



Being Innocent and Shrewd in the World

"Trust in the Lord and do good| says Psalm 37:3. As disciples of Christ we are commissioned to continue the mission of our Lord Jesus Christ.



Jesus assured the disciples that if they were handed over to the authorities, they would

have what they needed. God's Spirit would speak through them. He also warned that the message they proclaimed would not bring peace but rather stir divisions within families.

How do these readings help us who are His ministers? These texts offer reassurance that God accompanies us. We need to use all our gifts and faith to be disciples of Christ.

Jesus cautions us that we need to be innocent like a dove and clever like a serpent. We should be innocent so that nobody will get a chance to point a finger at us to accuse us for our wrong-doings. If we are clean and pure, our moral power and state of grace will be high.

This will work as a shield for our protection and power to venture out. But being innocent and pure is not enough. We also need to be clever like the serpent. The serpent smells the danger and runs away and hides from critical situations. We should discern when to proclaim and how to proclaim the message. For all who minister the Lord experience His presence, guidance and protection in their lives.

Coming to Sacred Heart

Vatican International Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles

Why: Many Christians, including some Catholics, do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In fact this teaching is clearly supported by the Bible (see Jesus' promise of the Eucharist, Jn. 6; the institution narratives in Mt. 26: 26-28, Mk 14: 22-24, Lk 23:19-20; and warnings against abuse 1 Cor. 11: 27-29). Some believe the mystery but do not grasp its implications or its dynamic power to impact their daily lives. Eucharistic miracles are a gift from God that recall us to the deeper meaning of this mystery of our faith. Pope Saint John Paul II started his encyclical letter on the Eucharist, Ecclesia de Eucharistia, with the simple yet profound statement: "The Church draws her life from the Eucharist." Apart from Jesus, we can do nothing (John 15:5). So, whether it is an honest day's work, playing with the kids at the park, leading family prayer, visiting the sick, feeding the poor, teaching RCIA, or rescuing babies from abortion, it is all possible because of Jesus. It is this same Jesus who is present in the Eucharist. So, whether we realize it or not, the power of Jesus in the Eucharist enables us to live out our faith. The Catechism puts it this way: "the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith" (CCC 1327). In Ecclesia de Eucharistia, the Holy Father reminds us: "Every commitment to holiness, every activity aimed at carrying out the Church's mission, every work of pastoral planning, must draw the strength it needs from the Eucharistic mystery and in turn be directed to that mystery as its culmination. In the Eucharist we have Jesus, we have his redemptive sacrifice, we have his resurrection, we have the gift of the Holy Spirit, we have adoration, obedience and love of the Father. Were we to disregard the Eucharist, how could we overcome our own deficiency?" (#60) The importance of the Eucharist to our daily lives cannot be overstated. This exhibition can help reawaken or deepen our Eucharistic faith, draw us into a more intimate relationship with Jesus, and bring about a renewed commitment to, and enthusiasm and fervor to live our Christian faith more dynamically as individuals and as a parish.

THE STORY OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

All three Synoptic Gospels tell the story of the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1-8; Mark 9:2-9; Luke 9:28-36). With remarkable agreement, all three place the event shortly after Peter's confession of faith that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' first prediction of his passion and death. Peter's eagerness to erect tents or booths on the spot suggests it occurred during the week-long Jewish Feast of Booths in the fall.

According to Scripture scholars, in spite of the texts' agreement it is difficult to reconstruct the disciples' experience, because the Gospels draw heavily on Old Testament descriptions of the Sinai encounter with God, and prophetic visions of the Son of Man. Certainly Peter, James, and John had a glimpse of Jesus' divinity strong enough to strike fear into their hearts. Such an experience defies description, so they drew on familiar religious language to describe it. And certainly Jesus warned them that his glory and his suffering were to be inextricably connected—a theme John highlights throughout his Gospel.

Tradition names Mount Tabor as the site of the revelation. A church first raised there in the fourth century was dedicated on August 6. A feast in honor of the Transfiguration was celebrated in the Eastern Church from about that time. Western observance began in some localities about the eighth century.

On July 22, 1456, Crusaders defeated the Turks at Belgrade. News of the victory reached Rome on August 6, and Pope Callistus III placed the feast on the Roman calendar the following year.



Reflection

One of the Transfiguration accounts is read on the second Sunday of Lent each year, proclaiming Christ's divinity to the Elect and baptized alike. The Gospel for the first Sunday of Lent, by contrast, is the story of the temptation in the desert—affirmation of Jesus' humanity. The two distinct but inseparable natures of the Lord were a subject of much theological argument at the beginning of the Church's history; it remains hard for believers to grasp.
