Pastoral Letter from the Most Reverend John P. Dolan | October 7, 2024, Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There is no love like that of a mother. A mother who cares tenderly, anticipates our needs, leads us along the way and is a safe place to land in all of the ups and downs of life. In the Diocese of Phoenix we have a magnificent patroness, Our Lady of Guadalupe, who is this mother to each one of us.

She is the same mother who, almost 500 years ago, appeared to Juan Diego on Tepeyac hill in modern day Mexico City, inviting him to boldly ask the local bishop that a church be built in her honor. The same mother whose image miraculously appeared on Juan Diego's tilma, which millions of pilgrims still visit every year, and who has become the greatest evangelizer in the Americas.

What moves my heart is *how* she appeared to Juan Diego, and in turn the whole Aztec people - she spoke their dialect, wore traditional garb and communicated through symbols that were personal to their culture. She also spoke to Juan Diego affectionally, calling him "Juanita, Juan Dieguito."

In this same, tender way, she calls each one of us her sons and daughters, inviting us into the protective folds of her mantle. And just like Juan Diego's simple tilma, she desires to transform us into image bearers of Christ and great evangelizers of her motherly love.

Inspired by Our Lady of Guadalupe, I have developed a seven-year pastoral plan on evangelization, which will begin in January 2025 and lead up to December 9, 2031 - the 500th anniversary of Our Lady's apparitions on Tepeyac hill.

Several considerations moved me to build out this plan: the new evangelization, particularly in the Americas, those on the peripheries, the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20), diocesan statistical analysis, tensions within our world and keeping up with Arizona growth, among others.

Each year has a theme; most are based on the apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishop's National Pastoral Plan, "Missionary Disciples Going Forth with Joy": 2025 Year of Hope, 2026 El Camino Real, 2027 Animated by Christ, 2028 That We May Be One, 2029 Renewed in Trust, 2030 The Encounter Moment and 2031 Go Forth in Joy.

Each of the six years following the Jubilee Year I look forward to sharing a pastoral letter, delving into the theme and sharing practical ideas on evangelization for discernment and implementation on a personal, parish and diocesan level. We will also turn in a particular way to our Hispanic and Latino brothers and sisters, who are a great gift to the Church, and their example of deep devotion, rich traditions and familial love.

Year one of the pastoral plan will carry the theme "Year of Hope" in tandem with Pope Francis proclaiming 2025 the Jubilee Year of Hope. This is the perfect theme to begin our seven-year walk with Our Lady, who always leads us to Jesus, our Savior and our Hope.

Pope Francis has proposed "10 Hopes" which I invite you to consider in a particular way during this Year of Hope: Hope for peace over division, hope for enthusiasm for life and a readiness to share it, hope for the openness to life and responsible parenthood, hope for prisoners through restorative justice, hope for the sick and those dedicated to their care, hope for youth and young adults, hope for immigrants, migrants and refugees, hope for the elderly, hope for the poor and the hungry and hope for greater Christian unity.

This is a wonderful opportunity for an introspective moment. Before we set out to evangelize, we might ask ourselves, "How am I being called to accompany others who are made in the image and likeness of God, especially the marginalized, who carry these crosses?"

The Jubilee Year of Hope carries several opportunities for a plenary indulgence, beginning with visiting the holy doors in Rome. Additionally, I have decreed the following churches in the Diocese of Phoenix Jubilee sites during the Jubilee Year: Ss. Simon and Jude Cathedral (Phoenix), St. Mary's Basilica (downtown Phoenix), St. Anthony's (Gila River Indian Community), St. Mary's (Kingman), Sacred Heart (Prescott) and Chapel of the Holy Cross (Sedona).

A webpage is being created and will be available before the Advent season. It will be a one-stop shop for all information regarding the seven -year pastoral plan on evangelization, including access to the pastoral plan and information on the nature and conditions of indulgences and obtaining an indulgence during the Year of Hope. More to come in the following months at catholicsun.org.

The title of this pastoral letter is inspired by an acronym of the word "**TILMA**," which expresses my hope and personal invitation to each one of you: *Testifica, oh Iglesia, a la Luz def Misterio def Amor (Testify, o Church, to the Light of the Mystery of Love)*

I am delighted to journey with you through these seven years. As we go forward, let us find great hope in the words Our Lady spoke to Juan Diego, the same words she speaks to each one of us:

"Am I not here, I who am your Mother? ... Are you not in the hollow of my mantle, in the crossing of my arms? Do you need something more? Let nothing else worry you or disturb you."

May God bless you and keep you,

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Walking Through the Mass – Communion under Both Forms | By Fr. Luke Spannagel

Last time, we addressed making a sign of reverence before receiving Communion in the sacred host or in the chalice. This time, we consider receiving from the chalice in particular. You may have noticed differences in what churches do for Communion. Someone who travels might encounter parishes where the Precious Blood is offered and others where everyone receives the sacred host without receiving from the chalice.

Let's look at *The General Instruction of the Roman Missal*: "It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the Priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass and that, in the cases where this is foreseen, they partake of the chalice, so that even by means of the signs Communion may stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated" (*GIRM*, 85). The point here is to emphasize that receiving Communion itself should help unite us to the Holy Sacrifice—through hosts consecrated at the Mass and, (then notice) "where this is foreseen," from the chalice.

When Do We Receive Communion from The Chalice?

So, when are members of the faithful able to receive from the chalice? The *GIRM* reminds us that the bishops have the authority to give guidelines for the manner of receiving Communion in their dioceses. This is because the bishops are the caretakers of the liturgy within their dioceses. The *GIRM* does provide some guidelines for the bishops to follow: "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord, as also the connection between the Eucharistic banquet and the eschatological banquet in the Kingdom of the Father" (*GIRM*, 281). What is this paragraph saying with "both kinds" (or sometimes we see the description "both forms")? The reference here is to Communion being offered under the form of the sacred host and in the chalice. That is, that Communion would be offered in forms that involve both eating and drinking.

Why Don't We Always Receive from the Chalice?

So, why don't we always have Communion under both forms? Believe it or not, one simple reason is practicality. Having numerous people drink from the chalice requires either a very large chalice or a number of chalices. Depending on the size of the parish, this could be no problem; but in parishes that are very large, this can become a challenge. In one parish where I visited, there were 10 to 20 extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion at every Mass. As you might imagine, getting all these folks prepared and to their stations was quite a process. Another practical reason for some bishops and pastors is concern for reverence and the worry over potentially spilling the Precious Blood. Additionally, with heightened sensitivity to health, for some, the sharing of the chalice is personally challenging.

Along with some of these practical reasons, there is also a faith consideration based on our belief that Jesus is really and completely present under either form of Communion. The GIRM states, "Sacred pastors should take care to ensure that the faithful... are made aware by the most suitable means possible of the Catholic teaching on the form of Holy Communion as laid down by the Ecumenical Council of Trent. Above all, they should instruct the Christian faithful that the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species, and hence that as regards the resulting fruits, those who receive under only one species are not deprived of any grace that is necessary for salvation" (*GIRM*, 282). This text reminds pastors to make sure people know that receiving the host is receiving the whole Christ; receiving from the chalice is receiving the whole Christ; receiving both forms is receiving the whole Christ. There have been times in history where this teaching was not necessarily clear; for some, receiving Communion under one form can assist with that clarity.

Who Decides When We Receive from the Chalice?

Ultimately, the decision is up to the bishop, who can choose to extend the decision to the individual pastor. Bishops are charged to do whatever they think will be most helpful to people spiritually, while at the same time guarding the true faith and reverence for Jesus present in the Holy Sacrament. So, when you travel and notice that some parishes have Communion under both forms and some do not, know that the bishop and pastor have decided, according to the instruction of the *GIRM*, to do what they think is best for their parishes and people at the present time. As always, if we don't understand the wisdom of our leaders in these decisions, we are invited to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance and wisdom and continue to pray for true unity in Christ!
