This quote from *Laudate Deum*, Pope Francis' much anticipated follow up to his Encyclical, *Laudato Si*, stresses that change in our culture happens when we take steps to change our lifestyles. Fortunately, conserving water is easy, and taking small but thoughtful measures to reduce water consumption can make a big difference over time. Think shorter showers, using a broom instead of the hose to clean the drive, and waiting to wash dishes or clothes until you have a full load. Personal lifestyle changes contribute to a cultural shift in the way we all view water, as a gift to be cherished and protected.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus: The "Devotion of Devotions"

Pius XI called devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus the "devotion of devotions," and "the summary of our religion." Almost eighty years later, Pope Benedict XVI said that this devotion "has an irreplaceable importance" for us and is "indispensable." It seems that now, more than ever, we need the graces that flow from the Heart of Jesus.

St. Paul wrote that "where sin increased, grace overflowed all the more" (Romans 5:20). We would have to be blind or naïve to not see how much sin has increased in our world. But what about grace? Will it overflow "all the more?" Only if we turn to the Sacred Heart, "the greatest human expression of divine love" (Pope Francis).

Before he became pope, Benedict XVI wrote a commentary on the message of Fatima. There he said: "since God Himself took a human heart and has thus steered human freedom towards what freedom towards what is good, the freedom to choose evil no longer has the last word."

When we live in union with the Heart of Jesus, we open ourselves up to grace, to the only power capable of changing the world by overcoming sin. We open ourselves up to the power of Jesus' death and resurrection. Referring to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the Heart that was most like the Sacred Heart, Pope Benedict said: "The Heart open to God, purified by contemplation of God, purified by contemplation of God, is stronger than guns and weapons of every kind."

Let us pray with faith:

Jesus and Mary, make my heart like Your Hearts.

May the grace and love that are in Your Hearts

*fill my heart to overflowing and touch the hearts of others,
overcoming sin in myself and in others.*

Walking Through the Mass – Transubstantiation | By Fr. Luke Spannagel

I often hear people ask why it is that, for so many priests, the Consecration is their favorite moment of the Mass. How exactly does the **Consecration** “work”?

Thanks for asking! Some years ago, I was in the midst of a large assignment by myself and was struggling with some health issues. I was working long days to try and cover all that was needed, but I felt myself regularly falling short. Around that time, I was gifted with a wonderful confession from one of our wise priests, who reminded me that the best and most important part of my day is always what happens at the altar. He said I could end the day with unfinished projects and unanswered messages, but if I prayed the Mass faithfully at the altar, then it will have been a great day. What great words of consolation! At the moment of the Consecration and the elevation that follows, I am always reassured that I am exactly where I am supposed to be: I am answering the call God gave to me to serve as a priest. As we all are, I am a work in progress, and some days feel like much more progress is needed. However, in that moment of the Mass, I am always comforted and strengthened, humbled and invigorated. Because I can be a perfectionist, I don’t always receive compliments well; because I have a quick mind, I’m often thinking of problems to solve and things that need to be done. But in that moment of the Mass is true rest and peace. If you are like me and often have a preoccupied mind, I invite you in that special moment of the Mass to enjoy resting in his peace. Remind yourself that there is no better place to be in that moment than united with Jesus truly present on the altar.

How the Consecration Effects Transubstantiation

How exactly does the Consecration work? Let’s turn to our *Catechism* for some helpful wisdom. “It is by the conversion of the bread and wine into Christ’s body and blood that Christ becomes present in this sacrament. The Church Fathers strongly affirmed the faith of the Church in the efficacy of the Word of Christ and of the action of the Holy Spirit to bring about this conversion. Thus St. John Chrysostom declares: ‘It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God’s. This is my body, he says. This word transforms the things offered’” (CCC, 1375). The *Catechism* tells us that the word of Jesus is what changes the bread and wine into his Body and Blood. The *Catechism* continues, “The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: ‘Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation’” (CCC, 1376). For many of us, *transubstantiation* can be a big and intimidating word. The reason we use words like these is that they help us describe with precision what we believe is true. Transubstantiation helps us know that the “what it is” is what changes during the Mass. As we said before regarding the gifts, what they are before the consecration is simple bread and wine. Those words of Jesus change the bread and wine into his Body and Blood. Even though the appearances remain, we believe that the whole Christ is present in the consecrated host and chalice. As our *Catechism* teaches, the reason we believe that Jesus is present is because Jesus said it. We believe him when he says: “This is my Body.” We believe him when he says “This is my Blood.” We believe that the Eucharist really is Jesus. The same Jesus who was born in Bethlehem, the same Jesus who offered himself on the Cross—Jesus is truly with us!

Seeing with Eyes of Faith

“But Father, the host still ‘looks’ the same!” some may say. St. Cyril of Jerusalem (314–386) teaches, “Do not think these are just plain bread and plain wine. They are the body and blood of Christ, as the Lord asserted. Faith must convince you of the latter even though your senses suggest to you the former. Do not judge about this according to your preferences but, based on your faith, believe with firmness and certainty that you have been made worthy of the body and blood of Christ” (*Understanding the Mass*, pp. 140–141). If your faith feels unsure, ask the Lord to help you see with the eyes of faith that he is truly there. Let the genuflections and reverence from your body help remind your mind of what we believe is true. Let the model of faith from the saints and the martyrs inspire you. Let our hearts be filled with joy after the consecration, and let us rejoice in recalling that Jesus is sacramentally present. Let us shout with joy the words of St. John, “It is the Lord!” (*John 21:7*).

Where does devotion to the Sacred Heart come from?

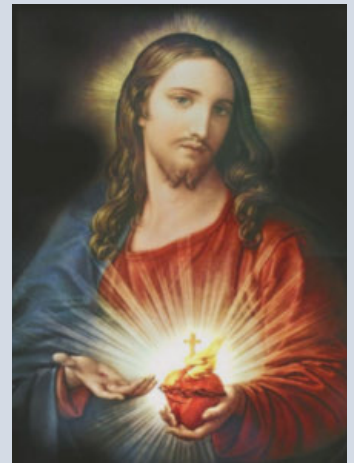
The story behind the modern iteration of the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus begins on Dec. 27, 1673, at a monastery belonging to the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary (Visitandines) in eastern France.

There, a nun named Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque began experiencing visions of the Sacred Heart. Those visions continued for 18 months.

During her visions, Sister Margaret Mary learned ways to venerate the Sacred Heart of Christ.

These devotions included the concept of a Holy Hour on Thursdays, the creation of the feast of the Sacred Heart after Corpus Christi, and the reception of the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month.

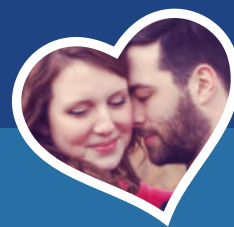

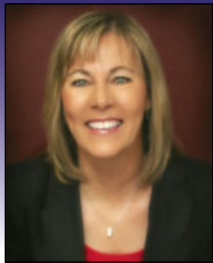
