

Archives of The Catholic Church in Utah

The mission of the Office of Archives and Records is fivefold: 1) to serve as a resource to the Bishop, Diocesan Curia, parishes, schools, and Diocesan institutions; 2) to aid in the systematic management of all Diocesan information: including records, data, and patrimonial goods; 3) to function as the official repository for the Diocese's historical information; 4) to preserve the Diocese's historical information and 5) to make available the Diocese's historical information to those interested in the history of the Roman Catholic Church in the state of Utah.

Persons with Disabilities

In the fall of 1998, the USCCB commemorated the 20th anniversary of their previous pastoral statement with Welcome and Justice for Persons with Disabilities: A Framework of Access and Inclusion, emphasizing that,

"We must recognize and appreciate the contributions that persons with disabilities can make to the Church's spiritual life and encourage them to do the Lord's work in the world according to their God-given talents and capacity."

Office of Safe Environment

The Diocese of Salt Lake City is committed to ensuring the safety of children, young people and vulnerable adults and providing pastoral outreach to victims and survivors of sexual abuse by clergy.

Office of Religious Education

The office of Religious Education provides training for lay catechists and resources for parish and school religious education programs. Certification programs and support for directors of religious education are also provided. "Consequently, diocesan pastoral programs must give absolute priority to the formation of lay catechists."

Marriage Tribunal

The Diocesan Tribunal processes cases for married couples seeking to obtain a declaration of invalidity of marriage. In addition, the Tribunal provides canonical counsel for the clergy and laity of the Diocese and assists them with training in Canon Law.

Gratitude in Action: Our Way of Life / Gratitud en Acción: Nuestra forma de Vida

"Nothing that enters one from the outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile." (Mark 7:15) It is up to us. It is our responsibility to process, so to speak, what we hear and what we see – what is taken within ourselves.

An inappropriate reaction or response to something we hear or see can lead to *unclean*, perhaps *evil thoughts*. Our behaviors may become *immoral*, even *unlawful*. *Envy* and *greed* can lead to selfish decisions, whereby we tend to overlook all God has given us for which we should be grateful. *Deceitfulness* can lead us to an impaired acknowledgment of who we truly are and who God intended us to be as His creation.

Improperly channeled, what we hear and what we see can lead us into temptations that may impair or destroy, not only ourselves, but others as well.

In the *Lord's Prayer* which Jesus gave us, we pray:
"and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

"The person praying knows that God does not want to force him into what is wrong. He asks God here for his guidance in temptation, ... God, in whom there is no shadow of darkness, does not tempt anyone. But God can put us to the test ... in order to make us more mature, in order to bring us face-to-face with our own depths so as then to be able to bring us back to himself more completely. ... We ask him not to allow us to get into temptations that might make us slide into evil ways; that he not subject us to tests that strain us beyond our powers; that he not set aside his power and leave us on our own, that he knows our weakness and therefore will protect us so that we are not lost."¹

God has given us the freedom to choose – right or wrong, life or death. May we always choose the ways that are those of God. May we always choose life and thus eternal life.

"Nada que entre a uno desde el exterior puede contaminar a esa persona; pero lo que sale de dentro es lo que contamina". (Marcos 7:15) Depende de nosotros. Es nuestra responsabilidad procesar, por así decirlo, lo que oímos y lo que vemos, lo que llevamos dentro.

Una reacción o respuesta inapropiada a algo que escuchamos o vemos puede llevar a pensamientos *impuros*, tal vez *malvados*. Nuestros comportamientos pueden volverse *inmorales*, incluso *ilegales*. La *envidía y la codicia* pueden llevar a decisiones egoistas, por lo que tendemos a pasar por alto todo lo que Dios nos ha dado por lo que debemos estar agradecidos. *El engaño* puede llevarnos a un reconocimiento deteriorado de quiénes somos realmente y quiénes Dios quiere que seamos como su creación.

Canalizado incorrectamente, lo que escuchamos y lo que vemos puede llevarnos a tentaciones que pueden perjudicarnos o destruirnos, no solo a nosotros mismos, sino también a los demás.

En el *Padrenuestro* que Jesús nos dio, oramos: "Y no nos metas en tentación, más libranos del mal".

La persona que ora sabe que Dios no quiere obligarlo a cometer lo incorrecto. Aquí le pide a Dios que lo guíe en la tentación... Dios, en quien no hay sombra de tinieblas, no tienta a nadie. Pero Dios puede ponernos a prueba... para hacernos más maduros, para acercarnos a nuestra propia profundidad para luego poder traernos más completamente a Él. ... Le pedimos que no nos permita caer en tentaciones que puedan hacernos deslizarnos por malos caminos; que no nos someta a pruebas que nos fuercen más allá de nuestras facultades; que no deje a un lado su poder y nos deje solos, que conozca nuestra debilidad y, por lo tanto, nos proteja para que no estemos perdidos "¹.

Dios nos ha dado la libertad de elegir: correcto o incorrecto, vida o muerte. Que siempre elijamos los caminos que son los de Dios. Que siempre elijamos la vida y, por lo tanto, la vida eterna.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PADRE: FATHER DAVID BITTMENN



One evening during a family reunion two first cousins placed their toddlers one in front of the other just to see what would happen. Both children stood rooted to their spots and each one looked over the new arrival in front of them with frowns and lips that trembled from time to time. Neither child was quite sure what to do. Both children looked at their parents and grandparents, but the gentle laughter and smiles of the adults offered the children little direction. Finally one child pushed the other to the ground.

It's no secret that young children need to learn the basics of good behavior. Many people will spend the rest of their lives building on their good behavior fundamentals so as to reach heaven after death. In sense, these people are like toddlers looking to their families for guidance. But this time the family is the Church. Sometimes the guidance of the Church is clear and sometimes it less clear, like the gentle laughter and smiles of the adults around the two toddlers. The adults were not clear because they wanted to see what the children would do; the Church is unclear because it is not a master list containing the right response to every conceivable contingency. Even saints disagree. In 1378 there were two popes, Urban and Clement and it wasn't clear who the legitimate pope was. "St Catherine of Siena, St. Catherine of Sweden, Bl. Peter of Aragon, Bl. Ursulina of Parma, Philippe d'Alencon, and Gerard de Groote were in the camp of Urban; St. Vincent Ferrer, Bl. Peter of Luxemburg, and St. Colette belonged to the party of Clement (<https://www.newadvent.org/cathen/13539a.htm>)."¹ It would take a lot of praying, studying, and time (40 years) before this controversy was resolved.

Saints are not supposed to be robots but rather those growing toward God with all the ups and downs this journey entails. Saints are to grow in discernment, the capacity to understand and honor God's will in life. Discernment flourishes in a particular kind of family or Church environment. A sense of binding and vital truths needs to be maintained along with patience in the face of human limitations. Communication and direct experience with members of the family and the Church help these two aspects function well together. Making assumptions about other people's hearts, minds, and motives usually is incomplete. After all, Jesus' opponents were convinced they knew his motives and that they knew what was in his heart and mind. They were wrong.

All the disagreement and uproar about what people do and fail to do can hide one fact found in this weekend's second reading: God "willed to give us birth by the word of truth that we may be a kind of first fruits of his creatures." The Kingdom is among us. Blessed are those who put that first and sacrifice their lives for it.

Una noche, durante una reunión familiar, dos primos colocaron a sus niños pequeños uno frente al otro para ver qué pasaría. Los dos niños se quedaron quietos y miraron fijamente al otro niño. Cada niño fruncía el ceño y tenía labios que temblaban de vez en cuando. Ninguno de los dos estaba seguro de qué hacer. Ambos niños miraban a sus padres y abuelos, pero las risas suaves y las sonrisas de los adultos ofrecieron a los niños poca dirección. Finalmente un niño empujó al otro al suelo.

No es ningún secreto que los niños pequeños necesitan aprender lo básico del buen comportamiento. Muchas personas pasarán el resto de sus vidas construyendo sobre sus fundamentos de buena conducta para llegar al cielo después de la muerte. En sentido, estas personas son como niños pequeños que buscan orientación para sus familias. Sin embargo, esta vez la familia es la Iglesia. A veces la guía de la Iglesia es clara y a veces menos clara, como la suave risa y las sonrisas de los adultos alrededor de los dos niños pequeños. Los adultos no estaban claros porque querían ver lo que los niños harían; la Iglesia no está clara porque no es una lista que contenga la respuesta correcta a cada contingencia concebible. Incluso los santos están en desacuerdo. En 1378 había dos papas, Urban y Clement, y no estaba claro quién era el Papa legítimo. Santa Catalina de Siena, Santa Catalina de Suecia, Bendito Pedro de Aragón, y Bendito Ursulina de Parma creían que Urbano era el papa; San Vicente Ferrer, San Pedro de Luxemburgo y Santa Colette pensaban que Clemente era el Papa (<https://www.newadvent.org/cathen/13539a.htm>). Harían falta muchas oraciones, estudios y tiempo (40 años) antes de que se resolviera esta controversia.

Los santos no son robots, sino más bien aquellos que crecen hacia Dios con todos los éxitos y fracasos del verdadero camino. Los santos han de crecer en discernimiento, que es la capacidad de entender y honrar la voluntad de Dios en la vida. El ambiente de la Iglesia o de la familia puede ayudar al proceso de discernimiento. Un ambiente útil incluye el reconocimiento de verdades vinculantes y vitales y paciencia frente a las limitaciones humanas. La comunicación y la experiencia personal con los miembros de la familia y de la Iglesia permiten que las verdades importantes y la paciencia funcionen bien juntas. Hacer suposiciones sobre los corazones, las mentes y los motivos de otras personas generalmente es incompleto. Los oponentes de Jesús estaban convencidos de que conocían sus motivos y que sabían lo que había en su corazón y mente. Se equivocaron.

Todo el desacuerdo y las opiniones diferentes sobre lo que la gente hace y no hace puede ocultar un hecho encontrado en la segunda lectura de este fin de semana: Dios "nos engendró, para que seamos como la primicia de sus criaturas." El Reino está entre nosotros. Bienaventurados aquellos que ponen eso primero y sacrifican sus vidas por ello.

we are apart.


