FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

God's call for Justice challenges us to have the courage and honesty to own up to our actions, not by mouthing God's truths, but by living them ever seeking to fulfill God's desire for all people, protection and defense by sincere efforts to right wrongs, resist evil and work together for the dignity and well-being of others. Mouthing these ideals is a steady blind spot in human behavior. We all face the inviting attitude and temptation of seeking what appeals and attracts us to be selfish, self-seeking and self-serving. These become real paths to ignoring, tolerating and approving the legal injustices which prevail and thrive when good people decline to lift a finger in assisting those denied their rights, whose dignity is demeaned and whose dire needs are ignored and neglected. The ultimate deadliness of these justifications leads to a self-righteous arrogance which absolves us from being active participants in undoing these violences inflicted on far too many of God's children. Such attitudes Parallel what is recorded in Scripture when God rebuked the practitioners of ritual piety and correct offerings and sacrifices, who convinced themselves God was pleased with such and viewed the sufferings and hardships of others as their own fault, signs of their sinfulness. Today, the self righteous, amongst others, use many descriptions to scapegoat the victims of injustice as causers of their plight, thus remaining indifferent to alleviating their pain and righting the wrongs. Thus, the crucifixion of Jesus continues.

These ugly realities of life, and the growing violence's in our society, call us to soul-search rather than grovel in shame. Today's readings set before us choices. God says our participation and contributing is essential in making life good by our willingness to go beyond self and be for others. This fulfills God's Will for God's family which includes us. St. James (2nd rd.) states it boldly, "Be doers of God's Word and hearers only, deluding ourselves." Jesus (Gospel) says: "Nothing that enters one from outside a person can defile us. From within, from our hearts, come evil thought, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, envy" and all other causes of the violence's of injustice. The result of our response will decide the future! Come, Holy Spirit, inspire our efforts to be true daughters and sons of God!

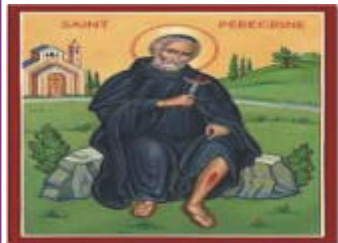
