

Claretian Missionaries, please see the timeline of their departure from Arizona

The Claretian Mission in Arizona - 1915-2024

The Claretian Missionaries have served the Church in Arizona for nearly 110 years. Throughout that time, about 90 Claretian priests and brothers have ministered in what is today the Diocese of Phoenix. In 1915 the Missionaries were given the care of Holy Family Church in Jerome (at that time a booming mining town and the third-largest city in Arizona), and of Sacred Heart Church in Prescott, which included outlying rural areas from Bagdad to Seligman, much of which could be reached only on horseback.

In the years that followed, the Claretians were invited to minister in Phoenix. They established Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in Phoenix (1924), St. Anthony's Parish in Phoenix (1943), Blessed Sacrament Parish in Tolleson (1953), and St. Catherine Laboure Parish in Chino Valley (2012).

In the mid-1960s, the Claretians introduced the Cursillo movement to the Diocese. When the facilities at Immaculate Heart of Mary became too small to accommodate the rapid growth of the movement, the Community transferred that ministry to the present location of Mt. Claret Retreat Center and continued this ministry until 1998, when the administration was turned over to the Diocese of Phoenix, which had purchased the property from the Claretians several years earlier. It has been estimated that half of the deacons ordained in that period of time found their vocation through the Cursillo experience.

Among the Claretians most remembered is Father Marcel Salinas, C.M.F., who served in the Diocese of Phoenix from 1957 until he died in 1997. He shared in introducing the Cursillo Movement to the Diocese and directed that ministry for fifteen years. He was later pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in Prescott and then Director of the Diaconate Formation Program until his death.

The cause for canonization of Father Aloysius Ellacuria, C.M.F., former pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish (1963-66), has been introduced through the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

The Claretians also cared for Immaculate Conception Parish in Yuma from 1915 until the late 1960s.

The Claretian personnel will leave St. Catherine Laboure on July 01, 2024, and Sacred Heart on August 01, 2024.

Walking Through the Mass – The Preface as Thanksgiving | By Fr. Luke Spannagel

Last week, we took a closer look at the opening dialogue of the **Preface**, and especially how it invites us to give thanks to God. As we said earlier, the word *Eucharist* means "thanksgiving." Charles Belmonte indicates that the preface is an appropriate beginning of the Eucharistic prayer, since it "is basically an act of thanksgiving in a literary form between prayer and hymn. It seeks to move the faithful to praise and joy" (*Understanding the Mass*, p. 128).

Thanksgiving for Every Day of the Year

For me as a priest, the Preface is one of my favorite parts of the Mass, especially when I take time to really pray through the phrases. The Preface is one of the variable parts of the Mass, where there are many options that can change from week to week. Our current Missal has about 50 regularly used Prefaces grouped together, including ones for Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Sundays of Ordinary Time, Feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Saints, Funerals, and some "Common" Prefaces that can be used on days where another specific Preface isn't called for. In addition to these, there are many more Prefaces in the Missal, including some specially designed for certain Eucharistic Prayers and those that are used on specific celebrations such as Christ the King or the Most Holy Trinity. There are even some special Prefaces for civic holidays, such as Thanksgiving or the Fourth of July in the United States. Each of these Prefaces will highlight special truths of a particular celebration or season of the year. Following the response of the people in the Preface dialogue, "It is right and just," I enjoy how the priest begins praying the Preface with, "It is truly right and just." We are encouraging each other in giving thanks. These words of the priest communicate, "Yes! Let us continue giving thanks—it is right and just!" I often will pray those words with emphasis, as we transition to the next part of the Preface that will high-light special truths for us.

Special Truths Proclaimed in the Preface

For example, Preface I of Advent says, "For he assumed at his first coming the lowliness of human flesh, and so fulfilled the design you formed long ago, and opened for us the way to eternal salvation, that, when he comes again in glory and majesty and all is at last made manifest, we who watch for that day may inherit the great promise in which now we dare to hope." As another example, in Preface I of the Most Holy Eucharist, we hear, "For he is the true and eternal Priest, who instituted the pattern of an everlasting sacrifice and was the first to offer himself as the saving Victim, commanding us to make this offering as his memorial. As we eat his flesh that was sacrificed for us, we are made strong, and, as we drink his Blood that was poured out for us, we are washed clean."

Since they are so good, and since we are in the Eucharistic Revival, here are the key phrases from Preface II of the Most Holy Eucharist, "For at the Last Supper with his Apostles, establishing for the ages to come the saving memorial of the Cross, he offered himself to you as the unblemished Lamb, the acceptable gift of perfect praise. Nourishing your faithful by this sacred mystery, you make them holy, so that the human race, bounded by one world, may be enlightened by one faith and united by one bond of charity. And so, we approach the table of this wondrous Sacrament, so that, bathed in the sweetness of your grace, we may pass over to the heavenly realities here foreshadowed."

No doubt, those are prayers packed with great truths! If we aren't attentive to this part of the Mass, we could really miss out on some great highlights that help ready our hearts for the ultimate prayer of thanksgiving—the Holy Eucharist—the perfect sacrifice of Jesus offered to the Father. If you haven't noticed the Preface in a while, I give you a challenge for the next time you are at Mass: see if you can notice any of the main themes of the Preface. It is a great summary of the celebration of the day, and a fitting preparation for the rest of the Eucharistic Prayer to come!
