From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

Father Manion and the one religious brother and two religious sisters had been chosen for extermination. One of their captors indicated to them how they were to die: he made a slicing motion across his throat.

The destroyer pulled away from shore. Some weeks after the destroyer steamed out to sea, rumors began to drift back of the fate that had befallen the missionaries. But there were conflicting reports and there was still hope Father Manion and his companions had somehow survived. At the end of the war, when no trace of the missionaries appeared in any of the Japanese camps, the conviction grew that the destroyer bearing the 38 missionaries was sunk off Rabaul by a U.S. plane or submarine. But there were quite reliable accounts that the ship's captain received orders from headquarters to clear the Akisaki's decks of all enemy aliens. Missionaries and other civilians were lined up at the ship's stern and bound with ropes to the rail. Japanese soldiers took aim with rifles and machine guns. Orders were barked and guns rattled. Bodies fell and one by one the slain, it was reported, were hurled overboard in the churning wake of the ship.

Most biographies end with death. But not always. The life of Christ begins really with His death. The life of His Mystical Body spread like wildfire after his life's work was done. May it be so for Father Manion and his companions as well.

The price of souls on the Cross was blood. The price of Christianity's spread was the blood of the martyrs. The price of Uganda's conversion was blood. The price of New Guinea's glorious rebirth in Christ may well have been paid by the blood of Father Manion and his bishop and other companions.

Grieved parents and loved ones who gave up one of their own need not mourn those bereft or robbed. In losing a son, daughter or sister, they have gained an army of brothers and sisters, born of God in the waters of baptism, a baptism in the death of heroes worthy of the name of missionaries.

Father Art Manion, pray for us. Father Tom Manion, pray for us. All brave missionaries of God, pray for us.
