Marriage

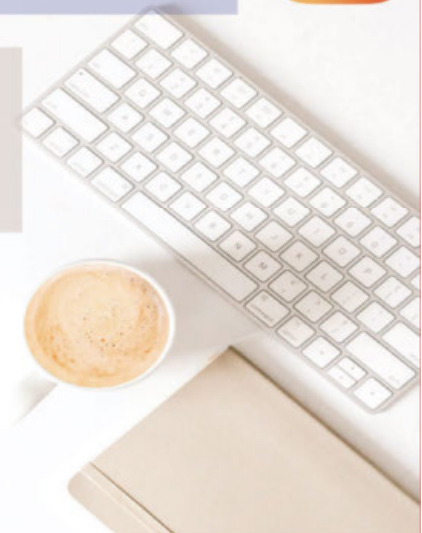
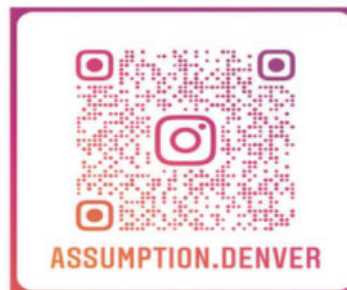

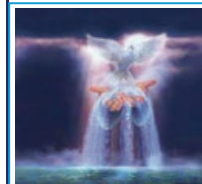


The Religious Education Department is asking for donations of individually wrapped snacks or drinks for classes & events. A box of something can be purchased from any grocery store or even big box store.

A Word from our Shepherd

My Dear Flock in the Lord Jesus:

Christ is born! Glorify Him! I pray that these days of Christmastide continue to be filled with a spirit of wonder and adoration at the Incarnation of the Eternal Word of the Father. While our secular culture has already taken down their Christmas trees and decorations, we continue our holy celebration of the Nativity of the Lord. The Christmas season officially ends after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord this Sunday. Here at the parish we will keep the Manger and Trees and Lights up inside the Church through the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, February 2nd, when we solemnly bless candles. In this way we resist the commercialization of these holy feast days and continue to linger and savor the wondrous Incarnation of Emmanuel, God-with-us.

I have found myself moved deeply this year by the Preface that we pray at Holy Mass during Christmastide. Let me share it you:

*For through Him the holy exchange that restores our life
has shone forth today in splendor:
when our frailty is assumed by your Word
not only does human mortality receive unending honor
but by this wondrous union we, too, are made eternal.*

That last line has been a rich source of prayer and contemplation for me. By God becoming man, we become partakers in Divine Nature. Through our Baptism, we are made eternal, by our union with Christ, who united Himself to all mankind through the Incarnation. This is such a deep mystery that must be prayerfully meditated upon so that we can live from it in our daily lives.

Lastly, I wanted to address security issues. Over the last six months we have had two vehicles stolen during the 8:30am Sunday Mass from our front parking lot. We are forming a team to watch the parking lots during Mass. But please lock your doors. It is always an option to park in the back parking lot, which is more protected. We are also partnering with local law enforcement who have agreed to regularly keep an eye on the parking lots on the weekends. If you do have something taken, please call and file a police report. The parish office can work with you to check our cameras. I'm confident with beefed up security we have nothing to worry over.

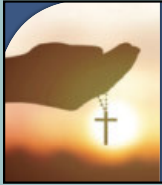
