

Mountain Top Experience with Jesus

During Transfiguration, Jesus received this divine manifestation as the confirmation that He is the beloved Son of God and He is here to accomplish His mission through His Passion.



God the Father wanted to communicate

to the first disciples on the mountain. First, we learn who Christ is: God's beloved Son.

Second, we hear the Father's only imperative in the New Testament, to listen to Jesus and believe in Him and in everything He said and taught.

Third, we discover the meaning of Jesus' suffering and death; like the Israelites followed Moses through the Red Sea that first exodus, we are called to follow Jesus, the Way, all the way to the eternal Promised Land.

Lastly, Jesus was also given a foretaste of resurrection. The transfiguration happened when Jesus was in prayer. Some of the saints write and speak about their prayer experiences and they would be surrounded with light and some saints felt that they were lifted up in their prayer experience.

Some received consolation, some received messages and some received faith and strength. We all need to have some transfiguration moments in our own spiritual journey which will help us to walk in faith and hope.

All may not receive spectacular moments, experiences and events happening in their prayer life.

But that does not mean God is not listening to our humble prayers. We pray because we want to feel the presence of the Lord in our lives.

In a recent devotion titled *Enslaving Consumerism*, Sr. Joyce Rupp, O.S.M. used the enslavement of the Israelites in Egypt as a metaphor for her own spiritual journey. Although vowing to live simply, she feels the pull of our culture when she hears others talking about the money they saved on a purchase. Or sees an ad luring her into thinking she needs an item she doesn't need. Or that she really should buy something newer or better than she now has. Sr. Joyce recognizes that when she releases herself from this sly trap, she instead sees how countless people have so few material possessions when she has more than enough. And then she feels called to save her money, not on purchases, but so she can contribute it wisely for others' benefit.

Pope Francis tells us that our constant demand for growth and endless consumption have resulted in the Earth "groaning" to keep up. And he urges us to strive to be more spiritually detached from what we possess. In solidarity with Pope Francis and Sr. Joyce, let's free ourselves to hear the cry of the poor and the cry of the Earth...and be grateful.
