- **Who is Jesus?**

- **What is a Gospel?**
 - “Life” of Christ
 - Varying portraits of Jesus with different emphases
 - “Synoptics” and John
- **Follow-up from OT (starting NT with Matthew)**
 - Cultures: Semitic, Hellenic, Roman
 - Hebrew to Greek (Alexander the Great)
- **Composition of Gospels (DV 7-8, 17-19, 24; CCC 51-53, 65-67, 74-79, 124-127)**
 - DV 19
 - Words and works of Jesus (years 1-30)
 - Apostolic preaching (years 30-60)
 - Controversies with Jews
 - Think synagogues, St. Justin (+165)
 - Apostolic mission
 - Catechesis in the Church
 - Redaction of Gospels (60-90 AD)
 - All written for Christians
 - Place
 - Matthew in Palestine
 - Mark in Rome

 - Don't forget Catholic biblical interpretation (author's intent, HS and author, genre, canon, analogy of faith)
 - ≠ fundamentalism!
- **Content of Gospels: kerygma (1 Cor. 15:1-4,14, 17)**
 - Acts 10: 37-43 show principle characteristics of Gospels
 - Talk about what Jesus did “in Judea and Jerusalem, beginning in Galilee” (place) “after the Baptism of John” (time)
 - What happened: Anointing of Jesus at His baptism, public activity, (healing and doing good), death, resurrection, and preaching of apostles
 - Beginning, Prep for public ministry, public ministry, turn toward Jerusalem, Jerusalem, Paschal Mystery

 - Ratzinger, Jesus of Nazareth I, Foreword

What saved the blind man named Bartimeus?

On the way home from Mass today

Jesus healed Bartimeus through his faith. Bartimeus believed that Jesus could heal him, and so he did. Jesus told him his faith had saved him. It was more important for him to be healed of sin than to be healed from blindness, but his physical healing showed the inner healing that had taken place. This gives a lot of hope that Jesus will forgive us and save us.

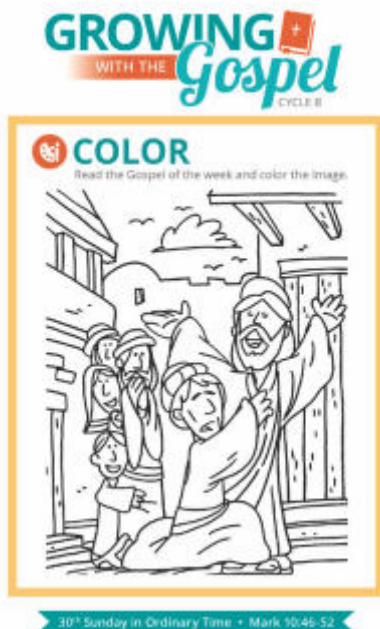
What is the greatest commandment?

Catechism

Q.469. What kind of virtues are Faith, Hope and Charity? Faith, Hope and Charity are called infused theological virtues to distinguish them from the four moral virtues -- Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance.

Q.470. Why do we say the three theological virtues are infused and the four moral virtues acquired? We say the three theological virtues are infused; that is, poured into our souls, because they are strictly gifts of God and do not depend upon our efforts to obtain them, while the four moral virtues -- Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance -- though also gifts of God, may, as natural virtues, be acquired by our own efforts.

Q.471. Why do we believe God, hope in Him, and love him? We believe God and hope in Him because He is infinitely true and cannot deceive us. We love him because He is infinitely good and beautiful and worthy of all love.
