

Food For Faith Living from the desk of Fr. Mark

Our journey through life reaches a summit when we can look back and forward to where our future lies. The summit is wisdom, the treasure of understanding meaning and purpose which offers fulfillment. It is the explanation of faith entered into, challenged by, and leading us to the fullness of our freedom, knowing who I am and how I live this faith daily. It is to realize God's Covenant with each and all of us is the one truth that gives life without end.

The liturgical year (Advent, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, etc.) is a passage of God's gift of life, of God sharing life with us and providing us with help to use our talents and freedom fully. The living of clarity of this is wisdom. The risk of trusting in God's actions and Word is faith. The living of faith is love expressed in relationships which nurture, sustain, heal, reconcile and fulfill a person's life as a gift to be enjoyed and shared with each others. This may read like wishful thinking fantasy because we are still on our journey trusting God faithfully in the face of opposition, rejection, ridicule and abuse. It is the wisdom of understanding what "taking up our cross and following Him" means.

As the liturgical year ends, it celebrates the wisdom of trusting God, living God's truth and relying on God's presence. We celebrated this meaning in All Saints and all Souls Days recently. We got here because we've reflected, discerned and chose to follow Jesus in each person's unique and inviolate way. These feast days reminds us of our heritage and destiny as we herald Jesus as Son, Friend, Savior, Whose rule for and with us is Love Personified! Today's Gospel (Matthew) tells a parable which is clear in meaning, the foolish and wise servant girls (and boys) awaiting the celebration of the wedding feast (the Kingdom of God) to begin. The wise ladies (men too!) are prepared; they've trusted and done what is needed (lived faithfully). The foolish have not for the variety of excuses, justifications, complacency or refusals which people choose along their path through life. It's each person's choice and freedom. Choose wisely!


