

PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PADRE: FATHER DAVID BITTMENN



Cardinals - the birds not the bishops - are featured in some Christmas cards this time of year. These cards are not usually very religious but rather seek to evoke a sense of coziness. Be that as it may, there is something of the presence of the Lord in all

of creation and it is possible to interpret the cardinals of the cozy Christmas cards as pointing toward something greater. Cardinals are territorial birds; they tend to spend their lives within a mile of where they were born. For some people this territoriality symbolizes the Catholic Church. It hasn't strayed much from where it was born and still insists on ideas long past their prime. On one level the Church doesn't change much at all. We have churches that are centuries older than the nations that contain them. On another level, the Church is always changing. The liturgy, the rites, the Sacraments, and the Word of God which all seem so static are in fact dynamic. They are enduring invitations to participate in a journey into a life that always has more.

For many children Christmas is a time of candy, family, and presents. All of these things are fine and good, but there is more to Christmas than just this level of goodness. Once children grow enough to reflect, they discover Christmas is full of images and stories that never tire of forming new meditations.

Like the level of food, family, and presents the level of new meditations requires some work and we don't live on this level all the time. There are days when there is no energy, when one disappointment seems to follow another, when the routine is boring, etc. It takes work to understand that there is more and move toward it. At this time of year it is easier to do the work of food, family, and fun because many other people are doing the same thing. Those who are meditating on the Christmas mysteries have a harder time explaining their kind of work. So it can go unnoticed and if that happens long enough, meditation on the Christmas mysteries – as well as liturgy, Sacraments, and the Word of God – all seem unreal and fabricated. The doors to spiritual dynamism are shut.

But the work of meditation continues. A long-repeated word or a phrase from the Scriptures or a liturgy suddenly takes new meaning. There is satisfaction in communing with an old friend in prayer. Illumination floods the soul and the repetition of Word and Sacrament offer a way of understanding what is happening. The Healer stands ready to respond to our failures and limitations.

The second reading for Christmas Day tells us that the "grace of God has appeared, saving all and training us to reject godless ways...." This truth is old but when we acknowledge it, it becomes new. Cardinals are territorial birds, but they are also symbols of confidence and balance.

Los cardenales - los pájaros no los obispos - aparecen en algunas tarjetas de Navidad en esta época del año. Estas tarjetas no suelen ser muy religiosas, sino que buscan evocar una sensación de comodidad. Sea como fuere, hay algo de la presencia del Señor en toda la creación y es posible interpretar a los cardenales de las cómodas tarjetas de Navidad como apuntando hacia algo mayor.

Los cardenales son aves territoriales; tienden a pasar sus vidas a menos de una milla de donde nacieron. Para algunas personas esta territorialidad simboliza a la Iglesia Católica. No se ha desviado mucho de donde nació y todavía insiste en ideas que han pasado su mejor momento. En un nivel, la Iglesia no cambia mucho en absoluto. Tenemos iglesias que son siglos más antiguas que las naciones que las contienen. En otro nivel, la Iglesia siempre está cambiando. La liturgia, los ritos, los sacramentos y la Palabra de Dios, que parecen tan estáticos, son de hecho dinámicos. Son invitaciones duraderas para participar en un viaje hacia una vida que siempre tiene más.

Para muchos niños, la Navidad es un momento de dulces, familia y regalos. Todas estas cosas son buenas, pero hay más en la Navidad que solo este nivel de bondad. Una vez que los niños crecen lo suficiente para reflexionar, descubren que la Navidad está llena de imágenes e historias que nunca se cansan de formar nuevas meditaciones. Al igual que el nivel de comida, la familia y los regalos, el nivel de nuevas meditaciones requiere un poco de trabajo y no vivimos en este nivel todo el tiempo. Hay días en que no hay ánimo, cuando una decepción parece seguir a otra, cuando la rutina es aburrida, etc. Se necesita trabajo para entender que hay más y avanzar hacia él. En esta época del año es más fácil hacer el trabajo de la comida, la familia y la diversión porque muchas otras personas están haciendo lo mismo. Aquellos que están meditando en los misterios de Navidad tienen más dificultad para explicar su tipo de trabajo. Por esta razón, la meditación puede pasar desapercibida y, si eso sucede lo suficiente, la meditación sobre los misterios de Navidad – así como la liturgia, los sacramentos y la Palabra de Dios – todos parecen irreales y fabricados. Las puertas al dinamismo espiritual están cerradas.

Pero el trabajo de meditación continúa. Una palabra repetida o una frase de las Escrituras o una liturgia de repente toman un nuevo significado. Hay satisfacción en comulgar con un amigo honrado en oración. La iluminación inunda el alma y la repetición de la Palabra y el Sacramento ofrece una manera de entender lo que está sucediendo. El Sanador está listo para responder a nuestros fracasos y limitaciones.

La segunda lectura para el Día de Navidad nos dice que "ha aparecido la bondad de Dios y su amor al hombre." Esta verdad es antigua, pero cuando la reconocemos, se vuelve nueva. Los cardenales son aves territoriales, pero también son símbolos de confianza y equilibrio.



This kind of headline is almost guaranteed to cause some people to skip the article. A changing of the guard means that a big job is opening up and the article is bound to ask for people who could assume a sizable responsibility. Better to lie low and wait for someone else to fill the bill. But since you've made it this far, hang on for a few more minutes.

The last time we searched for a new manager for the thrift store, applicants were slow in coming. Finally, someone asked Jackie Rickman to apply and she did. She got the job and has been with us for nine years. She's seen a lot of changes and made a lot of friends. Last April, she relinquished some of her responsibilities but she didn't want to leave completely. She continued at the store until a new set of circumstances forced her hand. At the end of December, she will leave the thrift store for good. It's sad because she really made a difference and will be greatly missed.

Greater responsibilities bring with them greater rewards. There's a reason why people remember presidents more than they remember vice presidents. It's the same reason why we celebrate saints during the liturgical year while those who lied low are difficult to remember.

If you have managed before or if you know the thrift store well, don't stop reading. Think over the possibilities. Don't let fear get the last word. If you know someone who has managed before or knows the thrift store, and you don't want to ask them to consider the job then call Father Dave in the office. He'll ask. Such people can only say no.

The thrift store continues to be a help to St. George as a whole and bolsters the parish's reputation. A new manager isn't reinventing the wheel but will be standing on the shoulders of giants.

The thrift store manager oversees cashiers, organizes store receipt and deposit records, deposits money at the bank, grows in knowledge about local and national thrift store trends, works with the parish Business Finance Manager, tweaks the process of how items are handled from donation to sale, should have some experience with volunteers, needs effective communication skills, and works on long-range plans for marketing, personnel, and space aspects of the store. Don't be shy. Step right up and contact the Business Finance Manager in the parish office for a more complete job description.






