

FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

God's messengers range from Apostles, Martyrs, Prophets to ordinary people, amongst which most priests are, serving God by serving God's Family in the many expressions of ministry and assistance of a spiritual nature. A vital way to do this is to rely on the Spirit to enlighten and inspire our reflections on the Word of God presented to faith communities gathering in worship, preparing themselves to sharing the Eucharist.

Today's readings highlight these endeavors to call people to heed God's Word and live what they mean and propose all of us to do. A living faith is how the Good News of God is destined to bring the whole human family to the justice and peace, unity and harmony of eternal life with God and all of creation.

Ezekiel (1st rd.) is sent to the people who have rebelled against the Covenant God made with them. Nothing new here, but a reminder of humanity often succumbing to an innate weakness for independence, a desire for total control of one's life and what we seek as our fulfillment. This self-seeking and self-serving attitude and purpose is God's justice, which is God's Truth, being rejected, ignored, manipulated or threatened, resulting in the reality of sin which produces every form of violence we humans inflict on each other. Essentially, it is our refusal to love one another as God loves us and invites us to do to, for and with each other, a path to community well-being and the common good of all. Unlike fairy tales, myths and legends concerning life, these become the harsh realities of our time with its' dysfunctions and priorities producing divisive separations and isolation instead of a common bond of care and support for each other as God asks.

St. Paul(2nd rd.) paid dearly for presenting God's Words of life. He realized, and was grateful, for God's mercy and love in giving him a clear understanding of God's Truth, after opposing it. He interprets his not being proud and boastful in so doing to "a thorn in the flesh" to keep him humble and honest. It is a very bothersome thorn and Paul asks God for relief only to be reminded, as God desires to remind you and me, "My grace is sufficient for you." Paul grasps the meaning of this, as I pray we do, stating, "when I am weak, then I am strong," turning to, and trusting in, God for assistance and strength, a blessing we rely on in facing life's challenges.

Jesus suffers a similar reaction from His hometown folks, people who knew Him, some related to Him. This reminds us of our human condition and our propensity for judging others rather than appreciating them in their uniqueness and variety of gifts. The people leave Jesus unable to do and be for them Who He is. To sum up the text, "He was amazed at their lack of faith!" Do I, we, recognize ourselves in any of the above?


