


Dr. Gustavo will also join our Life Ten group and will join us for a "Family Night" with our Edge students, our RE students, and their families on Wednesday, February 2nd.




St. Vincent de Paul

Next weekend is a fifth Sunday where we normally devote the second collection to St. Vincent de Paul in our parish. Since there is no second collection, you can donate to St. Vincent de Paul by putting your special St. Vincent de Paul envelope or check made out to St. Vincent de Paul in the church baskets at the entrances/exits. The money you give supports people primarily living in our parish boundaries who are struggling to pay rent, buy groceries and gas, and pay for utility bills.

Also, on the last weekend there will be receptacles in the Church entrances/exits for the collection of personal-sized toiletry items for the homeless. The SVdP facilities in Phoenix, which provide showers and barber services, are in constant shortage of such items. Needed personal or travelsized items include: soap, shaving cream, disposable razors, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and hand sanitizers.

Walking with Moms In Need

At the beginning of March 2021, the Diocese of Phoenix joined the nationwide effort, Walking with Moms In Need: A Year of Service, from March 25, 2021 to March 25, 2022. Inspired by St. John Paul II's call to maximize our charitable efforts in building a culture of life, the intention of the Year of Service is to increase the Church's outreach and assistance to pregnant and parenting women in need.

After several meetings and in consultation with key parish leaders, the Walking with Moms Task Force discerned that one of the most practical ways to respond to mothers in need at St. Bernard of Clairvaux is by providing a ministry that creates a sense of family by formally recognizing babies on the way and introducing mom and baby to our parish community. We would like to provide a non-threatening way for relationship building. Participants may be ministered to by the team and develop a personal path forward in their own spiritual journey. The ministry's ultimate goal is to accompany moms in need – offer spiritual resources, offer a Meal Train for the expectant mother, offer babysitting (if family is comfortable), direct them to other Diocesan approved counseling services, and most importantly, help them develop a deeper relationship with Christ. 

PLANT YOUR WORKS IN THE WORD

One of the things about Scripture is that even the smallest word and shortest phrase can be critical to the overall message. When you take a quiet moment to rest with the Word, you find how quickly the most mundane sentence can reach out and grab you, pulling you into a deeper contemplation of some truth you hadn't even considered until then.

But we often fail to act as the Israelites in the Book of Nehemiah, standing before the Water Gate "listening attentively." Whether it's at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word or at home poring over the Bible, time after time we find ourselves less mindful than we could be. Our ears accept the sounds of the words and our eyes glance over the shape of the letters.

But are we mindful — truly?

The best answer is hopefully at least sometimes. There are always tasks to be completed, problems weighing on our minds that we can't quite give over to God. We lose ourselves in these things instead of in Scripture. We "clock in" with Bible reading instead of "diving in."

We can never forget that the words of the Lord are spirit and life. They are the soil that quickens the seed of all stewardship. There is no mindfulness, no prayer, no graciousness, no gratitude or accountability or sense of commitment unless there is the Word.

So let us pray today for mindfulness, that our every action will be grounded in the law of Goo — giving it true spirit and life.

IS IT RIGHT TO SUE SOMEONE? ISN'T IT A WAY OF GETTING REVENGE?


Revenge is inflicting harm for harm's sake, the idea of an eye for an eye, a tooth for a

In a perfect world, those with special needs, handicaps, or disabilities would find the help and care they need, including those who are injured or hurt. But justice is not always forthcoming, and people are not always fair. So, using the legal system

to right a wrong is sometimes the only option.

In some cases, it is the only way that people can get the help they need and deserve. However, frivolous lawsuits, or 'fishing for money' is not only unfair, but immoral as well. The law is there to protect people and making use of it when necessary is a good thing.
