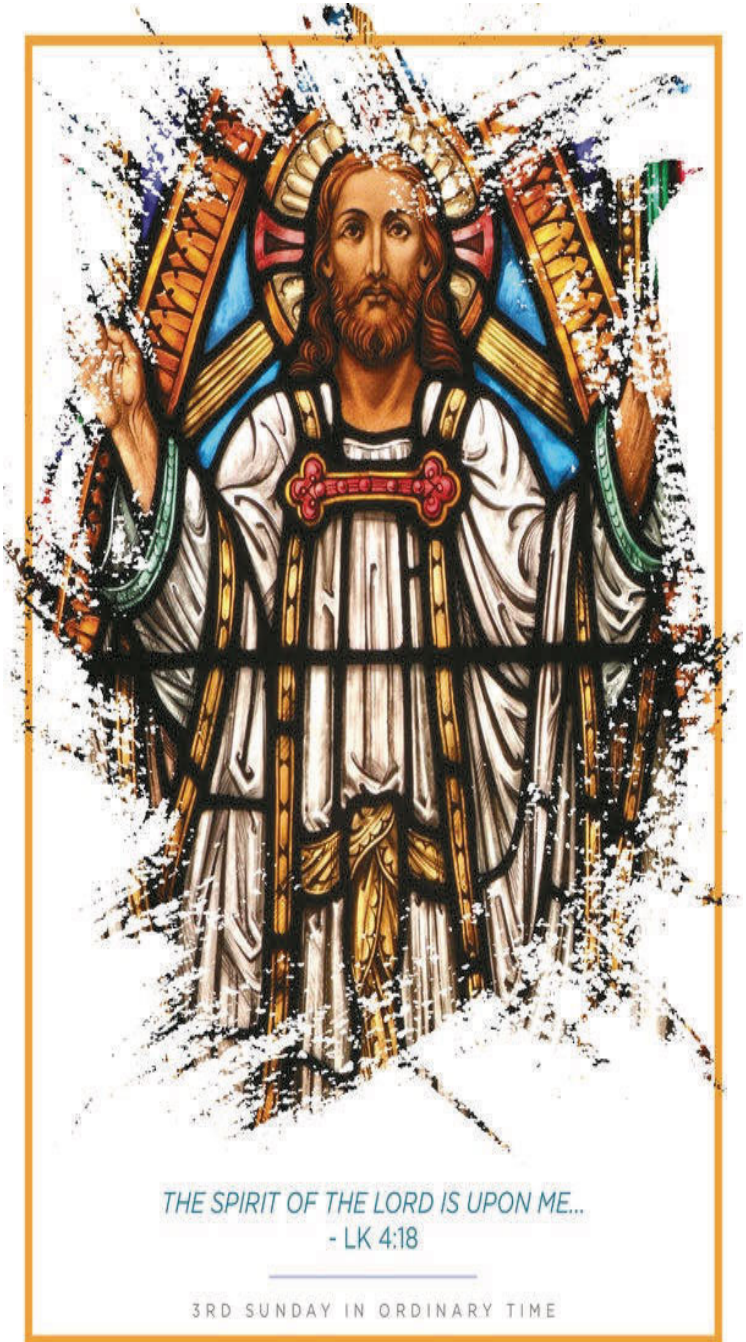

In Nehemiah (1st rd.) we hear another message of God's Promise. He, and Ezra, the priest scribe, remind the people of all God did and will continue to do for them. They are the remnant, returning to home and land, after captivity in Babylon. The message? "Do not be sad for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength! "This is true today, and always. Life is hard and the path contains challenges, contradictions and suffering. Only in living God's truth will we experience inner joy and peace because we've embraced "the truth which sets us free!" 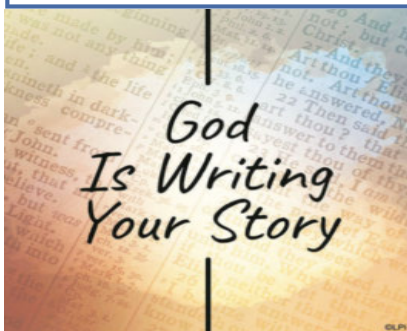
