

Anointing of the Sick

Who receives this Sacrament?

The Sacrament is NOT for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for them to receive this Sacrament has certainly arrived

(SC 73).

If a sick person who received this anointing recovers their health, they can in the case of another grave illness receive this Sacrament again. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same hold for elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced (CCC1515)

Walking with Moms In Need

At the beginning of March 2021, the Diocese of Phoenix joined the nationwide effort, **Walking with Moms In Need**: A Year of Service, from March 25, 2021 to March 25, 2022. Inspired by St. John Paul II's call to maximize our charitable efforts in building a culture of life, the intention of the Year of Service is to increase the Church's outreach and assistance to pregnant and parenting women in need.

After several meetings and in consultation with key parish leaders, the Walking with Moms Task Force discerned that one of the most practical ways to respond to mothers in need at St. Bernard of Clairvaux is by providing a ministry that creates a sense of family by formally recognizing babies on the way

and introducing mom and baby to our parish community.

We would like to provide a non-threatening way for relationship building. Participants may be ministered to by the team and develop a personal path forward in their own spiritual journey.

The ministry's ultimate goal is to accompany moms in need – offer spiritual resources, offer a Meal Train for the expectant mother, offer babysitting (if family is comfortable), direct them to other Diocesan approved counseling services, and most importantly, help them develop a deeper relationship with Christ. 

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Faithful Departed

Question:

How can we pray for the dead throughout the year?

Answer:

We commemorate the faithful departed on November 2^{nd} each year. However, we can and should continue to pray for the dead. Our growth in Christian perfection takes a long time. At the time of our death, many of us might not be saints yet. But God, in His mercy, allows for those who love Him to experience purification after death. Our word for that state is Purgatory. It's the antechamber of heaven, so to speak. We know we're getting in the house, but we're not quite ready to go all the way in. There's rain to shake off our coats and dirt that's clogging our shoes.

Here on earth, we can pray for the souls in Purgatory. One way is to request that your parish offer a Mass for the intention of a specific loved one. We can also remember the departed in our daily prayers. Just as we have special intentions for family and friends here on earth, we can pray for those who have died. It's also a good act of Christian charity to pray for the forgotten, those who have no one else to pray for them. God knows who they are! ©LPi



GOSPEL MEDITATION -January 16, 2022 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.
