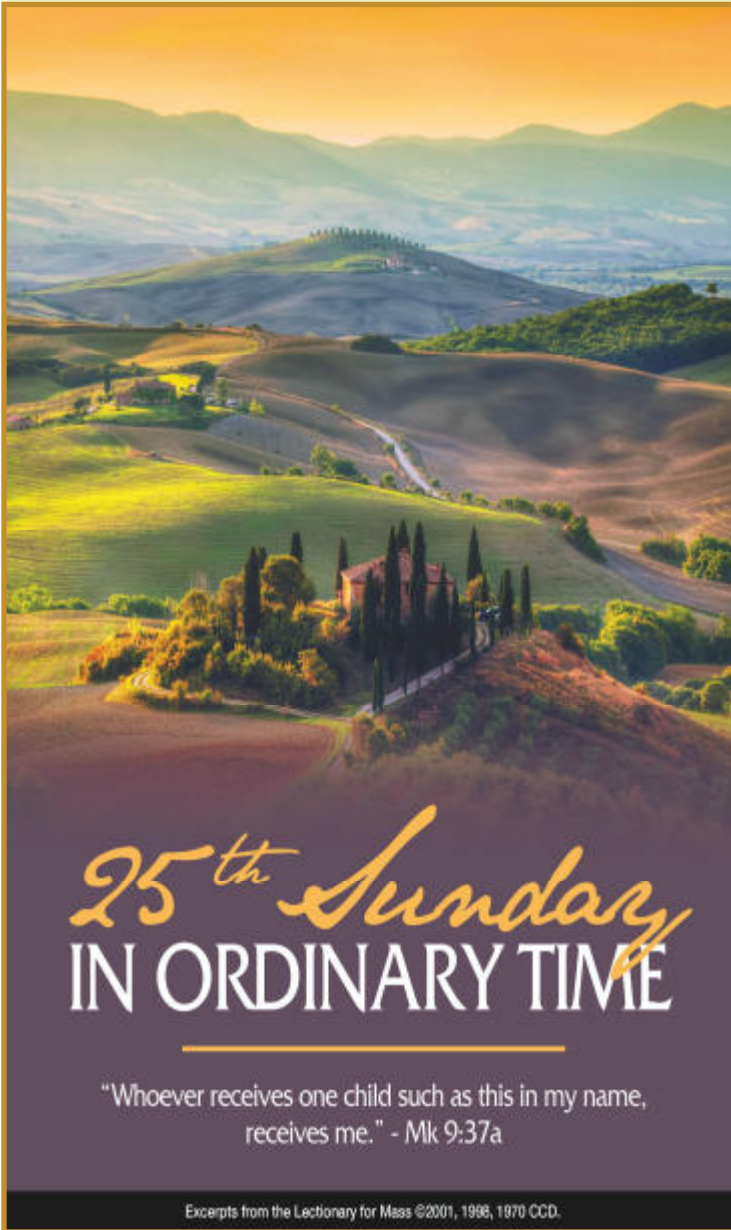

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. PATRICK DOLAN

Dear Friends:



The leaves are beginning to change colors. At least this is what I was taught growing up. But years later I began to realize that, while certainly a defensible statement, it might not actually reflect the deeper truth of what was happening every year during these months. It turns out that as many trees let go of their wealth of chlorophyll, the underlying color of their leaves (already present) is revealed. Certainly the color we see is changed. But only because the lush layer of green-supplying chemical is slowly decreasing and the under-layer is revealed.

Maybe this is why autumn is my favorite time of year. If it weren't for the fact that I'm very aware that it's leading into winter (my least favorite) I would consider it the perfect season! Spiritually I've always loved the season as well. While throughout the summer most of the trees maintain similar cloaked in their green shades of abundance, it is during this season that the broader variations on color reveal more easily the uniqueness of each tree.

Similarly, as our own lives go through season after season, we find that while well-being looks very similar for so many people, the unique inner strengths of each of us become more apparent in times of adversity. And so I have adopted a "spirituality of autumn" in my bag of life-practices. Any of us, when faced with the loss of life, the loss of health, the loss of friends, the loss of security or the loss of almost anything, have an opportunity to allow who we are underneath to come to the surface.

When we allow our struggles to be seen in the world as readily as we do our strengths, there are depths at which we are actually seen for the first time. The past 18 months have been a societal autumn, leading some into winter and even death. But it has also allowed many of us to see one another struggle, and while this does not allow us to look "our most competent," perhaps it does allow us to look our best.

In our Church's history, the age of martyrs gave rise to much richer theologies, spiritualities and mysticism than any "gospel of prosperity" ever could. So while we should never go looking for hardship, neither should we shy away from allowing others to see and know us when are in the midst of struggle.

As we enjoy the beauty of this season, I hope we allow others to see the beauty of our own autumn.

The new checker at our grocery store is WAY too cool for school. He works the night shift. The first (and last) time I went through his stand, he was chatting up the cute young lady ahead of me, and brazenly watching something on his phone while checking out customers.

Almost immediately he started adding up the groceries on the conveyor belt of the VERY NICE, twenty-something guy just behind me along with mine. We both stopped him at the same time.

"Oh," he said, "I thought she was your grandma or something." I glared at him. "You thought I was old enough to be HIS grandmother?" And the super nice guy jumped in and said, "I would LOVE for you to be my grandma." But even that undeserved kindness didn't stop me from stomping out. No matter. Super Cool Guy was back on his phone, my anger just a funny footnote to his boring night at work.

Now, here's the really stupid part. OF COURSE I'm old enough to be his grandmother. EASILY. But I'm sensitive about this because, up until a severe illness several years ago, I looked a bit younger than my age. And how ungrateful am I to be angry about looking my age, when I'm so, so lucky to be alive?

Where do the conflicts and divisions among you originate? Right there, in our unexamined and knee-jerk responses to perfectly normal conversation. By the time I got to my car I recognized where my VERY UNCHARACTERISTIC anger had come from, and I was ready to make peace.

THE HOLY MASS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Mass is the central liturgical rite in the Catholic Church, encompassing the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, where the bread and wine are consecrated and become the Body and Blood of Christ. As defined by the Church at the Council of Trent, in the Mass, "the same Christ who offered himself once in a bloody manner on the altar of the cross, is present and offered in an unbloody manner". The Church describes the Mass as the "source and summit of the Christian life". It teaches that the sacramental bread and wine, through consecration by an ordained priest, become the sacrificial body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ as the sacrifice on Calvary made truly present once again on the altar. The Catholic Church permits only baptized members in the state of grace to receive Christ in the Eucharist.

The 2022 Mass Book

We will begin taking Mass requests for 2022 in October. If you wish to request a Mass for a deceased loved one or a special event, please contact or visit the parish office. These are the guidelines:

1. You may schedule a total of 10 masses for 2022.
2. No more than 4 weekend Masses per year may be scheduled.
3. The offering for a Mass is \$10.
