

FOOD FOR FAITH LIVING FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK

The Baptism of Jesus concludes the Christmas season. Years removed from the Nativity, it seals the meaning of God's Love ever generous and faithful, inviting us to embrace and live it by inviting the Holy Spirit to enlighten to life's meaning and purpose and inspire us to live it! This is God's Will to, for and with us, setting us free and bringing inner joy and peace.

The wondrous acts of God, the coded messages and promises are celebrated when understood and connected. This Covenant invites us. People of faith, to establish justice in our lives, homes, communities, society and world by resisting evil and removing the many injustices inflicted on the innocent, powerless, victimized and marginalized by the greedy and powerful, self-seeking and serving people whose goal is to rule and control others. Sadly, these are the respected and admired people. Is this an indication of, or subconscious desire, to be like them? Ugly? True? Every person needs to soul-search for the honesty to change what needs changing and to do what needs doing to better life for all . The Big lie makes it easier to justify a passive response and attitude, accepting reality as impossible to change, undo. Are we abandoning the gifts of the Spirit?

Isaiah(1st rd.) declares God's Love, coming and living amongst us, a true sign that God delights in us. That Life ended in a brutal death. This darkness reveals human frailty in being for self and refusing to love God and people, the harm we inflict on each other.
