

FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

Halloween was once a playful, harmless way of presenting the spirit world to kids whose imaginations ran wild, easily frightened by costumes of ghosts and skeletons, their delight was the sweets they received at home entrances (Trick or Treat). Life has changed; our lives are cluttered with multitasking, tons of information, means of communicating impersonally and, sadly, growing further apart from others and realities, distorted, denied, manipulated and exploited by denying facts and dismissing there is truth in life. Welcome to the chaos and dysfunctions of today. I'm fairly certain few agree with or enjoyed it. We see life, and live it, our own way.

There is a reality fast becoming fiction; it is God and a way of life in accordance with the Truth God presents to us, inviting our response. We have the freedom to decide, in Deuteronomy (1st. rd.) God presents a Covenant to the human family, represented by the Hebrews, chosen to be God's instruments in reaching all people. God desires a relationship with us in a Covenant expressing God's Truth and Justice, inviting us to love God with our whole being. God provides the answer to how this is done. 


