What IS God's will for me? There are times when it seems so simple, so straightforward. We know what God wants us to do, and what service we can perform in His name. At other times, it is as though we have no clue what our purpose in life is, and how we are being called to serve God and our neighbor. We ask for enlightenment and guidance.

"Me deleito en hacer tu voluntad, Dios mío;" Salmo 40:9

¿Cuál ES la voluntad de Dios para mí? Hay momentos en que parece tan simple, tan directo. Sabemos lo que Dios quiere que hagamos y qué servicio podemos realizar en su nombre. En otras ocasiones, es como si no tuviéramos idea de cuál es nuestro propósito en la vida y cómo estamos siendo llamados a servir a Dios y a nuestro prójimo. Pedimos iluminación y guía.

Cuando comenzamos, cuando nos esforzamos por conocer nuestro llamado a servir a Dios, identificamos cuáles son nuestros intereses en la iglesia, en nuestra comunidad local, en nuestro mundo, y buscamos reconocer esos dones y talentos que Dios nos ha otorgado para que podamos poder compartir. Quizás esos dones estén en la música, la proclamación de la Palabra, la ofrenda del Cuerpo de Cristo en la Misa o a los que están enfermos y confinados en casa.

Podemos experimentar un llamado para atender las necesidades de educación religiosa de los jóvenes o adultos que buscan saber más acerca de Dios y, tal vez, abrazar la fe católica.

¡Es muy importante ministrar a aquellos que sufren la pérdida de seres queridos que han experimentado una enfermedad a largo plazo o una muerte repentina e inesperada! Nuestra sociedad está tan ocupada viviendo la "vida", una vida que a menudo se interpone en el cuidado amoroso y la preocupación por los demás cuya vida, como alguna vez la conocieron, se ha hecho añicos y se ha puesto patas arriba.

Es posible que deseamos servir a los pobres de nuestra comunidad, ya sea a través de oportunidades en la iglesia o en la comunidad local periférica donde nos encontramos con personas sin hogar y otras personas que necesitan comida, ropa y refugio, y que a menudo parecen no tener a nadie más en su vida.

Dondequiera que Dios nos llame, reconoceremos la necesidad de los talentos que nos ha dado. Tal vez lo que podemos hacer o la necesidad que podemos proporcionar a otro puede parecer insignificante. Sin embargo, para aquellos que no tienen a nadie en quien apoyarse o escucharlos o realmente preocuparse por ellos, nos convertimos en uno de los muchos ángeles de Dios. ¡Recibimos a cambio mucho más!

Cualesquiera que sean los regalos que se nos hayan dado, no debemos guardarlos para un día lluvioso u otro momento de nuestra vida. Estamos llamados a usarlos ahora en respuesta al llamado de Dios. Oramos para que el Espíritu Santo abra nuestros oídos y nuestros corazones a ese llamado y nos guíe en nuestra respuesta.

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Some Catholics new to Utah experience a few surprises. Churches on every corner aren't Catholic and Catholic schools are few and far between. The resources in our diocese aren't the resources other dioceses have. Several years ago someone new to the state was startled to know that parishes planning building expansions had to raise 60% of the expansion cost themselves before borrowing the rest from the diocese. The diocese is not sitting on a pot of money even if expansion of a parish is vital.

Sometimes being the minority is annoying and from time to time annoyance becomes resentment against the majority, in this case the LDS. Such resentment is normally short-lived. Like any other group, the LDS community includes people who are pushy and people who are helpful. Adjustments are made and peace is restored. Something similar happens in theology. Years and years ago the lines between one denomination and another were vigilantly defended. Proclaiming truth was taken seriously and this translated into a suspicion about those on the other side. Yet the more truth was pursued, the more other facts came to light. Most of the books in the Bible are shared amongst the various Christian denominations. The Law and the Prophets of the Old Testament are sacred to Jews. Moral codes overlap, not completely but they do overlap. Christ himself reached out to those on the other side, tax collectors and public sinners, and shared meals with them. Christ came to call all people, not just those of one ethnic group or one religious group. Even as he did this, the Lord maintained Truth and even gave his life for it. Secular society's solution that everyone should be free to devise their own truth is not in the Scriptures.

So the Catholic Church - different from other religious denominations because it alone holds the fullness of revelation - continues to proclaim the Truth but with less suspicion. It works with other religions in areas of agreement. It tries to respect people even as it disagrees with them. The Vatican's International Theological Commission wrote a document about the sense of the faithful (*sensus fidei*), a way of knowing the Faith, and the commission noted: "a certain type of *sensus fidei* can exist in 'the baptised who are honoured by the name of Christian, but who do not however profess the Catholic faith in its entirety'. The Catholic Church therefore needs to be attentive to what the Spirit may be saying to her by means of believers in the churches and ecclesial communities not fully in communion with her (#56)."

This weekend's second reading echoes this admission that some things are held in common. "Brothers and sisters: There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord.... But one and the same Spirit produces all of these...." Use the gifts of the Spirit to know the truth of the Spirit.

Algunos católicos nuevos en Utah experimentan algunas sorpresas. Las iglesias en cada esquina no son católicas y las escuelas católicas son pocas y están muy alejadas entre sí. Los recursos de nuestra diócesis no son los recursos que tienen otras diócesis. Hace varios años, alguien nuevo en el estado se sorprendió al saber que las parroquias que planeaban expansiones de edificios tenían que recaudar el 60% del costo de la expansión antes de pedir dinero prestado de la diócesis. La diócesis no tiene dinero extra aunque la expansión de una parroquia sea vital.

A veces ser minoría es una molestia y de vez en cuando la molestia se convierte en resentimiento contra la mayoría, en este caso los mormones. El resentimiento es normalmente de corta duración. Al igual que cualquier otro grupo, la comunidad mormona incluye personas que son agresivas y personas que son agradables. La comprensión crece y la paz se restaura. Algo similar sucede en la teología. Hace años y años se defendieron vigilantemente las líneas entre una denominación y otra. Proclamar la verdad era una obligación solemne y esto significó que los del otro lado eran sospechosos. Sin embargo, cuanta más verdad se consideró, más otros hechos salieron a la luz. La mayoría de los libros de la Biblia son compartidos entre las diversas denominaciones cristianas. La Ley y los Profetas del Antiguo Testamento son sagrados para los judíos. Los códigos morales no se superponen completamente, pero sí se superponen. Cristo mismo se acercó a los del otro lado, recaudadores de impuestos y pecadores públicos, y compartió comidas con ellos. Cristo vino a llamar a todas las personas, no sólo a las de un grupo étnico o un grupo religioso. Al hacer esto, el Señor mantuvo la Verdad y dio su vida por ella. La solución de la sociedad secular de que todos deben ser libres de idear su propia verdad no está en las Escrituras.

La Iglesia Católica, diferente de otras denominaciones religiosas porque es la única que tiene la plenitud de la revelación, continúa proclamando la Verdad, pero con menos sospecha sobre el otro lado. Trabaja con otros grupos religiosos en áreas de acuerdo. Trata de respetar a la gente aunque no esté de acuerdo con ella. La Comisión Teológica Internacional del Vaticano escribió un documento sobre el sentido de los fieles (*sensus fidei*), una forma de conocer la fe, y la comisión señaló: "algún tipo de sentido de la fe puede existir en 'los bautizados que llevan el nombre de cristianos sin profesar la fe todavía completamente'. Por lo tanto, la Iglesia Católica debe estar atenta a lo que el Espíritu puede decir a través de los creyentes en las iglesias y comunidades eclesiales que no están plenamente en comunión con ella (#56)".

La segunda lectura de este fin de semana se hace eco de esta admisión de que algunas cosas se tienen en común. "Hermanos: Hay diversidad de dones, pero un mismo Espíritu; hay diversidades de servicios, pero un mismo Señor.... En cada uno se manifiesta el Espíritu para el bien común". Usa los dones del Espíritu para conocer la verdad del Espíritu.



How?



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THE 2023 BISHOPS SYNOD AND OUR PARISH, PART THREE (More on the details of listening sessions and why a synod on synodality)

In 2023 bishops representing clusters of areas within the Church will meet to discuss the topic of synodality. This is an umbrella term for the themes of Church unity, participation within the Church, and evangelizing both within the Church and outside of the Church. In themselves unity, participation, and evangelization are broad concepts, and so to help narrow the focus a bit the Vatican has released 11 categories of questions to guide parish listening groups. Results of the listening groups will then be reported to the diocese and forwarded to Rome. These listening groups are the main way in which we participate in the synod.

Last week's article talked about the spirit of participation in these listening sessions and the working details of these sessions. The role of a meeting facilitator was mentioned last week, and along with the facilitator a note-taker will

be present. One or both of these people will greet participants when they arrive and invite them to fill out an anonymous demographic information card. The role of the note-taker is to record the main ideas, points, and sentiments of listening session participants. This record is not a summary of the majority position but rather includes all the responses to the topic questions offered in the listening session. Note-takers will respect the wishes of those wishing to remain anonymous. After the listening session, note-takers will submit the demographic information cards and complete an online submission form using the main ideas, points, and sentiments raised during the session. All of this information goes to the diocese. An image of the demographic information card accompanies this paragraph.

The number of listening sessions varies from place to place and the plan is to have these sessions in both English and Spanish. Listening sessions may be on Zoom, it's possible to include information from family and friends in listening sessions, and people may send me responses to specific questions covered in listening sessions. Ideally the same participants will continue for all the listening sessions held in a particular language, but these does not preclude people coming for some and not all the sessions. The pastor normally attends listening sessions.

Some parishioners have wondered why synodality is the topic of the upcoming synod. After all, there are more pressing issues to discuss. I've heard everything from women priests to establishing procedures to deny pro-abortion politicians Holy Communion. As important as these issues may be, the importance of unity in the Church and evangelization cannot be overlooked particularly in times when factions are on the rise in society and in the Church itself. Each faction prefers to socialize within itself while mistrust of other factions grows. Part of evangelization is overcoming indifference and the barriers it feeds. Part of synodality is overcoming indifference and the barriers it feeds within the Church so as to live out the unity and communion of the Body of Christ. The new evangelization overlaps with synodality. The tools used in the listening sessions, those of dialogue and respect in search of truth, are also tools of both evangelization and synodality. How can we evangelize if we dislike the discomfort of dealing with people with other opinions? How can we be a unified Church if we dislike the discomfort of dealing with the pieties of others? There's more to evangelizing than insisting that I am right and so the person listening to me had better really listen to me. There's more to forming the Body of Christ in the Church than insisting that my sense of the Church is the only sense of the Church and so the person listening to me had better follow my example. Is listening to others an admission that they are right and that they have more truth than I do? Wouldn't it be easier just to let everyone believe what they want to believe? It takes practice in dialogue to discover that maintaining truth is not at odds with listening to people with different opinions. Jesus witnessed to the truth and listened when he ate with sinners and when he helped his disciples grow in the Faith. In many ways the tools of synodality and evangelization are central to resolving some of the other important issues in the Church.



Next weekend's article about the 2023 synod of bishops will take up some of the doubts and concerns about listening sessions.

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


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
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
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
