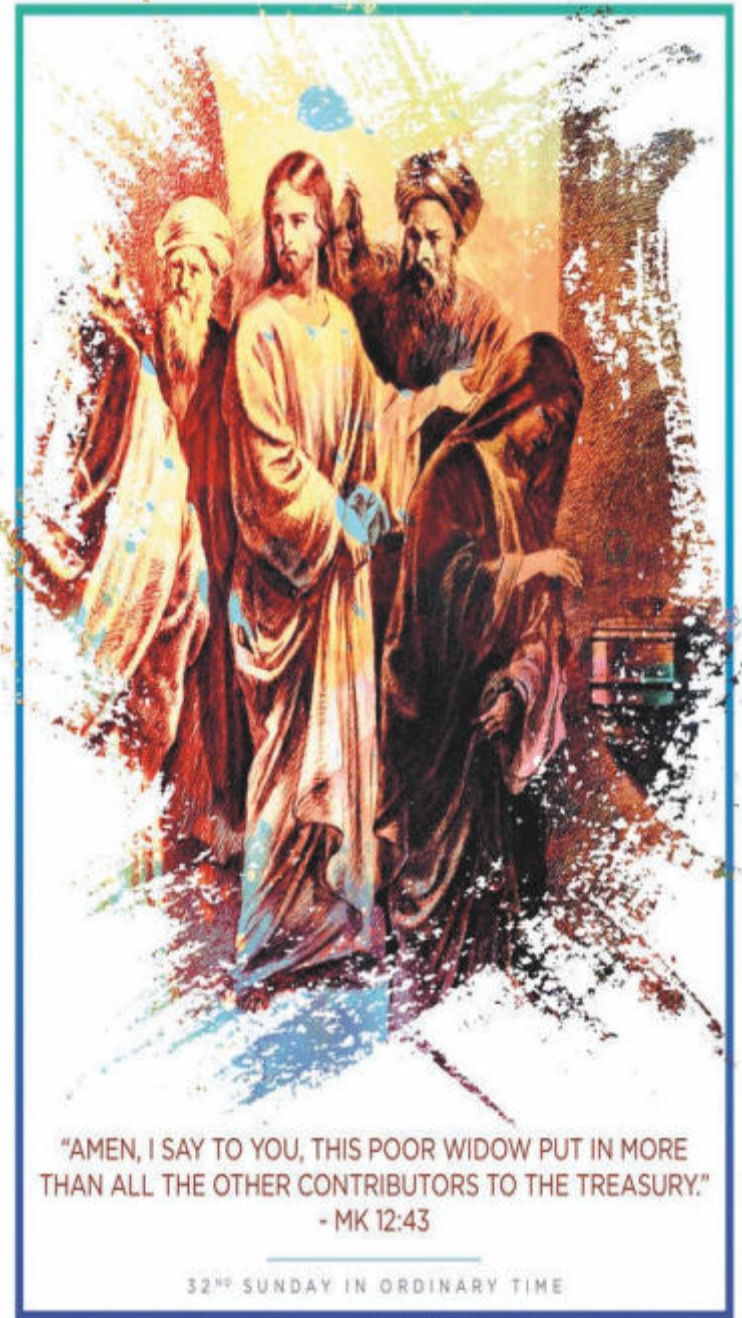

FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

We celebrated our lives together, as God's family, on All Saints and Souls' Day. All Souls are sinners, you and me, who heed God's Word for conversion of heart, mind and will, God's invitation to the kingdom by our willingness to build it by living our lives in the truth that sets us free! This truth is a life-style of faith, a being for others and not hoarding life for self. This truth gives life meaning and defines our purpose. The gift of self to others, serving each other, as God has given Self to us by the gift of life. God is the Source of Life requesting we become life givers to one and all. Love is God, not a platitude or sentiment, but a call to participate in removing evil and undoing the many injustices which injure, demean, exploit and manipulate life by choosing selfishness, in all of its' in all of its' expressions. These define sin, every refusal to love.

Jesus taught the Beatitudes (Nov. 1st) invite us to give life to others. The perfect example of giving Self to others is God. Jesus is the clear, Complete expression of this, Love Personified, Who lived amongst us, to set us free and find our true self and fulfillment, not in things, be they wealth, power, control, greed or self-righteousness, but in giving, receiving and sharing life in all the relationships which become a treasury of blessings be it in marriage, family and friends to the contributions and efforts we make to establish communities seeking the well-being of everyone. This is the greatness of any nation, people working together, co=operating, resolving differences without the use of violence and contributing self for the common good of all!

This is intimately personal, between God and each of us. The Book of Kings (1st rd.) presents this generosity. A widow gives her last bit of food to Elijah trusting God will save her and son from death. Hebrews (2nd rd.) reminds us Jesus is the source of our healing, forgiveness and eternal life. Such generosity of self to others is praised by Jesus (Gospel). An impoverished widow gives what she has. In giving all she had, it was a true gift of self, the only gift each one of us have. Will we give it to others or hoard for self?
