

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and under-standing our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.



ST. FRANCIS DE SALES FEAST DAY: January 24

Born in France in 1567, Francis was a patient man. He knew for thirteen years that he had a vocation to the priesthood before he did anything about it. After studying for years in Paris and in Padua he still kept quiet, but he studied theology and practiced mental prayer while getting into swordfights and going to parties. He had been waiting for God's will to be clear. Perhaps he was wise to wait, for he wasn't a natural pastor. His preaching left listeners thinking he was making fun of them. Others reported that he was conceited and controlling. But by the end of his life he had converted 40,000 Swiss citizens to Catholicism, was named bishop of Geneva, was spiritual director to another saint (St. Jane de Chantal), and became a Doctor of the Church with his many tracts and books on living out the faith. His patience and work ethic testified to his belief that anyone could become holy. He said, "By turning your eyes on God in meditation, your whole soul will be filled with God. Begin all your prayers in the presence of God." For busy people of the world, he advised: "Retire at various times into the solitude of your own heart, even while outwardly engaged in discussions or transactions with others and talk to God." The test of prayer was a person's actions: "To be an angel in prayer and a beast in one's relations with people is to go lame on both legs." He died on December 28, 1622, after giving a nun his last word of advice: "Humility." He is the patron saint of journalists because of the written works he left us.
