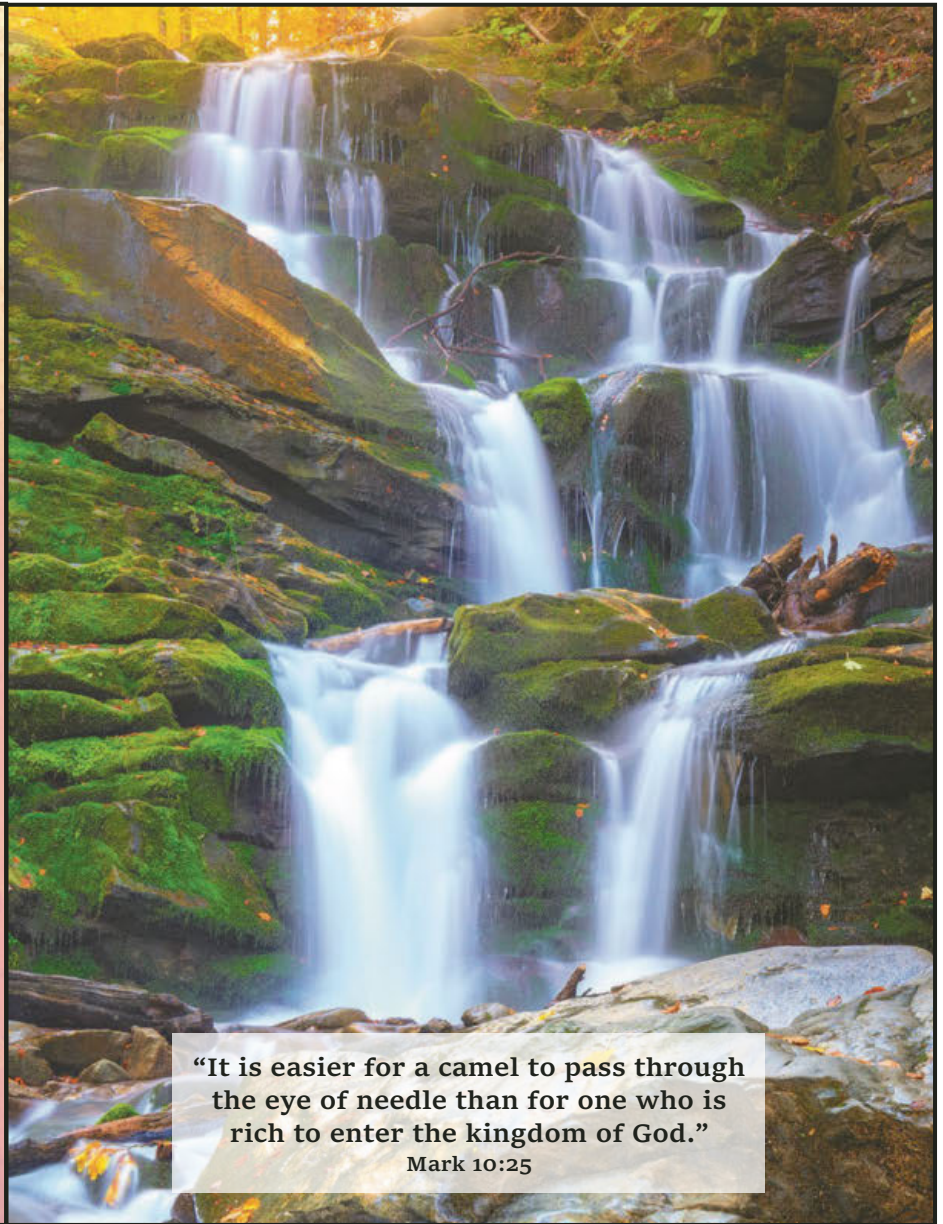

**WITNESSING TO THE LIGHT
FROM EVERYWHERE FOR EVERYONE
Divine Word Missionaries**

In 1875, during the intense political, social and cultural tensions in Europe, Saint Arnold Janssen founded the missionary order, the Society of the Divine Word (SVD), in Steyl, Netherlands. From humble beginnings, after 150 years the SVD has grown into the largest international missionary congregation in the Catholic Church, with about 6,000 priests and religious brothers serving in 79 countries worldwide.

Born in Goch, Germany into a devoutly Catholic family, Saint Arnold was greatly influenced by the faith of his father, who revered the Holy Trinity, and the Word Incarnate. These would become integral to SVD spirituality and charism, and because of his devotion to the Word of God, Saint Arnold named his missionary society, "Society of the Divine Word."

Ordained in 1861 Saint Arnold was encouraged to create a German-sending missionary order. Since the political situation did not allow for a foundation in Germany, he purchased a former inn in Steyl, Netherlands, where he founded the missionary order on September 8, 1875, on the feast of the Nativity of Mother Mary, with the motto: "May the Heart of Jesus live in the hearts of all." In his sermon on the foundation day St. Arnold exclaimed: "What will come of this mission seminary we do not yet know; goals are not always reached that one aims for... If the seminary succeeds, we will thank the grace of God. If nothing comes of it, we will humbly strike our breast and confess that we were not worthy of the grace."

Fr. Janssen set to work with incredible trust in Divine Providence and everything turned to be in his favor. After four years, in 1879, he was able to send the first two missionaries to China. Later missionaries were sent to Togo (West Africa), and to the native tribes of Papua New Guinea. Teams of missionaries were also sent out to care for the spiritual needs of poor immigrants in Argentina, Brazil, Chile and Ecuador. Twenty years after founding the Society, Fr. Janssen dispatched Brother Wendelin Meyer, SVD to the United States. He arrived in Hoboken, NJ in 1895. Within a year, more Divine Word Missionaries were sent to the United States. They eventually settled about 35 miles north of Chicago, in what is now known as Techny, Illinois. The Society of the Divine Word presence in North American has been growing ever since the first pioneering missionary arrived on the New Jersey Shore. Today, the successors of these daring Missionaries are organized into three provinces—the Southern, Western and Chicago Province.

The Western USA province which consists of California and Arizona began in 1964. The main ministries were a minor seminary in Riverside, staffing a high school in the Watts district of Los Angeles and serving the needs of Japanese and Black Catholics in the Bay area. Through the years we have increased our presence in parishes and ministries in Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino, San Diego, Oakland, San Francisco and Phoenix dioceses.

Today the members of the Society of the Divine Word, who are popularly called as Divine Word Missionaries work in 79 countries. It is imperative to know that the Society of the

Divine Word is the sixth major male religious congregation in the Church.

Over the past 150 years the Divine Word Missionaries have contributed to world-wide mission through the four characteristic dimensions: Biblical Apostolate, Mission Animation, Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation (JPIC), and Communication.

SVDs have members from 76 nationalities, serving in 79 countries, with 45 Provinces, 7 Regions, and 7 Missions. The SVD Congregation has 49 Bishops, 4129 priests, 1321 Brothers in Perpetual Vows, and 255 Novices, the sum total of which is 5754 SVDs.

We extend our services through parish ministry, education apostolate, retreat ministry, biblical ministry, Christian advocacy, counseling, social work, justice, peace, and integrity of creation (JPIC), print media and communication, health care, migration, and formation.

Father Janssen knew that women were just as important in the missions as men, and founded the Congregation of the Sisters Servants of the Holy Spirit. Convinced of the need for prayer as one of the "tools" of mission, he also founded a cloistered community, the Missionary Sisters Servants of the Holy Spirit of Perpetual Adoration.

We also work in collaboration with our SVD Lay Partners and Associates. In 2024, there are 70 officially recognized SVD lay associate groups with a total of 7153 members and 169 SVD lay partner groups yet to be recognized with a total of 20520 members in initial formation.

Walking Through the Mass – The Rite of Peace By Fr. Luke Spannagel

After the Our Father and Embolism, as *The General Instruction for the Roman Missal* says, “There follows the **Rite of Peace**, by which the Church entertreats peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the Sacrament” (*GIRM*, 82). At this point in the Mass, the priest prays, “Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.” The people then reply, “Amen.”

What True Peace Is - And What It's Not

What is true peace? Perhaps we could go to various definitions. Our *Catechism* says, “Peace is not merely the absence of war, and is not limited to maintaining a balance of powers” (*CCC*, 2304). The *Catechism* continues with a quotation from St. Augustine, who wrote that peace is “the tranquility of order” (*CCC*, 2304). “Earthly peace is the image and fruit of the *peace of Christ*, the messianic ‘Prince of Peace.’ By the blood of his Cross... he reconciled men with God and made his Church the sacrament of the unity of the human race and of its union with God. ‘He is our peace’ [Eph 2:14]” (*CCC*, 2305). As Edward Sri writes, “Many people seek the security and peace of this world, which is a peace based on success, on everything going well, on avoiding problems and suffering. But this kind of peace is quite fragile and fleeting... Christ, however, offers us a deeper, longer lasting peace—one that the world does not give. When we allow Jesus to be the foundation of our lives and live according to his plan for us, he gives us an internal, spiritual peace that can withstand life’s many disappointments, trials, and sufferings. This is the kind of peace of heart that also builds true unity within marriages, families, communities, parishes, and nations. And this is what the priest prays for at this moment of the liturgy” (*A Biblical Walk Through the Mass*, p. 130–31).

Hopefully, we have had moments of true peace in our hearts that remind us of how generously Jesus has loved us. For anyone who hasn’t, the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist certainly invites us to that peace for which we long. As we prepare to receive the Prince of Peace truly present in Holy Communion, perhaps it seems fitting that the Rite of Peace occurs at this moment in the Mass. According to Charles Belmonte, “When we pronounce our ‘Amen,’ we must realize that we are asking not only for our personal peace but also for peace for the whole Church... During the Last Supper, our Lord made his disciples aware of the importance of peace, the fruit of charity. Many times he spoke of unity, of the spirit of service, of humility, of charity. These are virtues and dispositions of the soul which can thrive only in an atmosphere of peace.” (*Understanding the Mass*, pp. 173–74).

So, without a doubt, peace is an ardent desire and need for us as Christian people. This is true at all times of our lives, but especially at the Holy Mass. In the Mass, there are many wonderful gifts and graces; we certainly are going to receive those graces more fruitfully if our hearts are at peace and open to Christ, as opposed to being distracted and upset over things that happen to us. This is most true when the time for Holy Communion comes. We are preparing to receive the most wonderful gift: we can’t have a distracted heart! So, we make sure, by a prayer and a gesture, that we really are ready to go forward to receive Our Lord.*

Fr. Guy Oury, reflecting on the Rite of Peace in the Mass, says, “Through the sign of peace, we ask for peace and unity within the Church, and beyond its visible boundaries, for the whole human family. And since in our gatherings we are a cell of the Church, we express our mutual love before receiving together the one Bread that makes us one. These are the two components of the rite: a prayer for the peace and unity of the Church and an exchange of the sign of fraternal converse, if not with the whole world, at least with our nearest neighbors” (*The Mass*, pp. 111–12). So, we aren’t just making sure things are ok with people in our pew; we are also making a symbolic gesture of peace for the whole world! Next week, we’ll take a look at some different ways to offer the Sign of Peace, and why this is not the time for “high fives” and making plans for later in the day!

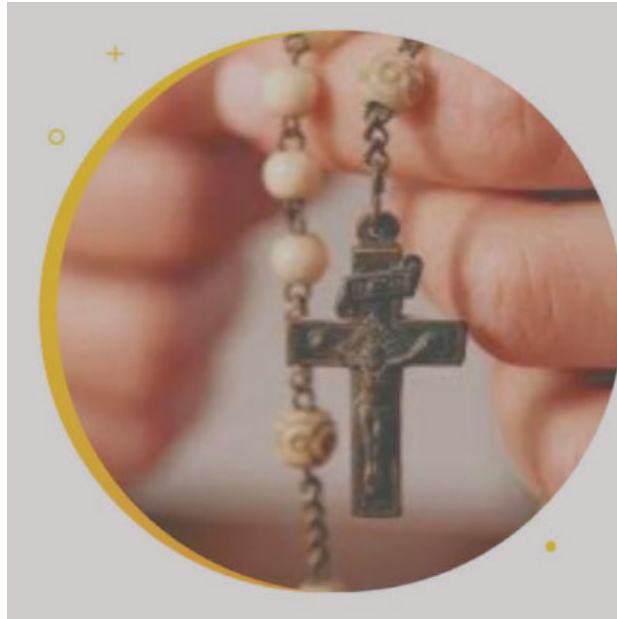

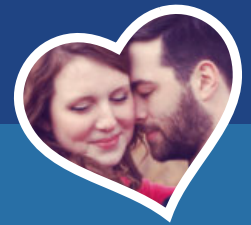
