friend is already in bed and has no desire to disturb his family by opening the door. But because the neighbor is persistent, the sleeping man gets up and gives him all that he needs. If a neighbor is willing to help us if we are persistent enough, how could God not respond to our requests? The parable and the concluding teaching should not lead us to think of prayer as a series of requests presented to God.

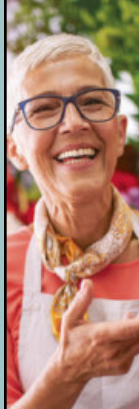
