



Did you know that you can recycle way more than just your plastic grocery bags at your grocery store? Most curbside recycling programs don't accept plastic bags, film, and wrap, but most grocery stores do. In fact, in the Prescott area, there are 22 stores that do, like Fry's, Safeway, Walmart, even Target! Store drop-off programs have been the primary means of recovering clean and dry film and wrap for over 20 years. These materials, specifically polyethylene, are highly engineered and have value. Retailers consolidate the material with other films like pallet wrap at their distribution centers, then sell it to companies making products like composite lumber for making decks, benches, and playground sets.

You can recycle bread bags, ziplock bags, newspaper sleeves, cereal box liners, dry cleaning bags, bubble wrap, produce bags, wrap around paper towels and diapers, salt bags, ice bags, shipping envelopes and bubble mailers, and so much more. The list seems endless! Not only will you help reduce litter and lessen the amount of waste going to the landfill, you'll also be giving a valuable resource a second life! I will be collecting clothes, blankets, towels and toiletries and those items can be dropped off at the church office and I will pick them up from there.


On the day of our supper club we can use any kind of food items hot or cold and they can be dropped off anytime after 12:00pm.

Eucharistic Adoration Can Transform Our Church

Each year on the first Sunday after Pentecost we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, also known as Trinity Sunday. Although it wasn't until 1334 that Pope John XXII officially established the feast for universal observance in the Western Church, the mystery of the Holy Trinity has been the pulse of the Church's life since the very beginning. The Trinity is "the central mystery of Christian faith and life...[and is] the source of all the other mysteries of faith" (CCC 234). The whole of the Church's life flows from the central belief that the one true God exists as three divine Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Since the very beginning of time, God has gradually revealed and communicated the truth of who he is as Trinitarian through what he has done in salvation history (see CCC 53-67). Although God gradually revealed himself throughout different stages of the Old Testament period of salvation history, mankind had no way of knowing the full truth of God's inner life of the Trinity before the time of Christ, since this mystery of our faith is "inaccessible to human reason alone...before the Incarnation of God's Son and the sending of the Holy Spirit" (CCC 237).

In his encyclical <u>Spe Salvi</u>, Pope Benedict XVI poses a challenging question: "So now we must ask explicitly: is the Christian faith also for us today a life-changing and life-sustaining hope...which shapes our life in a new way, or is it just 'information'" (<u>Spe Salvi 10</u>) that doesn't change us? Furthermore, what difference does this central mystery of our faith make in our daily lives?

Trinity Sunday is an invitation to remember that "[being] Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction" (<u>Deus Caritas Est 1</u>). In revealing himself as Trinitarian, God hasn't merely shared impersonal facts *about* himself; rather, God has shared *himself* with us, and has invited us into his own inner life and communion of love, which alone is the origin, goal, and meaning of our life. As we read in the Catechism, "By sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed his innermost secret: God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange" (<u>CCC 221</u>). On Trinity Sunday, the Church proclaims the truth about God—that God is love (<u>1 John 4:8</u>)—and the truth about us: we are made for this

love. We eternally belong to God—we have an eternal home!

St. Elizabeth of the Trinity leads us more deeply into this reality by saying that "The Trinity—this is our dwelling, our 'home,' the Father's house that we must never leave." When speaking with his disciples before his Passion, Jesus directed the gaze of their hearts towards this truth: "In my Father's house there are many rooms...and when I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:2-3). Jesus continued to reveal more of the Father's loving plan: "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you...If a man loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him" (John 14:18, 23). Jesus reveals to his disciples the Father's breathtaking desire. He desires not only that we be at home in him when we get to heaven in the future, but he desires us to be at home in him now—and so, he comes to us, he makes his home among us (c.f., John 1:14) in order to make his home *in* us. Thus, with the Feast of Pentecost and the sending of the Holy Spirit, God fulfills his promise to never leave us orphans. This is why the Church celebrates Trinity Sunday the week after Pentecost: On Pentecost, "the Holy Trinity is fully revealed" (CCC 732).

"I will not leave you orphans!" If Jesus has promised to never leave us orphans, then that means we have a permanent home—we eternally belong to the Father as children of his heavenly household! This is the mystery into which the Church invites us more deeply on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Yet this truth is also the very gift that that we are invited to share with all whom God entrusts to us in our daily lives: "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12). Every human heart longs for its eternal home. Today, we invite the Trinity to be more at home in our hearts in order to make them a more welcoming home for others—that through our smile, our gentleness, our availability of heart, everyone whom the Father entrusts to us may experience the Love that is their eternal home.

Question for Reflection: Today, will we allow our hearts to be touched and changed by the reality into which Trinity Sunday invites us more deeply?

Perpetual Adoration, the closest thing to walking with Jesus

It is a deeply personal type of prayer many saints recommend.

The term sounds rather strange and archaic, but "Perpetual Adoration" refers to one of the greatest gifts God has given humanity.

What is Perpetual Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is a deeply personal method of prayer that many saints have recommended over the past few centuries. It consists of visiting a church or small chapel to adore Jesus Christ, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. As Catholics, we believe that "The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the Consecration at Mass, and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist" (CCC 1377).

This means that as long as the Sacred Host is intact and possesses the physical properties of bread, the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, body, blood, soul and divinity, remain.

On account of this reality, the Church started using a *tabernacle* (typically a gold box) as a way to protect any consecrated hosts not consumed at Mass.

There arose in popularity during the 15th century a practice that placed a host not in the tabernacle, but in a gold receptacle called a "*monstrance*." This device put the host on display in a clear piece of glass, surrounded by gold. Instead of being hidden away in the tabernacle, a host in the monstrance could be clearly seen and venerated by all.

The purpose of this practice centered on the desire of Christians to adore the King of kings in the Sacred Host. Adoration provided an opportunity for Christians to have a "face-to-face conversation" with God, truly present in the Eucharist.

Soon, there developed various religious orders and societies who took as their mission the Perpetual Adoration of Jesus in the Eucharist. They placed the monstrance on an altar and took turns adoring Our Lord around the clock, ensuring that a person was accompanying the Blessed Sacrament every hour of the day. This practice has been taken up by the laity in what are now called "Perpetual Adoration Chapels," greatly

supported by Saint John Paul II.

In his encyclical, Ecclesia de Eucharistia,
John Paul II exhorted pastors to, "encourage,
also by their personal witness, the practice of
Eucharistic adoration, and exposition of the
Blessed Sacrament in particular, as well as
prayer of adoration before Christ present
under the Eucharistic species." He further
said in an International Eucharistic Congress
in Seville, Spain "I hope that this form of
Perpetual Adoration, with permanent exposition
of the Blessed Sacrament, will continue into the

future. Specifically, I hope that the fruit of this Congress results in the establishment of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in all parishes and Christian communities throughout the world."

The practice of Eucharistic Adoration only makes sense in light of the Catholic understanding of the Eucharist as the Real Presence of Jesus. Catholics believe that Jesus is truly there, in a special way not found anywhere else in the world. It is as if we were walking next to Jesus when He was on this earth.

A short story in the life of Saint Teresa of Avila perfectly summarizes the reasoning behind Eucharistic Adoration. One day Saint Teresa heard someone say, "If only I had lived at the time of Jesus ... If only I had seen Jesus ... If only I had talked with Jesus." She responded, "But do we not have in the Eucharist the living, true and real Jesus present before us? Why look for more?"

With the availability of Perpetual Adoration, we can spend time — any time, any day — with Jesus.
