SOCIAL JUSTICE PROGRAMS

On October 12, the Israel Committee met with Social Justice committee member Lisa Rhode, who facilitated an “Israel/Palestine Sharing Circle.” This is intended to pick up the thread from past years’ program of “TBS Compassionate Listening Dialogues.” This Sharing Circle was the second in a series which will be offered to other groups in the near future. In this type of Sharing Circle, there is no right or wrong. The only rule that applies is that we must all listen respectfully and without interruption. We each spoke about our backgrounds related to Israel and Judaism, which informed our knowledge of and feelings toward the state of Israel and its relationship to the Palestinian people. We hope this process will facilitate the beginning of respectful, non-divisive conversation on this important and challenging topic.

We need to be thoughtful about how we engage with those in--or visiting--our community who may be different from ourselves in one or many of the ways listed above and likely numerous others I neglected to mention. We should make an effort in every interaction to meet people where they are, to see people for who they are, and to honor people for all the gifts they bring in whatever capacity they are able to bring them.

We hope to offer some workshops in the coming months about recognizing the ways in which we might unintentionally "other" people and as a result, make them feel uncomfortable or even unwelcome in our spaces.

I want to offer two huge, juicy, "THANK YOUS" to some folks who have done some extraordinary work over the last few weeks.

We owe a huge debt of gratitude to Robin Roffer, Chair of the Marketing Committee, and her partners in crime, Brenda Linker and Frank Wechsler for not only working on the new TBS logo and "Come As You Are" tagline, but for the gorgeous and sleek brand new TBS website. All their work was volunteer, and we are so lucky to have them in our community!

Another giant THANK YOU goes out to Paula Gorman, our TBS Preschool Director. RABBI NEIL'S MESSAGE

Shining Light Together



The real Chanukah narrative (not the mythological fable we tell the kids) is of differing Jews fighting each other, put loosely into two camps of traditionalists /zealots and assimilationists. The first Jew to die does so at the hand of another Jew when Mattathias kills an assimilating priest in I Maccabees 2:24. Even though this murderous act allowed Judaism as we know it to survive, it still demonstrates how terrible a breakdown in intrafaith relationships can become.

On January 27th 2015, less than six months after I moved to Santa Fe, I sent an email to my Rabbinic colleagues in Santa Fe inviting them to my office for "a monthly meeting of all the active pulpit Santa Fe Rabbis to help share local information, plan together where appropriate, and generally remain in touch." At the initial meeting, those present told me that such cross-communal communication had never before happened at the Rabbinic level in Santa Fe, and we therefore enjoyed a moment of being able to transcend past differences for the good of all. We formed what became known as the Rabbis' Round Table because of the shape of the table in my office at the time (and possibly to also sound grandiose and mythical like Arthurian Knights!). We had no idea what the future might hold for us, but those present knew that collaboration, or at the very least communication, was the way forward.

Six years later, that collaboration and communication bore stunning fruit. After extensive deliberation, discussion and negotiation, HaMakom started

using our Upper Sanctuary for their Shabbat prayer services. During Succot, both we and they wanted to pray the Shabbat service in a Succah, so we agreed to share a Shabbat morning service for the first time since that community was founded nearly twenty years ago. Over forty people attended that service, and many present asked that we pray together more often.

It is my firm belief that we are stronger together and that we learn from those who practice Judaism differently. We don't know what the future holds, but what I do know is that communication and collaboration between Jewish communities helps us grow. This Chanukah, let us all be differing lights on the unifying Chanukiah of Jewish tradition... not blending each other, but each shining our own wondrous light in the darkness.

CANTOR LIANNA'S MESSAGE

The leaves have turned fiery gold and the air is getting crisper. Darkness falls a little earlier every day. As the daylight fades, it is almost time for us to kindle the light and warmth of the Chanukah candles.

Chanukah means “dedication” and refers to the rededication of the Second Temple in 164 BCE, after the Maccabees recaptured it from Antiochus. The original Chanukah story, recorded in the extra-biblical Book of Maccabees, is a triumphant return, a rebuilding of our holy spaces after a devastating loss.

We wish that we could have a full-scale triumphant return to our synagogue, to throw off our masks and embrace in hugs. But return is always slower, more staggered than we want it to be. Even the Maccabees had to build and recreate before they could worship in their temple again. We too are moving towards a slow rebuilding of our in-person community. While our religious school remains mostly online, our oldest, vaccinated students are meeting in person.

On October 1st, I led our first Tot Shabbat in quite a long time, outside in the Sukkah. Going forward, Tot Shabbat will meet on the first Shabbat of the month from 5:30 pm-6:00 pm, and on December 3rd, we will have a special Chanukah candle-lighting both during Tot Shabbat and during our regular services. Our Friday Night Live services, which were on hiatus over the High Holy Days, will be returning with

our amazing congregant band. On November 21st, we will be holding a Chanukah Bazaar, which is a fundraiser for the religious school, a market for Chanukah gifts made by members of our community, and an opportunity for us to be together and share in the joy of the glorious autumn season.

We are also taking the lessons we have learned from the accessibility of online programming forward. Some of our adult education programs, like adult Hebrew, are meeting in person, but continuing to meet online for other programs allows us to bring in far-flung speakers like Dr. Alan Molk, who spoke to us from the Phoenix area. We have more flexibility in scheduling committee meetings when we can meet via Zoom and no one has to block out additional time for driving.

To truly rebuild and rededicate requires us to move forward with creativity and open hearts. Temple Beth Shalom has been there for us in myriad ways, even in the locked-down depths of the pandemic. We are all navigating what it means to continue to show up for our TBS community as we work through this process of rededication. Every time we engage with the synagogue, either in-person or online, we each contribute a little more light. Our best answer to the darkness of the world is to give the gift of presence. So show up, in whatever way is meaningful to you, and bring your light.

Being Jewish in the Jewish State: The Challenges Facing Progressive Judaism in Israel

A conversation with Rabbi Josh Weinberg, Vice President of the URJ for Israel & Reform Zionism and Executive Director of ARZA



Israel's Rabbinate is an Orthodox institution that controls nearly all religious matters in the state.

Rabbi Josh Weinberg serves as the Vice President of the URJ for Israel, and Reform Zionism and is the Executive Director of ARZA, the Association of Reform Zionists of America. He was ordained from the HUC-JIR Israeli Rabbinic Program in Jerusalem and is currently living in New York.

Josh previously served as the Director of the Israel program for the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College and as a faculty member of NFTY-EIE High School in Israel teaching Jewish History. Josh is a reserve officer in the IDF spokesperson's unit, has hiked the Israel-trail, and came on Aliyah to Israel in 2003.

Originally from Chicago, he has a B.A. from University of Wisconsin in Hebrew Literature, Political Science and International Relations, and an M.A. at the Hebrew University in Jewish Education.

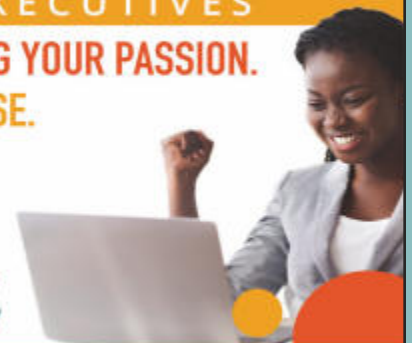
