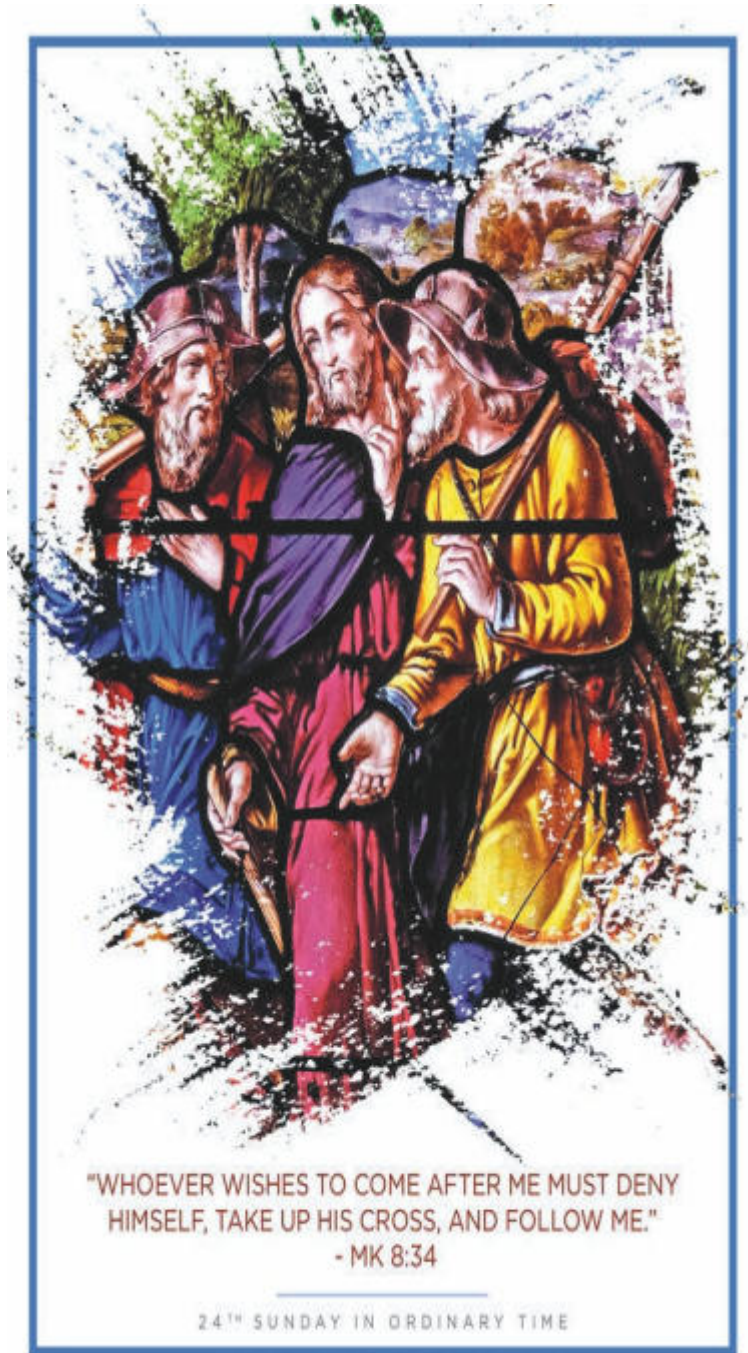

FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

"The truth will set you free." Powerful, inspiring words which satisfy human hunger for meaning and fulfillment. Still, we live in a time and society that is disintegrating, where truth is denied, rejected or no longer considered objective and attainable as miss and distrust contaminate our lives and focus and purpose get lost in the confusion. Of course, we pray this isn't our lot without recognizing it. Reflection and discernment will bring us to a conscience finding the truth and living it with sincerity.

Today's readings go to the heart of truth. Jeremiah (1st rd.) presents a Suffering Servant, who holds to God's truth, is violently abused for this. As his story unfold in depths of meaning, we identify Jesus' Passion and Death. Then we hear the conviction, "The Lord God is My help; Who will prove Me wrong?"

St. James (2nd rd.) is a down to earth teacher of God's truth, mincing no words! How easy do people find ways to mouth truth, not live it! He asks, "What good is it if someone says that have faith, but do not have works? It is dead!" God's truth covers all aspects of life, not only religion, but community, work and all of society seeking the rewards of truth.

Jesus (Gospel) in teaching (enlightening) His disciples, brings this to light. He asks; "Who do people say that I am?" Responses vary until Peter says: "You are the Christ!" The answer is correct with no discerning what it means, and Jesus rebukes Peter: "Get behind me Satan! You are thinking not as God does, but as people do!" The invitation Jesus presents is made to all of us. "Whoever wishes to follow Me must deny self and take up the Cross! He adds; "Those, who strive to save their lives, will lose it, but whoever loses their life, for My sake, will save it," a call to love and forgiveness, mercy and compassion, justice, reconciliation and generosity of self. This is the truth that sets us free wherein we fulfill ourselves as God's daughters and sons, God's will for all of God's Family: every person is a child of God. Love one another becomes a living faith when we seek and work for the well-being and common good of all! It brings an inner joy and peace no one or nothing can take from us!

SVDP FINANCIAL REPORT FOR August 2021. We began August with \$1,809.24. Parish members and family contributed an additional \$2,446.00, Langenderfer funds of \$1,050.00, member honorarium \$300.00 and Servite contribution of \$100.00 for a total amount of \$3,896.00. Our Total Expenses were \$5,192.06, we used this funding to assist with \$3,535.06 in rent for neighbors in need; Xcel Bills of \$1,457.06 and \$200.00 SVDP Co-pay. SVDP is grateful for the generosity of the members of the congregation during these troubled times.
