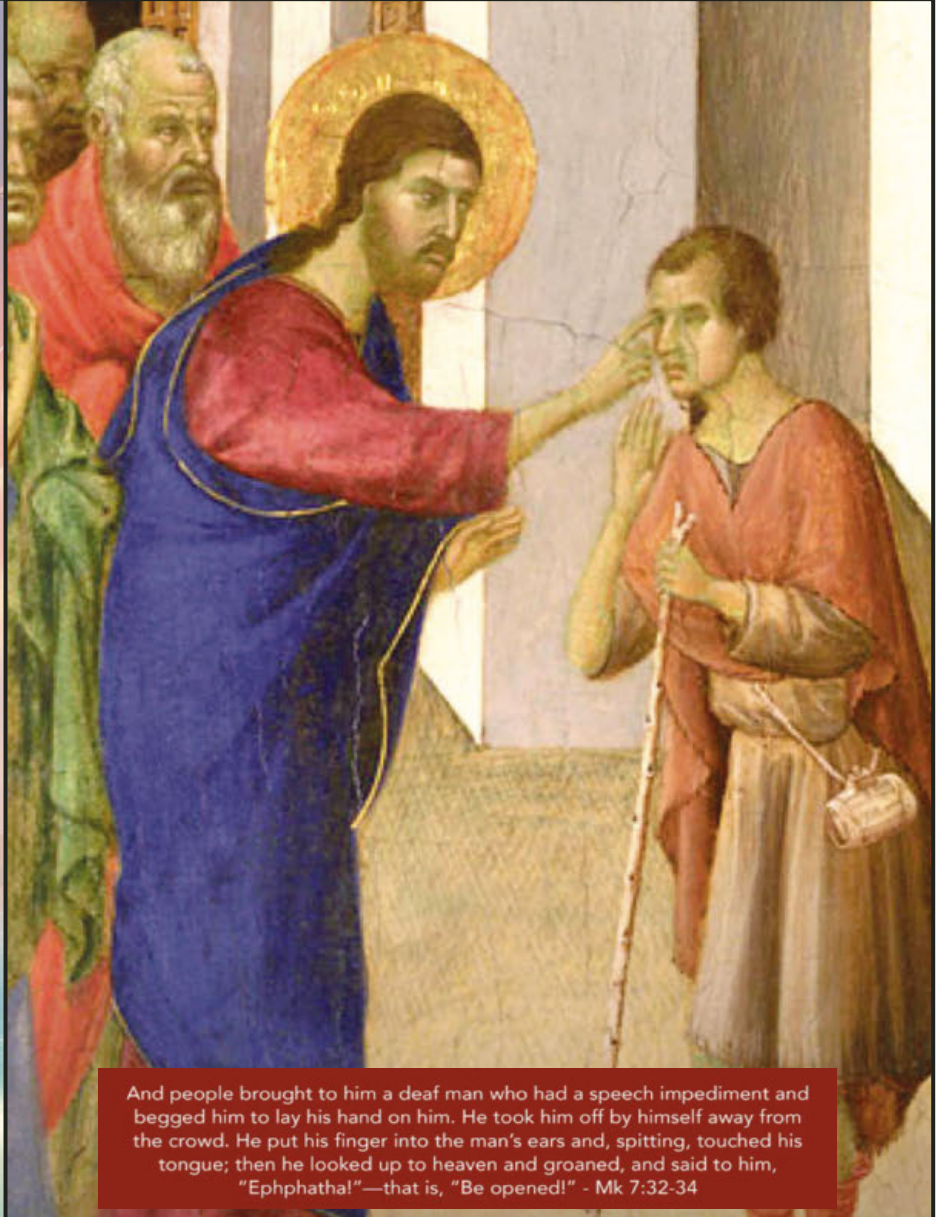

FR. KRZYSZTOF PIPA, SVD

Pastor

I was born in the historic town of Bochnia, Poland, into a devout Catholic family. Faith was the cornerstone of our daily lives, with my parents instilling in me and my two brothers the values of love, respect, and spiritual growth.



After finishing high school and while preparing for university studies, I felt a profound calling from God to dedicate my life to missionary work. Answering this divine call, I joined the Divine Word Missionaries, a religious order in Poland. This decision marked the beginning of a transformative journey that would take me across continents.

After a few years of study and formation, I was sent to Paraguay in South America to continue my formation and engage in pastoral work, immersing myself in the local culture and community. Following this enriching period, I returned to Poland to continue my theological studies at the seminary. Upon completing ten years of rigorous study and formation, I was ordained as a priest in 1998 and sent to Colombia and Panama. There, I was actively involved in developing pastoral work within the parish, taking on administrative roles within the province, and pursuing a master's degree in sociology. My time in Colombia was deeply enriching, allowing me to grow both spiritually and professionally.

In 2008, I was honored to be asked by the Superior General from Rome to open and coordinate a new mission in Venezuela. I was appointed pastor in one of the largest parishes in Maracaibo, the second-largest city in Venezuela. After four years of dedicated service in Venezuela, I was transferred to a multilingual parish in the northern suburbs of Chicago, USA, where I served as an associate pastor for seven years.

Later on, my provincial asked me to move to New Jersey, where the Bishop assigned us a new parish, St. Ann's in Browns Mills, near Fort Dix military base. During my six years there, I served as administrator and pastor, attending to the pastoral needs of military personnel, veterans, and the Spanish-speaking community.

At the beginning of this year, I requested a transfer to the Western Province of Divine Word Missionaries, headquartered in Riverside, CA and was assigned to Sacred Heart Parish in Prescott, AZ. Here, I'll continue to serve with dedication, embracing the opportunity to minister to a new community and further my mission of faith and service.

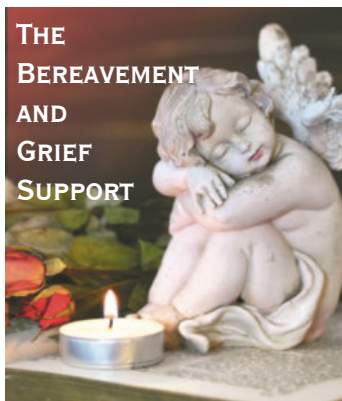

The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

"Let us celebrate with joy the birth of the Virgin Mary, of whom was born the Sun of Justice.... Her birth constitutes the hope and the light of salvation for the whole world . . . Her image is light for the whole Christian people"
(From the Liturgy).

As these texts so clearly indicate, an atmosphere of joy and light pervades the Birth of the Virgin Mary.

1. Historical Details about the Feast

The origin of this Feast is sought in Palestine. It goes back to the consecration of a church in Jerusalem, which tradition identifies as that of the present basilica of St. Ann.

At Rome the Feast began to be kept toward the end of the 7th century, brought there by Eastern monks. Gradually and in varied ways it spread to the other parts of the West in the centuries that followed. From the 13th century on, the celebration assumed notable importance, becoming a Solemnity with a major Octave and preceded by a Vigil calling for a fast. The Octave was reduced to a simple one during the reform of St. Pius X and was abolished altogether under the reform of Pius XII in 1955.

The present Calendar characterizes the Birth of Mary as a "Feast," placing it on the same plane as the Visitation.

For some centuries now, the Birth has been assigned to September 8 both in the East and in the West, but in ancient times it was celebrated on different dates from place to place. However, when the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (which has a later origin than that of the Birth) was extended to the whole Church, the Birth little by little became assigned everywhere to September 8: nine months after the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

2. At the Heart of Salvation

As we know, the Gospels have not transmitted to us anything about the birth of the Virgin Mary. Their attention is completely centered on the mystery of Christ and His salvific mission.

The birth of Mary is recounted by the Protevangelium of James (5:2), an apocryphal writing from the end of the 2nd century. Subsequent tradition is based on this account.

The description - although in the manner of an apocryphal document - obviously presents an important historical event: the birth of the Mother of the Lord.

But the problem that concerns us here is the significance of this event. In the case of all the Saints, the Church commemorates their birthday on the day of their return to the Lord. However, in the cases of St. John the Baptizer and the Blessed Virgin, it also celebrates the day of their earthly birth. This is a singular fact already emphasized in ancient times, for example, by Paschasius Radbertus (d. about 859).

The reason for this fact is not found primarily in the greatness or the privileges of the persons involved but in the singular mission that was theirs in the History of Salvation. In this light, the birth of the Blessed Virgin is considered to be - like that of John the Baptizer - in direct relationship with the coming of the Savior of the world.



Walking Through the Mass – The Communion Rite | By Fr. Luke Spannagel

It is almost time for Holy Communion! Having gone through the Eucharistic Prayer and responded together with vigor in the Great Amen, we are now in our final preparations before the moment of Holy Communion. This next section of the Mass is called the **Communion Rite**. The special parts of this moment in the Mass include:

- ◆ The Lord's Prayer
- ◆ Sign of Peace
- ◆ Lamb of God (Agnus Dei) and Fraction of the Sacred Host
- ◆ The commingling of the Body and Blood
- ◆ The private prayer preparation of the priest
- ◆ Elevation of the Holy Eucharist with the words "Behold the Lamb of God"
- ◆ Communion of the priest and the faithful
- ◆ Communion antiphon or song
- ◆ A time for personal quiet prayer
- ◆ The Prayer After Communion

We'll be taking a closer look at each part in the coming weeks.

But First . . . Why?

Although we may be familiar with this section of the Mass, perhaps it is helpful to step back and ask, "What exactly are we doing?" Many of us have been receiving Communion for some time, but have we ever stopped to wonder why we do so? As the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* says, "Since the celebration of the Eucharist is the Paschal Banquet, it is desirable that in accordance with the Lord's command his Body and Blood should be received as spiritual food by those of the faithful who are properly disposed. This is the sense of the fraction and the other preparatory rites by which the faithful are led more immediately to Communion" (*GIRM*, 80).

When we talk about the Eucharist, we usually think about four things: The True Presence of Christ's Body and Blood; The Sacrifice of the Cross; The Sacrament of Unity among people; and the Paschal or Heavenly Banquet. The True Presence reminds us that Jesus is really there. The Sacrifice reminds us that the Mass is the one perfect Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross and shows how much Jesus loves us. The True Presence of Jesus and his Sacrifice open the door to restoration, healing, and true unity. These truths also point us toward heaven, where we will experience the fullness and perfection of unity and love. The image of the heavenly banquet calls to mind celebration, eating, and drinking. As Jesus instructed us, we receive his Body and Blood by eating and drinking. That is what the Communion Rite is all about: the point of all the prayers, gestures, and words is that we receive Jesus the Lord in Holy Communion!

Our Spiritual Food

Continuing with Charles Belmonte, "The early Christians always likened the Eucharist to the life of the soul. St. Augustine writes: 'It is an excellent thing that the Christians around Carthage [in North Africa] call baptism itself nothing else but salvation, and the sacrament of Christ's Body nothing else but life. By apostolic tradition, the churches of Christ hold that without baptism and participation at the Lord's table it is impossible for any man to attain either the kingdom of God or salvation and life eternal. The Scriptures give testimony to this.' This is the very same body and blood which, by being immolated, restored our friendship with God. Christ's sacrifice and the Paschal Meal are intimately linked. Our Mother the Church encourages us to participate in one and in the other, if we are properly disposed, of receiving our Lord's Body and Blood. These will be our nourishment for the journey to our Father's home" (*Understanding the Mass*, pp. 166–67).

For more background on sacrifice and eating, Belmonte looks back at the relationship between sacrifices and banquets: "The ancient sacrificial custom required that part of the victim be given back to the person offering the sacrifice. Thus, he became, symbolically, God's guest. That which was just a symbol in the pagan rites and a figure in the Jewish offerings is a reality in the Holy Mass. After we have offered to God his Son Jesus Christ in sacrifice, God offers Him to us as spiritual food" (*Understanding the Mass*, p. 165). So, in the ancient sacrifices, whenever a person would offer a sacrifice to God, he always got "a little something" to take back with him. Generally, this was a portion of the sacrifice. In the case of receiving Jesus in the Mass, we get back the whole Christ: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. What an exchange! There is no better deal in the world!

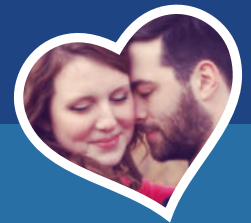
