

FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MARK

There is an innate hunger for meaning, purpose & finding one's true self in the process. It takes us deeper & further than our physical capacities & power to acquire knowledge. It is the wisdom of understanding who & what are vital & necessary to appreciate who "I am ! A great divide separates these focal points of how & why we live as we do.

One side finds this reality in mind and body, the other in spirit & transcendence. Sound like a classroom ; it is the reality we root our lives in. One sees nothing beyond ourselves & what is knowable & provable. The other sees a life source beyond the creation we are part of. This requires faith, a trust in who & what is not visible & tangible. It is the mystery of God, unknowable & incomprehensible. These focal points have triggered much of our progress & satisfaction as well as our pain, hurt & disillusionment, the violence in life, and yet our hunger is satisfied by our choice.

Knowledge provides certitude which we desire & comfort in. Faith does not do so : we can't know God, but are convinced by the ways we experience God in life. Examples abound, in Scripture & daily life, especially relationships.

A person needs to discern this to make it one's conviction. It is what happened to Samuel (1st rd). Realizing what was happening to him , he responds without fear, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening! Doing so, he becomes a leader to the people a blessing in God's promise accepted. St. Paul (2nd rd) also was touched dramatically his life was altered so dynamically that he came to realize & share this truth of God's living presence in & to all people! "Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you!" Living in that Spirit transcends death: we are God's presence by living God's s truth & sharing God's love with all! he hunger of John, the Baptist & his followers, was satisfied by Jesus. John , appreciating this gift, tells his disciples Jesus, Who asks them & (us) , "What are you looking for? If our hunger is for truth, the meaning of life & the power of lover, then Jesus will show us. When we embrace what Jesus shows us, our hunger is satisfied & we delight in sharing our treasure with others as we make our way to the kingdom.
