FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

Today's readings contain the essence of faith-living. It is discerning God's awesome acts and the life-restoring and life-giving power of God's Word, the truth which sets us free from all that injures, demeans or destroys life in all forms. God's Word is conveyed to Jeremiah (1st rd.) as a promise which God remains faithful to and is fulfilling each day everywhere. It harkens us to respond to God's Covenant with humanity, a Covenant inviting us to participate in fulfilling the Promise and enjoying it eternally.

Such an attractive offer is difficult to resist when a person seeks meaningful answers to foundational questions we ask ourselves: why am I here? What is life's meaning and purpose? How am I able to achieve this? Desire alone won't achieve this. It will happen when we discern the truth and decide to live it, our contribution to making it a reality for all to enjoy. Yes, you, me, and everyone, as ordinary and seemingly insignificant as we feel in this immensity, are lovingly invited to do so, the true use of our freedom which can set all humanity free!

The focus is Jesus, the Son of God, Word of God, Good Shepherds, Messiah and Savior of all the dead, the living and those yet to be born. We read and remember Jesus' life amongst us, bringing God's Word and love to us, Love Personified in Jesus, powerfully and incomprehensibly expressed by His brutal death, His total demise, and the Resurrection to life destroying death forever!

In Hebrews (2nd rd.) this is ritually celebrated with priest presiding. The profound meaning declares God is Mystery beyond our limitations. The Mystery is true life—giving conviction reveals Jesus is the High Priest; His offering of Self is cause for celebrating! All remembrances of this eternal act of love gives us life anew!

In its' simplicity, the Gospel presents and fulfills who we are, and what our relationship with God means. A blind man begs Jesus for sight, "that I may see." We meant to be lived with each and all others! This truth sets us free in a chaotic, dysfunctional world and society, to contribute ourselves to others and participate in fulfilling God's Promise forever!
