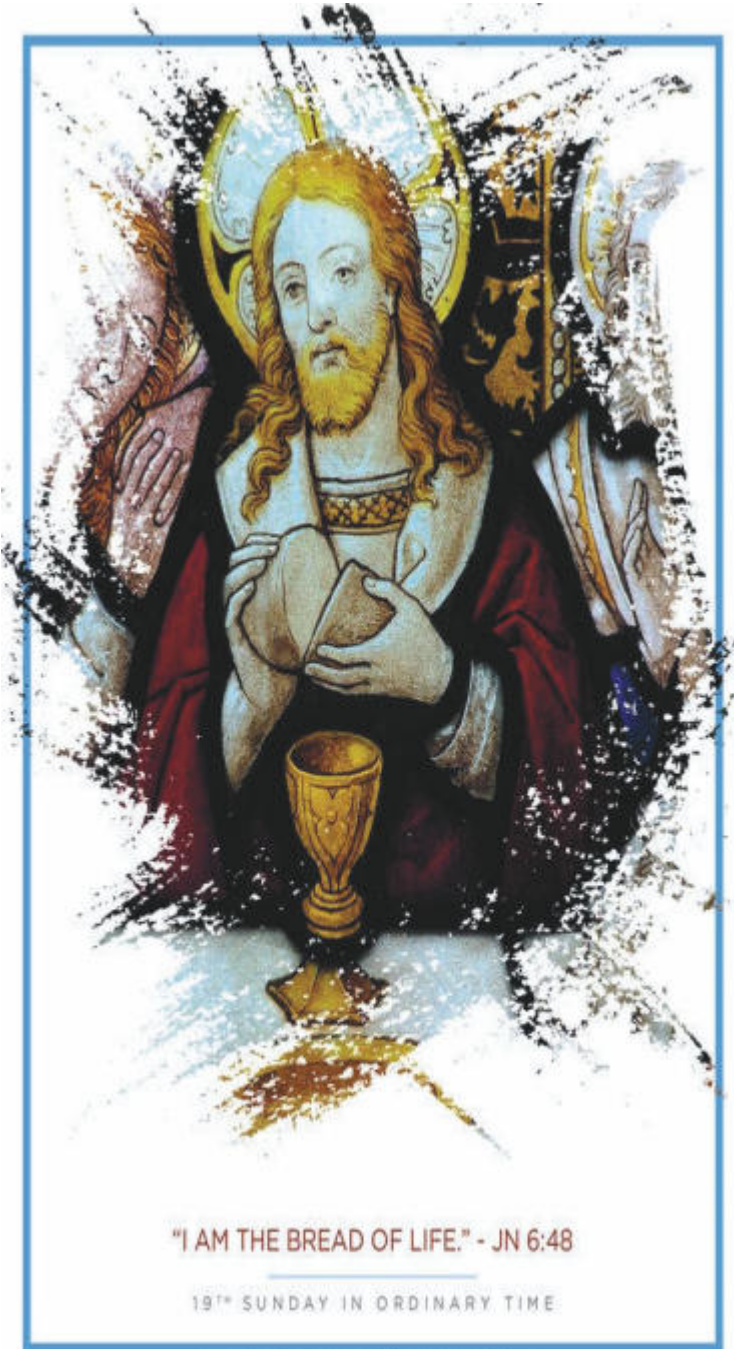

FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

Today's readings sound current as the people face the challenges, hardships, contradictions and deception in life which seem inevitable and unchangeable. It is this attitude and response, to life's situations and conditions, which God asks us to confront, solve and bring about what God desires the human family to be and enjoy. Hard to believe, yet God's Word tells us we are all a part of making it happen or not. True faith involves accepting God's Word as Truth and upholding the truth in the face of opposition and violence. This takes courage and trust to be unafraid in so doing. God is ever with us and the Spirit will enlighten and energize us to do what God invites us to do. God gave us the freedom to decide.

In Elijah (1st rd.) a vivid example of this as Elijah heeded God's Word and acted on removing the evils and injustice of the king who chooses power and control rather than leading them to a better way of life. Elijah flees for his life and sustained by God to carry on.

Jesus (Gospel) is confronted, challenged and opposed by the civic and religious leaders, those with authority. Jesus speaks and lives God's Truth fully. It will lead to His Passion and brutally, cruel death. Unfazed, He will be God's Truth and Love in more than words and prayers. He will love them and invite all people, us, to do likewise. Our limitations cause doubts. We will be set free by choosing God's Truth and love in struggling against the powers who seek to control everyone and everything. We need to admit current events and worldwide strife are realities which God detests and encourages us to undo. Injustices must be opposed and removed. It will happen when people give themselves to the task and work together for the well-being of everyone.

That is St. Paul's (2nd rd.) summation of true faith telling us to remove all bitterness, fury, anger and self-serving goals from our lives so as to give life to each other, bringing God's presence to others by being kind, compassionate, merciful and forgiving as God is to us. "Be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love." In so doing, we will rejoice in gathering at the Lord's table and sharing the meal foreshadowing the eternal feast in heaven!

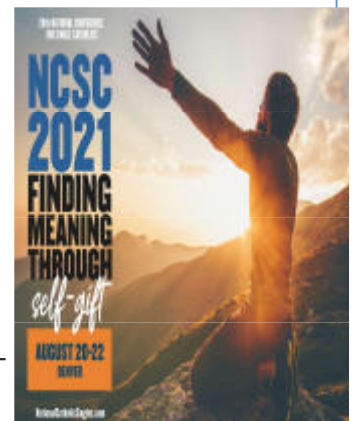
