CANTOR LIANNA'S MESSAGE

On Yom Hazikaron in 2017, I walked down the hill from my apartment in Jerusalem's Kiryat

Sh'muel neighborhood to a park below the Israel Museum. The word "Yizkor" - May God Remember-burned, casting a flickering light over a group of Israeli scouts as they solemnly read the names and stories of fallen soldiers. Twenty-four hours later, the park was teeming with joyful families barbecuing and children playing as they celebrated Yom HaAtzmaut, Israel's Independence Day.

Yom Hazikaron and Yom HaAtzmaut are considered to be the "Israeli High Holidays." They are deliberately back-to-back, transitioning from the sorrow of Memorial Day to the joy of Independence Day at sunset. This proximity reminds us that joy and sorrow are intertwined. It reminds us to lean into the complexity of multiple emotions.

This is a great metaphor for how we should relate to Israel in general. In his short story, "Free Fruit for Young Widows," Nathan Englander writes "that Israelis, in their nation of unfinished borders and unwritten constitution, were trapped in a gray space that was called 'real life.' In this gray space, even absolutes could maintain more than one position, reflect more than one truth."

If we are going to relate to Israel in an authentic way, we have to hold onto the "more than one truth," the both/and rather than the either/or. Israel is a tiny nation that is often under attack, which requires it to build military might, and the use of that military power for border checkpoints, midnight raids, and home demolitions is dehumanizing and endangers the lives and livelihoods of Palestinians. It is important that Israel exists as a place of in-gathering and safety for Jews, as demonstrated by the thousands of Ukrainians fleeing there, and that Israel can provide adequate support and welcome to non-Jewish refugees and asylum seekers from countries like Eritrea and Sudan.

Israel is a modern, high-tech democratic nation, and it suffers under a religious hegemony that prevents real progress in areas like religious freedom, women's rights, and queer rights. This barely scratches the surface of the deep complexity necessary to understand Israel in the gray space of real life.

There's a framework in Israeli education of "hugging and wrestling" with Israel. We can hold joy in the good things that Israel has accomplished, and sorrow in its failures. We wrestle with it because we love it and care about it and want it to be a better place.

This month of May will have a few opportunities for both hugging and wrestling. At 11 AM on Sunday, May 1st, the Santa Fe Jewish Film Festival will present "Image of Victory", about the Israeli War of Independence. At 1:30, I will present a Yom HaAtzmaut concert and the Israel Committee will provide refreshments. At 6:30 PM on Tuesday, May 17th, we will hold a screening and discussion around the Joint Israeli-Palestinian Memorial Day commemoration coordinated by Combatants for Peace and The Parents' Circle. I look forward to diving deep into the both/and with you at these programs.

Cantor Lianna's Easy Kid-Friendly Charoset

Recipe

I came up with this recipe while trying to make an accessible charoset for the preschool students to taste. One of the best things about it is that I just grated everything directly into my storage container, so it was pretty low fuss. Silan is an ingredient that I learned to love when I lived in Israel, and I was very inspired when I saw it at Trader Joe's. Charoset symbolizes the mortar that the Israelite slaves used to build in Egypt. Many recipes contain nuts, and have a thicker texture than this one which is only fruit, but the dates add some body and stickiness to make it more like mortar. In Gibraltar, there is a tradition of adding a little brick dust to make the symbolism even more real!

Ingredients:

- 4 medium apples
- 1 navel orange
- 3/4 cup whole dates
- 2 tablespoons silan (date syrup) or other liquid sweetener

Grate the apples. No need to peel them!

Zest the entire orange directly into the grated apple.

Squeeze half of the orange into the apple mixture.

Peel the white pith off of the remaining half of the orange and chop into small pieces.

Remove pits from the dates and finely chop.

Add date syrup and chopped orange and dates into the apple mixture. Stir, taste, and add more silan if necessary.

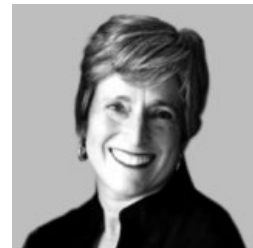
Also, huge thank you to the staff and the committees and their committee members who continue to keep this synagogue open and thriving. As they say, it takes a village.



Social Justice at Work at TBS

The SJC has been busily involved with a number of issues during the past months.

On March 27th, we held our first in person meeting in over two years and it was a wonderful afternoon of reconnecting with old friends and welcoming new members. We also wrote postcards to voters in Georgia encouraging those constituents to vote!

Several members from HaMakom joined us and we hope to have more collaboration together on social justice issues as we move forward.

SJC continues to be involved with preparing to receive an Afghan family through Lutheran Family Services. While we are waiting, several team members are now helping out with the Najib and Hashimi families by offering transportation to various activities. These families are also in Santa Fe through the services of LFS.

Our involvement with Pete's Place community shelter continues and we have recently completed our Easter week coverage. Looking ahead, we are

organizing an "on call" team to fill in when there are gaps in the schedule to bring food or to serve. If you would like to be included on this team, please contact Emily Kahn-Freedman at 505-469-3254.

The Social Justice Committee has an ongoing book group on Racial Justice/anti-racism that meets one Monday night per month. We are a committed, welcoming group meeting on Zoom and are open to new members interested in learning and growing together. Thursday, May 10th at 6:00 pm: *What You Can Do Today to Prevent Gun Violence.*

Gun violence is a leading cause of premature death in the U.S., killing over 39,000 people a year and injuring over 100,000 more. Gun Violence is both predictable and preventable. It is a multi-faceted problem that demands a multi-pronged, comprehensive, public health approach to guard and improve the safety of our communities.

In New Mexico, it is having devastating impact on our communities and families. New Mexico has the 4th highest age-adjusted fatality rate in the US. Tragically, on average, 1 New Mexico resident dies by firearm every day and we lose 2 children to gun violence each month. In 2019, firearms accounted for 354 emergency room visits, 223 hospitalizations, and 472 deaths. The annual cost of firearm-related injuries and deaths in New Mexico is estimated to be \$1.8 billion. People of Color and Indigenous populations are disproportionately impacted by this gun violence epidemic.

Please join New Mexicans to Prevent Gun Violence for a presentation on the issue of gun violence in New Mexico and learn about what they are doing to prevent it.

BRENDA'S FAVORITE SHAVUOT CHEESECAKE RECIPE

Shavuot commemorates receiving the Torah. It's tradition in many communities to eat dairy, like cheesecake and blintzes to celebrate the holiday. It reminds us of the abundance of a land flowing with milk and honey. It also serves as a reminder of the laws, because when the Torah was first given, people didn't have any kosher meat so they ate dairy instead. I love to make this easy cheesecake recipe all year long, but enjoy it even more on Shavuot.

Dinah Shore's Famous Cheesecake Recipe

CRUST:

1 3/4 c. graham cracker crumbs
1/4 c. nuts (opt.)
1/2 c. melted butter

FILLING:

2 (8 oz.) packages of Philadelphia cream cheese
3 eggs
1 c. sugar
2 tsp. vanilla
3 c. sour cream

Mix crust ingredients. Remove 3 tablespoons for topping.
Press remaining on bottom and up sides of 9" spring form pan.
Combine eggs, cheese, sugar and vanilla. Beat until smooth. Blend in sour cream.

Pour into crust. Top with reserved crumbs. Bake at 375 degrees for 1 hour.
Chill 4 to 5 hours before serving. Top with fresh strawberries or cherry pie filling. (Optional).
