"Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears His glory. Nations shall walk by your light and kings by your shining radiance."(Is. 60:1ff) The Epiphany of the Lord signals the initial fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah and also a renewal of the mission of Israel. The descendants of Abraham were to be a source of blessing to the nations as they would reveal to the nations the one true God. Jesus is the light of the nations and His mystical body the Church continues to be His visible presence in the world! The Magi represent the fruit of Jesus' Nativity and that of Pentecost! The Magi were searchers for truth and hope just as many continue to seek God today, however unknowingly. We are the bearers of the Light of the Nations! We are witnesses to His incarnation, His teachings, His miracles, His healings, and most of all His suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension! May we continue our part in the saving mission of Jesus Christ as He told us that we are the light of the nations and the salt of the earth!

WELCOME TO THE LITURGY CORNER!

What does it mean to be, "One Body in Christ"?

Let's take a look at what the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches:

790 Believers who respond to God's word and become members of Christ's Body, become intimately united with him: "In that body the life of Christ is communicated to those who believe, and who, through the sacraments, are united in a hidden and real way to Christ in his Passion and glorification." This is especially true of Baptism, which unites us to Christ's death and Resurrection, and the Eucharist, by which "really sharing in the body of the Lord, . . . we are taken up into communion with him and with one another."

791 The body's unity does not do away with the diversity of its members: "In the building up of Christ's Body there is engaged a diversity of members and functions. There is only one Spirit who, according to his own richness and the needs of the ministries, gives his different gifts for the welfare of the Church." The unity of the Mystical Body produces and stimulates charity among the faithful: "From this it follows that if one member suffers anything, all the members suffer with him, and if one member is honored, all the members together rejoice." Finally, the unity of the Mystical Body triumphs over all human divisions: "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus."





Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD)

St. Anthony Catholic Church invites you to make a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD) tax free out of your retirement account if you are over 70 ½ years of age and are required to take distributions. If you have not taken all your Required Minimum Distribution, you can make a direct contribution to a charity. By making a QCD, you will avoid paying income tax on the distribution and the 50% excise tax penalty from the IRS. But this must be done before December 31. 
