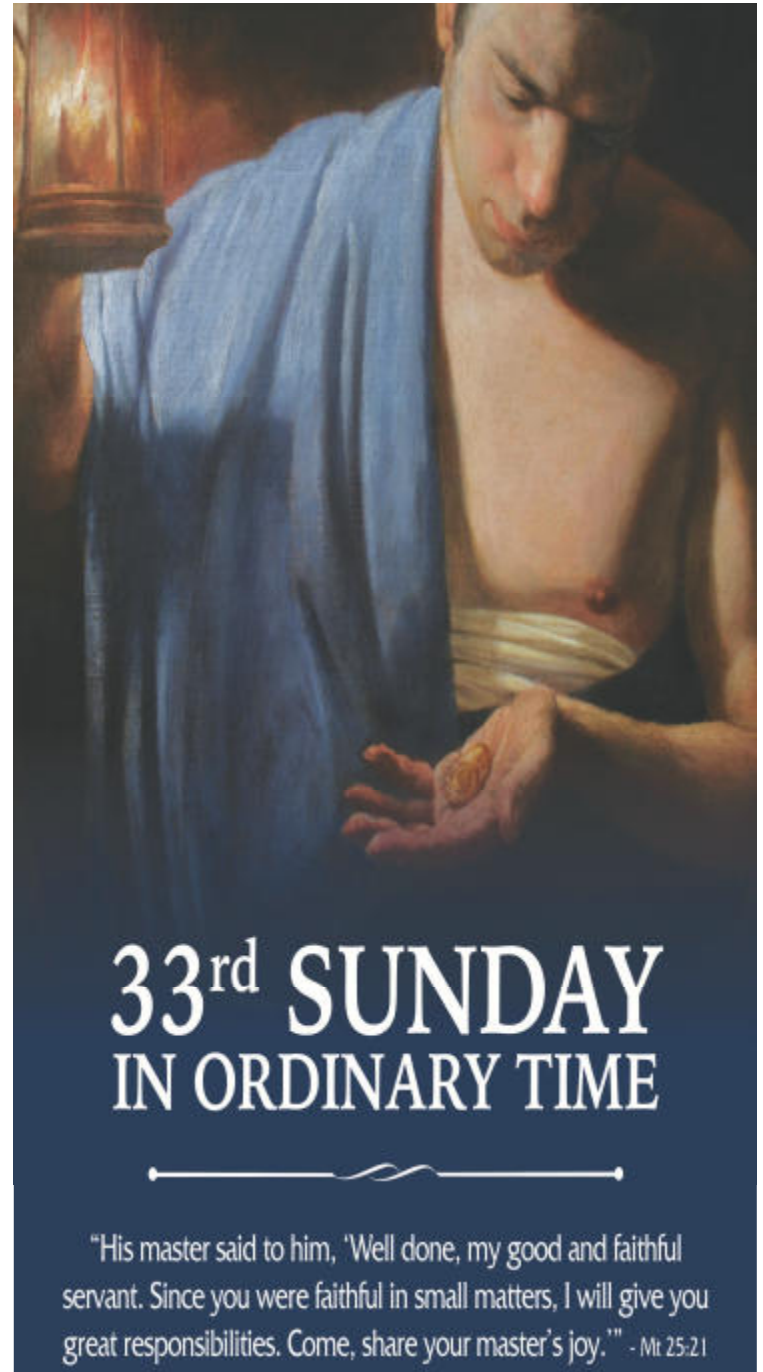

Food For Faith Living from the desk of Fr. Mark

From the beginning, God invited the human family to heed God's Word by discerning the meaning of life, truth, love and how to live accordingly. We listen to God's Word at every celebration of the Eucharist and the life offered us. Discerning the meaning is our responsibility and choice. Pleading ignorance is a lie! We have the gifts to do so. The closing passages of the year focus on the results of doing so. In Proverbs (1st rd.) we get a beautiful depiction of a woman described in the qualities of a good wife. Men have a strong tendency to charm women with praise, thanks and gifts while neglecting to give women their proper place in positions of authority, leadership and decision making which affects them as much as men are. Women's wisdom and strength, of caring for more than self, has saved humanity from much more violence and destruction than we now endure. Women are truly resilient and their determination will survive and thrive, come what may! The Church, in particular, needs their voice and wisdom to resolve all of its' challenges and problems.

St. Paul (2nd rd.) simply reminds us of mortality. The urgency is to be prepared, "stay alert and sober for the Lord will come like a thief in the night!" This isn't a threat; it says the obvious: we are not in control!

The Gospel parable challenges us to discern our choice in life. God didn't make junk! We have a variety of talents to provide us with a decent lifestyle. Whether rich or poor, highly intelligent or less, regardless of place, culture, race or gender, God's invitation is to find a treasure in living God's truth and sharing it with others through our capacity to love. When a person buries this treasure (gets wrapped up in self, hoarding gifts) God will simply remind us that we had the freedom to choose, so we are responsible for the results! Discomforting and challenging? Certainly, yet it is God assuring us, "Do not be afraid!" If we abide in love and truth, there is nothing to fear and much to look forward to. Be at peace.

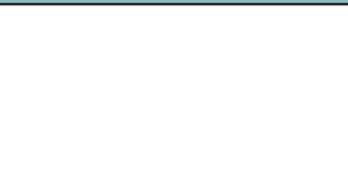
