It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

KENYA SCHOOL PROJECT

This past weekend, McDaid Elementary students Jack Condon and Oliwia Wiezorek spoke at all three Masses about a project that they and other McDaid and St. Patrick's High School students are undertaking. You might recall that a few years ago, these same NP Catholic Schools students, long with their classmates, did a project that many of you were asked to support. Dr. Kim Baxter, who is a local optometrist and member of St. Patrick's parish, was preparing to travel to Kenya to provide eye care and donated eyeglasses for the poor people of that country. Jack, Oliwia, and their fellow students asked many of you to help them raise money to purchase a new water pump for a children's school there, where half of the students are orphans. Thanks to your support, they raised enough money to purchase the water pump, as well as some mattresses and bedding for many other children from another orphanage.

Dr. Baxter will soon be traveling to that same impoverished area of western Kenya for another eye care mission. These students are again connecting with him for another very important project to help the kids there. This time, they are hoping to raise at least \$3,000 to replace the textbooks and school supplies for the children from another orphanage and school that burned to the ground last April.

If you would be willing to help them in this effort, Father Sagar has graciously encouraged us to insert our donation in an envelope and place it in the collection basket next weekend at Mass. Or you can drop off your donation any time (prior to Jan.17th, if possible) at McDaid Elementary or St. Patrick's High School. January 23 Latin America

St. Sebastian | January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 - 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.




