Notes from our Pastor:

On this the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we conclude the great Advent -Christmas cycle of the Church's liturgical year. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for the many cards and well wishes, cookies, soup, stew, and tamales, socks, even a Chief's scarf and all your thoughtfulness over the Christmas season. It meant a lot and made feel at home.

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord we renew our own baptismal promises. As I mentioned last Sunday, I will be blessing the baptismal font at the 5:30 Mass this Saturday. You will notice that we moved it to the entrance of the church, which is where the baptistery is traditionally found. One providential coincidence is that in the restoration of the church, a portion of the foundation was left exposed. I suggest you look at it to see the masonry of the stones. Likely taken from the farms and fields of our ancestors. Stones that hold up the church, and it is with good reason that the Church's foundation is made of living stones born of the font of baptism. You will also notice the statues placed in the baptism area. One is of the child Jesus held by Our Lady and the other by St. Anthony, the third is of John the Baptist. All are important images of our new life in baptism. In our celebrating the baptism of children, we see the Christ child and in adult baptism we hear the echo of John's call to conversion. The font itself has been part of our parish life for many years and symbolizes the generations of faith. Now as we enter the church we are reminded that our baptism in Christ is the source of our communion in Christ.

I am also pleased that our council of the Knights of Columbus will host the pilgrim Icon of St. Joseph from Sunday, January 9th for seven days. The church door near the office will be open from 8:00 am until 10:30 am for prayer and devotion. It is a blessing to renew our veneration of the earthly father of our Lord and universal "Patron of the Catholic Church."

May the New Year be rich in God's blessings for you all and for our parish.

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD



The Baptism of the Lord

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." —Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.



Question: At my grandson's Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. Why is this done? Is it something new?

Answer: When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers and this is symbolized by the white garment.




