A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. PATRICK DOLAN

Dear Friends:

Over the next few weeks I'm going to be talking a lot about ministries in the church, and how each of us can experience our faith at a different level, when our Catholicism moves beyond Sundays and begins to interact with our community on a regular basis. Like every parish, we have so many volunteer opportunities here at Holy Family.



Towards the end of October we're going to have a "ministry fair" after all of the masses. You will have the opportunity to see the various ways Holy Family reaches out to others and the rest of the world, and you may sign up to be part of these efforts.

In our present culture it is so easy for us to approach our faith as consumers rather than as community. Many people go to this church or that parish because they like the services they receive, rather than the service to which they are called. Every community has a wealth of unique talents, personalities and skills, each of which, if shared, could enrich the parish greatly.

So much has been written in recent times about the modern era, and the phobia surrounding commitment. Most of this deals with relationships of a personal nature, but I think the same dynamic is at work at the level of community and society. Because of the time commitment some people are reluctant to volunteer. The wonderful thing about volunteering for a parish is that it calls us out of *private time* into a space where we can meet others, accomplish things together, and build a new vision of our faith.

I love to see these efforts in a parish, not simply because great things are accomplished, but because more and more people get to experience coming to mass on a Sunday (or Saturday) and seeing people they know, and with whom they have worked side-by-side. For some this may actually be the first experience of a "faith community." Many of us have spent our lives walking into a church once a week and sitting with a group of strangers for sixty minutes before returning to our own life. That is an individual experience in a group setting.

I promise, if you volunteer to be part of one of the ministries here at Holy Family, you will have an entirely new experience of the mass.

I hope all of you will consider finding a place to spend a little of your time, and that by doing so, you will find yourselves sharing your lives with those with whom you share the Eucharist.

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

I've just finished Kristen Hannah's *The Four Winds*, and I don't know if I'll ever get the dust out of my mouth. I love a novel that is so compelling that you live in it, and see the world through it, every day that you're reading it, and for weeks afterward.

The Dust Bowl endured for nine long years, with the unrelenting series of misery caused by drought, dust storms, and poor farming practices overlapping with the ten years of the Great Depression. Millions descended upon the California fields, begging for work planting and harvesting.

The book follows its characters from the plains of Texas up to the San Joaquin Valley. Just when we think they are finally going to have enough to eat and drink, we encounter the merciless owners of the fields, who, recognizing that there are millions willing to work for less, begin withholding wages from the starved migrant workers.

That's where today's shocking reading from the Letter of James intersects. But this ugly business of employing workers for the fields, and then cheating them of their wages, goes back much earlier than that first century letter.

The book of Deuteronomy may be at least seven hundred years earlier. Look at 24: 15: "You shall give him his *wages* on his day before the sun sets, for he is poor and sets his heart on it."

How terrible to work hard, on an empty stomach, and receive no pay at the end of the day. The author of the letter of James railed against this malicious practice. *O God of the harvest, protect all workers who labor to bring food to our tables.* How can we follow the biblical mandate to ensure that workers receive just wages? **Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael's, Archangels:**



Angels—messengers from God—appear frequently in Scripture, but only Michael, Gabriel and Raphael are named. Michael appears in Daniel's vision as "the great prince" who defends Israel against its enemies; in the *Book of Revelation*, he leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil. Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion, rising in the East in the fourth century. The Church in the West began to observe a feast honoring Michael and the angels in the fifth century.

Gabriel also makes an appearance in Daniel's visions, announcing Michael's role in God's plan. His best-known appearance is an encounter with a young Jewish girl named Mary, who consents to bear the Messiah.



Raphael's activity is confined to the Old Testament story of Tobit. There he appears to guide Tobit's son Tobiah through a series of adventures which lead to a threefold happy ending: Tobiah's marriage to Sarah, the healing of Tobit's blindness, and the restoration of the family fortune.

The memorials of Gabriel and Raphael were added to the Roman calendar in 1921. The 1970 revision of the calendar joined their individual feasts to Michael's. Feast: Oct. 2

**THE HOLY MASS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH**

The Mass is the central liturgical rite in the Catholic Church, encompassing the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, where the bread and wine are consecrated and become the Body and Blood of Christ. As defined by the Church at the Council of Trent, in the Mass, "the same Christ who offered himself once in a bloody manner on the altar of the cross, is present and offered in an unbloody manner". The Church describes the Mass as the "source and summit of the Christian life". It teaches that the sacramental bread and wine, through consecration by an ordained priest, become the sacrificial body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ as the sacrifice on Calvary made truly present once again on the altar. The Catholic Church permits only baptized members in the state of grace to receive Christ in the Eucharist.

**The 2022 Mass Book**

We will begin taking Mass requests for 2022 in October. If you wish to request a Mass for a deceased loved one or a special event, please visit the parish office to schedule your Masses.

These are the guidelines:

1. You may only schedule a total of 10 masses for 2022.
2. No more than 4 weekend Masses per year may be scheduled.
3. The suggested offering for a Mass is \$10.
