LETTER FROM PASTOR

ADVENT IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO LOOK UP FOR THE SHINING STAR OF HOPE AND JOY

Much as I truly believe that Advent is an opportunity for us to look up for the shining star of hope and joy, many times things happen in our lives that make this difficult to fathom. Instead, we look down, downcast! This was the case with me one morning a few days ago, when I woke up from my sleep in a very horrible mood. For the entire first part of that morning, I felt horrible for no particular reason. Then I began meeting my beloved parishioners who came for spiritual guidance, and I suddenly realized that they were in even more foul mood than myself due to what they were going through. This jolted me to a realization that in order to be able to provide a good spiritual and pastoral guidance, I must address my own situation. As I prayed for this to happen, thankfully, one of my directees indirectly came to my rescue when she shared with me the following article entitled AND GOD SAID, NO! Allow me to share it with you. It reads:

I asked God to take away my pride, And God said "No."
He said it is not for Him to take away, but for me to give up.

I asked God to make my handicapped child whole, and God said "No."
He said her spirit is whole, but her body is only temporary.

I asked God to grant me patience, and God said "No."
He said patience is a by-product of tribulation. It is not granted, it is earned.

I asked God to give me happiness,
And God said "No."
He said He gives blessings. Happiness is up to me.

I asked God to spare me pain, and God said "No."
He said suffering draws us apart from worldly cares and brings us closer to Him.

I asked God to make my spirit grow, and God said "No."
He said I must grow on my own, but He will prune me to make me fruitful.

I asked God if He love me, and God said "Yes."
He gave His only son who died for me and I will be in Heaven someday
Because I believe.

I asked God to help me love others as he loves me.
And God said, "Ah, finally you have the idea"
I believe many of you might have experienced what I experienced before. That is why as we prepare for the birth of our savior, we realize that advent is indeed an opportunity for us to look up for the shining star of hope and joy. In order to assist us as a parish in this journey, we have offered you many activities during this advent season to overcome many of the obstacles

the evil one throws at us.

For instance, many of you were able to attend one of our Advent preparations as we invited the floriani quartet for a night of beautiful sacred music chant two weeks ago. It was a moving experience as in the dimly lit church the four young men sang some of the ancient hymns and antiphons of old, as well as some other familiar songs which lifted up our spirits and put us in the mood of Advent. They shared some history of the songs and chants which further brought them alive in our hearts and minds. We wanted the emphasis that evening to be on Advent, that time of preparation, expectation and joy and it really was. A week later, we had the good fortune of having Fr. Peter Mushi, A.J. from New York lead us in our parish Advent Mission this past Sunday and Monday. On Sunday, Fr. Peter, very inspiringly spoke about the Magi and how they prepared for the journey of a lifetime, not knowing what they might find, but letting the star lead them. They looked up! He reminded us also to "look up!" We cannot see all the signs God is giving us when we have our faces down, he emphasized. Do we see where God is leading us? What paths God might be pointing to for us to follow and be amazed and surprised?

Then on Monday evening Fr. Peter spoke on the beauty and gift of the Eucharist. He lamented how despite the clarity with which Christ spoke about his body as true food in John chapter 6, some refused to believe it was possible that Jesus could truly be present in the Eucharist. He pointed out that according to recent research findings, today, 68% of Catholics do not believe that Jesus Christ, the very same Jesus Christ who walked the earth, commands the heavens, and was willing to die for our sins, left us this precious gift of His Body to be received at each Holy Communion is truly present in the Eucharist. True to his word, Jesus said that he would never leave us, and He has not- He is there in every Tabernacle around the world and is there at every Mass. Either we believe He is God and is faithful to His promises or it is all for nothing. We need to pray, examine and ask Jesus to "help our unbelief", he concluded.

If you missed some of these, we still have other opportunities you can participate in such as coming for adoration, morning Masses and our last communal activity, which is Lessons and Carols .

Till then, continue to have a blessed Advent Season!

LAST WEEKS WORD OF THE WEEK

In case you missed last week's word of the week at Mass:

The 12 Days of Christmas

The song "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is an English Christmas carol. From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the Church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember. To fit the number scheme, when you reach number 9, representing the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, the originator combined 6 to make 3, taking the 6 fruits that were similar the ones that were not named separately. There are actually Twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit.



ADORATION CORNER (TEAM JESUS)

Our time of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament is God-focused, and our energy should be directed at being present to God. When people came into St. Therese of Lisieux's mind during prayer, she would offer prayers of intercession to God for them and then focus her attention back on the face of Christ. Rather than remaining stuck on ourselves or others during Adoration, we are drawn back to Jesus' face in the Blessed Sacrament and his Word in the Sacred Scriptures.

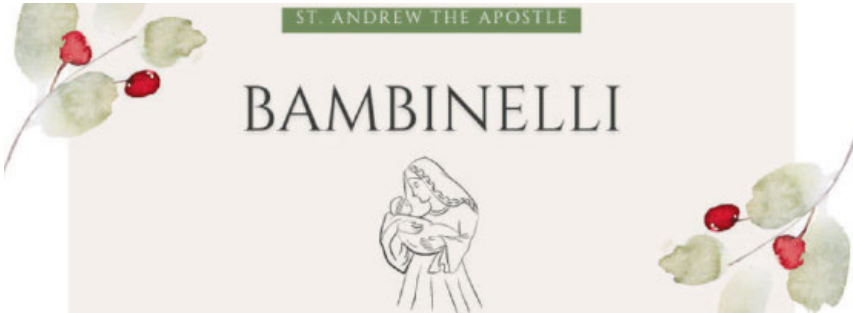

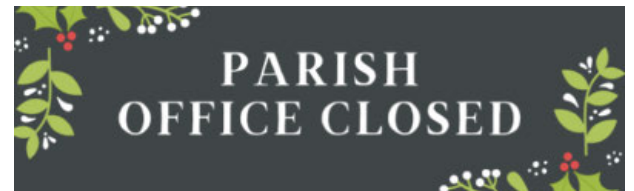

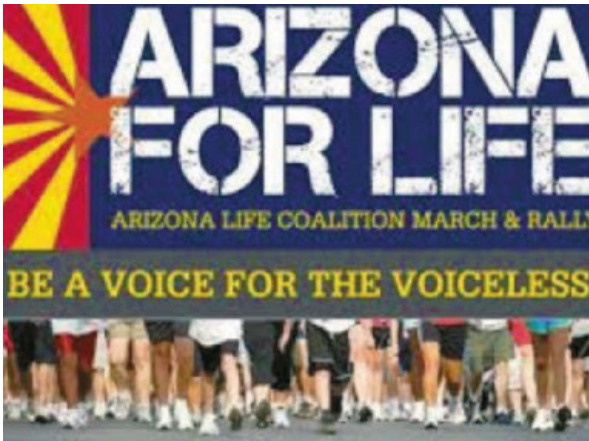

SEASONS OF HOPE

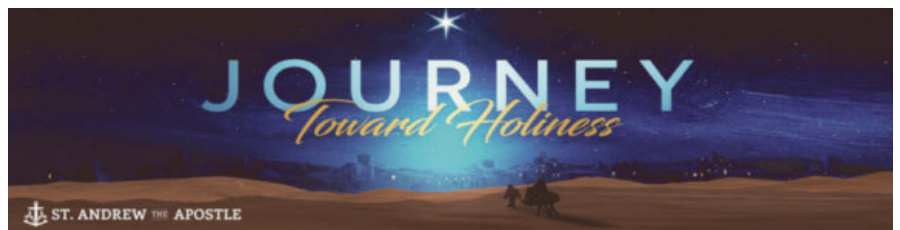
Adult Bereavement Support Group

REFLECTIONS FOR ADVENT

REFLECTION - EPIPHANY

Question:

Besides the Wise Men, what is significant about the Epiphany?

Answer:

Epiphany means “manifestation,” or public display. The feast is usually celebrated January 6. In the US, it is celebrated on the Sunday nearest to January 6. It originates from a story unique to Matthew (2:1-12). Magi from the East come to offer homage to the newborn King, presenting him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

This part of Matthew’s infancy narrative differs from Luke’s account of the birth of Jesus. In Luke there are no Magi, star, nor gifts. Luke has Jesus being born in a stable after Mary and Joseph’s long travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Matthew seems to have the family living in a house in Bethlehem, where the Magi find them.

Why these differences? They stem from the needs and concerns of the audience the authors were addressing, as well as the theological stance of each author. Knowing the original intention helps get at the correct interpretation of the text.

Since Matthew was writing primarily to a Jewish community, his concern was to show that Jesus did not come just for Jews, but for Gentiles as well. From his very birth, Jesus not only manifests himself to Jews, but also to Gentiles, who are prominently included in the manifestation, symbolized by the Magi and their journey. This is the most significant aspect of the feast of Epiphany. How do you manifest Jesus to all with whom you come into contact?

Baby Jesus’ Wish List

Odds are you’ve got a Christmas list going by now — gift ideas for everyone from your nephew to your goddaughter to your mailman. But what about the birthday boy? What’s the gift Jesus gets from you this Christmas?

If you’ve ever read the Book of Leviticus, you know all about the sacrifices God asks of the Israelites, referred to in the reading from Hebrews today. Leviticus can be a chore to read — a little repetitive, a little intimidating. There’s a lot of very specific actions that God asks His Chosen People to complete to make up for whatever they have done wrong. In essence, it’s a bit of a wish list for gifts.

But it’s a wish list that can really confuse you. What’s God going to do with a cereal offering? The kidneys of an animal? If you look closely, what God is doing here is beautiful. He’s customized his wish list to only those things He knows the Israelites can give. It’s God saying, in what amounts to theological baby-talk for folks who barely know of Him and His ways, exactly how they could be stewards. “Do this, but don’t do that. If you do that, do this and you will find My mercy.”

Our guide to stewardship — the Gospels of Christ — is less precise because by the time of Christ, God’s people have grown in understanding of love and mercy and relationship with the divine. Through Christ, we find out that God’s real wish list didn’t really consist of cereal offerings and the kidneys of various animals. It’s far simpler, but luckily, it’s something we still have on-hand. All He wants is our whole heart.

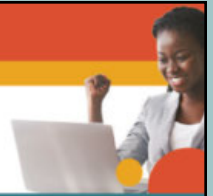

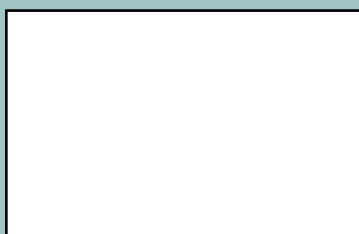
